child wellness campuses across the state to serve children and youth who 18
 are, or have been determined by a public children services agency to be at 19
 risk of being, in the custody of a public children services agency and who 20
 are not placed in a licensed residential setting and are otherwise 21
 spending one or more nights in an unlicensed setting. Regional child 22
 wellness campuses shall support children in crisis in or near the 23
 communities in which the children reside and create additional capacity 24
 for short-term treatment. The Department of Children and Youth shall 25
 select entities applying to establish regional child wellness campuses 26
 through a competitive process. An entity shall provide proof of local 27
 funding commitments that fulfill all necessary start-up costs and ongoing 28
 community commitments to ensure timely and appropriate delivery of service 29
 to meet the needs of the child, family, and community. 30

Of the foregoing appropriation item 830506, Family and Children 31
 Services, \$350,000 in fiscal year 2026 shall be used for the Providence 32
 House Every Child Ohio Feasibility Study to identify the most viable Ohio 33
 communities with the capacity to sustainably operate a children's crisis 34
 care facility, as defined in section 5103.13 of the Revised Code. The 35
 results and recommendations of the study shall be submitted in a report to 36
 the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 37
 Representatives, and the Director of Children and Youth by September 30, 38
 2026." 39
