To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1
4503.768 of the Revised Code to create the 2
"United States Military Academy West Point" 3
license plate. 4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section 5
4503.768 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 6

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 7
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 8
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 9
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 10
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 11
in division (B) of this section. 12

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 13
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 14

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 15
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 16
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 17
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 18
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 19

quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 20
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 21
other abortion-related activities. 22

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 23
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 24
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 25
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 26
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 27
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 28
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 29
other money in that fund. 30

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 31
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 32
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 33
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 34

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 35
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 36
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 37
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 38
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 39
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 40
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 41
directly to their clients. 42

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 43
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 44
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 45
it receives under this section to assist those who have 46
pancreatic cancer and their families. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 48

receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 49
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 50
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 51
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 52

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 53
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 54
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 55
its research and other programs. 56

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 57
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 58
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 59
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 60

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 61
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 62
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 63
contributions for its research and other programs. 64

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 65
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 66
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 67
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 68
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 69

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 70
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 71
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 72
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 73
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 74

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 75
receives pursuant to section 4503.4912 of the Revised Code to 76
the Ben Morrison memorial fund, which shall use the 77

contributions for scholarships and other programs that support 78
mental health. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 81
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 82
contributions into its general account to be used for 83
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 84
America foundation. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 86
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 87
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 88
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 89
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 91
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 92
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 93
scholarships and other educational activities. 94

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 95
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 96
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 97
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 98
that organization. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 100
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 101
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 102
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 103
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 104

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 105
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 106

aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 107
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 108
programming. 109

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 110
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 111
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 112
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 113
need. 114

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 115
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 116
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 117
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 118

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 119
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 120
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 121
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 122
section. A university or college that receives contributions 123
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 124
scholarship fund. 125

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 126
receives pursuant to section 4503.512 of the Revised Code to the 127
Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega 128
chapter in Ohio. The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated 129
Delta Theta Omega chapter shall use the contributions for the 130
development and perpetuation of scholarship, leadership, 131
citizenship, fidelity, and brotherhood among men and youth in 132
this state. 133

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 134
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 135

university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 136
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 137
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 138
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 139
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 140
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 141
funds as provided in this section. 142

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 143
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 144
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 145
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 146
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 147
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 148
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 149
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 150
funds as provided in this section. 151

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 153
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 154
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 155
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 156
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 157
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 158
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 159
funds as provided in this section. 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 161
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 162
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 163
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 164

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 165

receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 166
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 167
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 168
advocates for addiction recovery). 169

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 170
receives pursuant to section 4503.520 of the Revised Code to 171
Purdue university in West Lafayette, Indiana, for purposes of 172
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 173
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 174
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 175
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with 176
Purdue university to effectuate the distribution of such funds 177
as provided in this section. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 179
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 180
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 181
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 182
cyclists of all ages. 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 185
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 186
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 187
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 188
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 189
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 190

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 191
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 192
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 193
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 194
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron district seven which shall annually distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession,

to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 226
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 227
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 228
the improvement of patient outcomes. 229

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 230
receives pursuant to section 4503.53 of the Revised Code to the 231
Indiana Kentucky Ohio regional council of carpenters. The 232
council shall use the money it receives to assist its members 233
who are experiencing financial hardship. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 235
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 236
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 237
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 238
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 239
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 240
personnel, veterans, and their families. 241

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 242
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 243
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 244
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 245

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 246
receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 247
nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 248
health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 249
further the nonprofit's mission. 250

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 251
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 252
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 253
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 254

families. 255

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 256
receives pursuant to section 4503.536 of the Revised Code to 257
save a warrior, incorporated, which shall use the contributions 258
to prevent suicide by active members of the armed forces of the 259
United States, veterans of those armed forces, and first 260
responders. 261

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 262
receives pursuant to section 4503.542 of the Revised Code to the 263
Ohio craft brewers association. 264

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 265
receives pursuant to section 4503.541 of the Revised Code to 266
Dolly Parton's imagination library of Ohio. The library shall 267
use the money it receives under this section for operational 268
costs, including the distribution of books. 269

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 270
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 271
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 272
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 273
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 274

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 275
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 276
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 277
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 278
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 279
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 280
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 281
destination. 282

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 283

contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 284
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 285
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 286
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 287
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 288
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 289
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 290
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 291
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 292
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 293

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 294
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 295
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 296

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 297
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 298
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 299
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 300
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 301
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 302
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 303
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 304
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 305
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 306
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 307
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 308
under this section. 309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 310
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 311
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 312
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 313

programs. 314

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 315
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 316
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 317
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 318

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 319
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 320
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 321
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 322
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 323

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 324
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 325
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 326
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 327
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 328
the person who paid the contribution resides. 329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 330
receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 331
playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 332
the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 333
producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 334
arts education, and creating a superior destination for 335
entertainment, business, and residential living. 336

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 337
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 338
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 339
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 340
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 341
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 342

ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 343
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 344
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 345
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 346
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 347
such payments are to be made. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 350
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 351
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 352
river watershed. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 354
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 355
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 356
nature preserve. 357

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 358
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 359
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 360
the money in support of the park. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 362
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 363
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 364
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 365

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 366
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 367
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 368
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 369

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 370
receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 371

Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 372
the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 373
rehabilitation, and educational programs. 374

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 375
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 376
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 377
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 378
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 379
local beekeeping programs. 380

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 381
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 382
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 383
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 384
legends to inspire future leaders. 385

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 386
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 387
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 388
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 389
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 390
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 391
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 394
Ohio state coalition-national council of negro women, 395
incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational 396
purposes. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 399
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 400

contributions to support the activities of the organization. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 402
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 403
progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 404
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 405
center. 406

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 407
receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 408
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 409
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 410

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 411
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.584 of the 412
Revised Code to the Ohio natural energy foundation to fund 413
scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 414
natural gas industry. 415

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 416
receives pursuant to section 4503.585 of the Revised Code to the 417
Terrace Park recreation committee, inc. to offer scholarships to 418
young athletes of, and maintain athletic facilities in, the 419
municipal corporation of Terrace Park. 420

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 421
receives pursuant to section 4503.586 of the Revised Code to the 422
Ohio mountain bike alliance. 423

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 424
receives pursuant to section 4503.588 of the Revised Code to the 425
Ohio grange patrons of husbandry foundation, which shall use the 426
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 427

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 428
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 429

contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 430
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 431
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 432
commission and that is participating in the license plate 433
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 434
of the county of residence of an applicant. 435

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 436
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 437
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 438
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 439
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 440
(G) of that section. 441

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 442
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 443
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 444
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 445
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 446
Ohio and for educational programs. 447

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 448
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 449
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 450
supporting cancer research. 451

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 452
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 453
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 454

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 455
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 456
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 457

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 458

receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 459
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 460
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 461
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 462

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 463
receives pursuant to section 4503.598 of the Revised Code 464
equally to the Jackson local schools foundation and the Jackson 465
high school alumni association. The foundation and alumni 466
association shall use the contributions for the foundation's and 467
alumni association's purposes. 468

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 469
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 470
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 471
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 472
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 473

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 474
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 475
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 476
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 477
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 478
scouts. 479

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 480
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 481
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 482
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 483
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 485
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 486
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 487

which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 489
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 490
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 491
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 492

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 493
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 494
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 495
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 496
charitable purposes. 497

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 498
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 499
Ohio state moose association. 500

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 501
receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 502
Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 503
of Dayton. 504

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 505
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 506
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 507
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 508

contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1280
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1281
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1282
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1283

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1284

license plate contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of 1373

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1375
