**A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

To urge Congress to designate the Buckeye Trail as a 1  
National Scenic Trail. 2

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF  
OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):**

WHEREAS, National Scenic Trails are routes, designated by 3  
Congress, that traverse some of the most breathtaking landscapes 4  
in the United States, providing unique opportunities for hiking, 5  
biking, and experiencing nature. These trails are recognized for 6  
their outstanding scenic, natural, and recreational values, 7  
often showcasing diverse ecosystems, picturesque vistas, and 8  
cultural heritage along their paths; and 9

WHEREAS, National Scenic Trails, like the Appalachian Trail 10

and the Pacific Crest Trail, are managed by various federal and 11  
state agencies and offer well-maintained paths that attract 12  
outdoor enthusiasts from across the country. They often 13  
intersect with local communities and provide significant 14  
economic benefits through tourism; and 15

WHEREAS, The Buckeye Trail is an existing long-distance 16  
hiking trail that creates a loop extending approximately 1,454 17  
miles from Lake Erie to the Ohio River, through the farmland of 18  
northwest Ohio, the hills of Appalachia, the Black Hand 19  
sandstone cliffs of the Hocking Hills region, and the Bluegrass 20  
region of southwest Ohio; and 21

WHEREAS, The Buckeye Trail was established in 1959 by the 22  
Buckeye Trail Association, a nonprofit organization that 23  
currently administers the trail; and 24

WHEREAS, The National Park Service is conducting a study to 25  
provide information to Congress on the feasibility and 26  
desirability of designating the Buckeye Trail as a National 27  
Scenic Trail. By objectively examining established criteria, the 28  
National Park Service's study will assess how well the trail 29  
aligns with the federal designation requirements, which 30  
emphasize public access to and the preservation and conservation 31  
of the trail's unique characteristics; and 32

WHEREAS, At the conclusion of the study, the National Park 33  
Service will submit its findings to the Secretary of the 34  
Interior, who then makes a recommendation to Congress for 35  
consideration; now therefore be it 36

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 136th General 37  
Assembly of the State of Ohio, upon completion of the 38  
feasibility study, urge Congress to designate the Buckeye Trail 39  
as a National Scenic Trail; and be it further 40

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives 41

transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the	42
President Pro Tempore and Secretary of the United States Senate,	43
Speaker and Clerk of the United States House of Representatives,	44
members of Ohio's Congressional delegation, and the news media	45
