## A BILL

To enact sections 3727.81, 3727.811, and 5119.192	1
of the Revised Code to require hospitals to	2
provide overdose reversal drugs under certain	3
circumstances.	4

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3727.81, 3727.811, and 5119.192	5
of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3727.81. (A) As used in this section and section	7
3727.811 of the Revised Code:	8
(1) "Health benefit plan" has the same meaning as in	9
section 3922.01 of the Revised Code.	10
(2) "Overdose reversal drug" has the same meaning as in	11
section 4729.01 of the Revised Code.	12
(B)(1) Except as provided in division (B)(2) of this	13
section, at the time of a patient's discharge from a hospital's	14
emergency department, the hospital shall provide to the patient	15
an overdose reversal drug if the patient presented to its	16
emergency department with one or more symptoms of an opioid	17
overdose, opioid use disorder, or other adverse event related to	18

opioid use.	19
(2) A hospital is not required to provide an overdose	20
reversal drug to a patient under division (B)(1) of this section	21
if any of the following is the case:	22
(a) The patient's treating practitioner has determined, in	23
the practitioner's clinical and professional judgment, that	24
providing the drug is not appropriate.	25
(b) The patient's treating practitioner has confirmed that	26
the patient possesses an overdose reversal drug.	27
(c) The hospital has not received a supply of overdose	28
reversal drugs from any source, including the department of	29
mental health and addiction services as described in section	30
5119.192 of the Revised Code.	31
(d) The patient refuses to accept the overdose reversal	32
drug.	33
(C) In providing an overdose reversal drug under this	34
section, the hospital also shall provide the patient with	35
directions for the drug's use as well as information about	36
medications for opioid use disorder, harm reduction strategies,	37
and available services, such as treatment and peer counseling.	38
In the case of a patient described in division (B)(2)(d)	39
of this section, the hospital shall provide the patient with	40
information about medications for opioid use disorder, harm	41
reduction strategies, and available services, such as treatment	42
and peer counseling.	43
(D)(1) Subject to division (D)(2) of this section, in the	44
case of a patient who is covered by a health benefit plan or the	45
medicaid program and receives an overdose reversal drug under	46

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this section, the hospital may seek reimbursement for the drug's	47
cost by submitting to the plan or program a claim for payment.	48
Payment of the claim is dependent on whether the patient's	49
health benefit plan or the medicaid program covers the drug and	50
the terms and conditions for that coverage.	51
(2) Under division (D)(1) of this section, a hospital may	52
seek reimbursement for the cost of an overdose reversal drug	53
only if the drug provided to the patient was from a supply	54
purchased by the hospital.	55
(E) This section does not do any of the following:	56
(1) Prohibit a hospital from providing an overdose	57
reversal drug at no cost to a patient or third-party payor from	58
a supply purchased by the hospital;	59
(2) Limit the authority of a hospital to provide overdose	60
reversal drugs as described in section 3715.50 of the Revised	61
Code;	62
(3) Affect a hospital's ability or responsibility to	63
provide financial assistance to a patient as required by state	64
or federal law.	65
(F) A hospital, including any of its employees,	66
contractors, and practitioners, is not liable for or subject to	67
any of the following for an act or omission that arises from	68
fulfilling the duties of or exercising any authority under this	69
section: damages in any civil action, prosecution in any	70
criminal proceeding, sanctions under this chapter or Chapter	71
3722. of the Revised Code, or professional disciplinary action.	72
Sec. 3727.811. A hospital that provides overdose reversal	73
drugs as described in section 3727.81 of the Revised Code shall	74
record each occurrence in which an overdose reversal drug was	75

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provided and shall prepare reports compiling the records. The	76
hospital shall prepare and submit reports to the department of	77
health and department of mental health and addiction services in	78
accordance with the standards and procedures established under	79
section 5119.192 of the Revised Code. In preparing a report, a	80
hospital shall not include any information that identifies or	81
tends to identify specific individuals to whom overdose reversal	82
drugs were provided.	83
Sec. 5119.192. (A) As used in this section, "overdose	84
reversal drug" has the same meaning as in section 4729.01 of the	85
Revised Code.	86
(B) Subject to available funds, the department of mental	87
health and addiction services shall provide overdose reversal	88
drugs to hospitals to be provided to patients as described in	89
section 3727.81 of the Revised Code.	90
(C) The department of mental health and addiction	91
services, in coordination with the department of health, shall	92
establish standards and procedures for reporting the occurrences	93
in which overdose reversal drugs were provided as required by	94
section 3727.811 of the Revised Code.	95
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
