BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, The American food industry is in crisis because	5
toxins, chemicals, and fillers are increasingly being found in	6
our food and negatively affecting our health; and	7
WHEREAS, Obesity rates in the United States have markedly	8
increased over the past several decades. According to the U.S.	9
Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), at least 20%	10
of adults in each U.S. state have obesity, with Ohio being one	11
of 23 states where 35% or more of adults are affected. Before	12
2013, no state had an adult obesity prevalence at or above 35%.	13
