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"Sec. 5502.30. (A) The state, any political subdivision, 2 any municipal agency, any emergency management volunteer, 3 another state, or an emergency management agency thereof or of 4 the federal government or of another country or province or 5 subdivision thereof performing emergency management services in this state pursuant to an arrangement, agreement, or compact for mutual aid and assistance, or any agency, member, agent, or 8 representative of any of them, or any individual, partnership, corporation, association, trustee, or receiver, or any of the 10 agents thereof, in good faith carrying out, complying with, or 11 attempting to comply with any state or federal law or any 12 arrangement, agreement, or compact for mutual aid and 13 assistance, or any order issued by federal or state military 14 authorities relating to emergency management, is not liable for 15 any injury to or death of persons or damage to property as the 16 result thereof during training periods, test periods, practice 17 periods, or other emergency management operations, or false 18 alerts, as well as during any hazard, actual or imminent, and 19

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subsequent to the same except in cases of willful misconduct. As used in this division, "emergency management volunteer" means only an individual who is authorized to assist any agency performing emergency management during a hazard.

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- (B) The state, any political subdivision, any individual, partnership, corporation, association, trustee, or receiver, or any agent, agency, representative, officer, or employee of any of them that owns, maintains, occupies, operates, or controls all or part of any building, structure, or premises shall not be liable for any injury or death sustained by any person or damage caused to any property while that person or property is in the building, structure, or premises for duty, training, or shelter purposes during a hazard, drill, test, or false warning, or is entering therein for such purposes or departing therefrom, or for any injury, death, or property damage as the result of any condition in or on the building, structure, or premises or of any act or omission with respect thereto, except a willful act intended to cause injury or damage.
- (C) Any person deployed by the emergency management agency 38 to render aid in another state pursuant to section 5502.40 of 39 the Revised Code, including a full-time or part-time paid 40 employee of a political subdivision of this state or a nonprofit 41 organization, a paid or unpaid volunteer of a for-profit or 42 nonprofit organization, and a health care worker of a for-profit 43 or nonprofit organization, that is rendering aid in another 44 state is considered an officer or employee of the state for 45 purposes of the immunity established under Article VI of the emergency management assistance compact enacted under section 47 5502.40 of the Revised Code. Nothing in this division entitles 48 an employee of a political subdivision any person deployed 49

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pursuant to section 5502.40 of the Revised Code to any other	50
