BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3301.25 of the Revised Code be	4
enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 3301.25. (A) The department of education and	6
workforce shall establish the community connectors workforce	7
program to support connecting students to jobs, internships, and	8
career professionals in their communities.	9
(B)(1) The department shall oversee the program, and each	10
educational service center shall administer the program for the	11
school districts that have entered into a contract with the	12
educational service center under division (B) of section	13
3313.843 of the Revised Code. Each educational service center	14
shall, to the extent that funds are appropriated by the general	15
assembly to do so, employ or contract for services with at least	16
one, but not more than three, individuals to work as directors	17
in high schools in the districts that have entered into a	18
contract with the educational service center under division (B)	19

of section 3313.843 of the Revised Code. Each educational	20
service center shall determine the number of directors it	21
employs or contracts with under this section.	22
(2) Educational service centers shall determine any	23
eligibility or application requirements for the directors,	24
however the director shall have experience in job placement,	25
school counseling, or primary and secondary education.	26
(C) Directors identified under division (B) of this	27
section shall do all of the following:	28
(1) Collaborate with local OhioMeansJobs centers and other	29
community partners, as identified by the director, to identify	30
available jobs, apprenticeships, and internships in the	31
community, and engage students in career mentoring with	32
community members;	33
(2) Determine the number of students that may participate	34
in the program at the district or school;	35
(3) Create an application and procedures to apply for the	36
program and, as a part of the application procedures, interview	37
students and administer an aptitude test, as selected by the	38
director, to assess their professional skills to determine a	39
student's eligibility and preparedness to participate in the	40
program;	41
(4) Consider a student's graduation plan developed under	42
section 3313.617 of the Revised Code when placing that student	43
in a job, apprenticeship, or internship through the program;	44
(5) Offer dedicated and regular classroom instruction to	45
the maximum number of students possible in soft skills and	46
professional skills training, including problem-solving, time	47
management, creative and critical thinking, communication and	48

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civility, and ethics. If a district or school currently offers	49
similar instruction the director shall collaborate with those	50
instructors, other appropriate school officials that have	51
commensurate experience, and professionals who support the	52
development of career and life pathways in the school. Students	53
may use instruction under division (B)(4) of this section to	54
qualify for the OhioMeansJobs-readiness seal established under	55
section 3313.6112 of the Revised Code.	56
(6) Report to the educational service center that employs	57
or contracts with the director and to the department of	58
education and workforce all of the following:	59
(a) The number of students participating in the program;	60
(b) The number of students who are placed in jobs,	61
apprenticeships, or internships through the program;	62
(c) The number of students who receive soft skills and	63
professional skills training offered by the director.	64
(D) Any business or organization that employs a student	65
through the program shall comply with the applicable minor labor	66
laws prescribed under section 4109.02 of the Revised Code.	67
Section 2. All items in this act are hereby appropriated	68
as designated out of any moneys in the state treasury to the	69
credit of the designated fund. For all operating appropriations	70
made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year	71
2026 and those in the second column are for fiscal year 2027.	72
The operating appropriations made in this act are in addition to	73
any other operating appropriations made for these fiscal years.	74
