(4) Two members appointed by the president of the senate;	48
(5) Two members appointed by the speaker of the house of	49

(6) One member appointed by the minority leader of the	51

(7) One member appointed by the minority leader of the	53
house of representatives.	54
(B) Task force members appointed under divisions (B) (4) to	55
(7) of this section shall be representative of the communities	56
experiencing this crisis, including directly impacted	57
individuals, and reflect the diversity of the state and have	58
experience in cultural competency.	59
(C) Initial members of the task force shall be appointed	60
not later than ninety days after the effective date of this	61
section. Members of the task force appointed under divisions (B)	62
(4) to (7) of this section shall serve terms of two years. Any	63
vacancy on the task force shall be filled in the same manner as	
the original appointment.	65
(D) Members shall select a chairperson from among the	66
members of the task force.	67
(E) A majority of the members of the task force	68
constitutes a quorum for the transaction of the business of the	69
task force.	70
(F) Task force members shall serve without compensation	71
but shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses	72
incurred in the performance of their duties.	73
