BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.736 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	18
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	19
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or	20

other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30 pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31 society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32 and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who have pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar47receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the48Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the49

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contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social50support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar56receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to57special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions58for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.4912 of the Revised Code to 75 the Ben Morrison memorial fund, which shall use the 76 contributions for scholarships and other programs that support 77 mental health. 78

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 80 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 81 contributions into its general account to be used for 82 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 83 America foundation. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 86 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 87 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 88 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 91 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 92 scholarships and other educational activities. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 94 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 95 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 96 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 97 that organization. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar99receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to100Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for101scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or102events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received104pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio105aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to106facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational107

The registrar shall pay the contributions received109pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the110organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that111organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in112need.113

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 114 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 115 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 116 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 117

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 125 receives pursuant to section 4503.512 of the Revised Code to the 126 127 Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega chapter in Ohio. The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated 128 Delta Theta Omega chapter shall use the contributions for the 129 development and perpetuation of scholarship, leadership, 130 citizenship, fidelity, and brotherhood among men and youth in 131 this state. 132

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar133receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the134university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of135awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend136

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the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it137receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program.138The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the139university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such140funds as provided in this section.141

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 142 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 143 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 144 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 145 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 146 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 147 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 148 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 149 funds as provided in this section. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 152 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 153 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 154 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 155 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 156 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 157 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 158 funds as provided in this section. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar160receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the161Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the162contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign.163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar164receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code165equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of166

Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 167 advocates for addiction recovery). 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169 receives pursuant to section 4503.520 of the Revised Code to 170 Purdue university in West Lafayette, Indiana, for purposes of 171 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 172 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 173 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 174 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with 175 Purdue university to effectuate the distribution of such funds 176 177 as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 179 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 180 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 181 cyclists of all ages. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 184 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 185 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 186 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 187 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 188 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190 receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 191 fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 192 the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 193 lighthouses of fairport harbor. 194

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 196 Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 197 contributions only to promote and support the football team of 198 Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 199

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron district seven which shall annually distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance

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their education, and to support persons conducting nursing226research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and227the improvement of patient outcomes.228

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar229receives pursuant to section 4503.53 of the Revised Code to the230Indiana Kentucky Ohio regional council of carpenters. The231council shall use the money it receives to assist its members232who are experiencing financial hardship.233

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 234 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 235 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 236 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 237 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 238 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 239 personnel, veterans, and their families. 240

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 245 receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 246 nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 247 health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 248 further the nonprofit's mission. 249

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 250 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 251 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 252 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 253 families. 254

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255 receives pursuant to section 4503.536 of the Revised Code to 256 save a warrior, incorporated, which shall use the contributions 257 to prevent suicide by active members of the armed forces of the 258 United States, veterans of those armed forces, and first 259 responders. 260

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.542 of the Revised Code to the Ohio craft brewers association.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar264receives pursuant to section 4503.541 of the Revised Code to265Dolly Parton's imagination library of Ohio. The library shall266use the money it receives under this section for operational267costs, including the distribution of books.268

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 274 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 275 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 276 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 277 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 278 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 279 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 280 destination. 281

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the282contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section283

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4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 284 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 285 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 286 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 287 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 288 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 289 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 290 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 291 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 292

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 293 receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 294 rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 297 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 298 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 299 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 300 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 301 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 302 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 303 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 304 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 305 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 306 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 307 under this section. 308

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 309 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 310 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 311 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 312 programs. 313

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 314 receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 315 western reserve historical society, which shall use the 316 contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318 receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 319 Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 320 negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 321 contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 322

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 323 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 324 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 325 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 326 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 327 the person who paid the contribution resides. 328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329 receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 330 playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 331 the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 332 producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 333 arts education, and creating a superior destination for 334 entertainment, business, and residential living. 335

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 336 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 337 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 338 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 339 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 340 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 341 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 342 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 343

managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 344
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 345
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 346
such payments are to be made. 347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361 receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 362 Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 363 contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar365receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the366girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the367contributions to support the activities of the organization.368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar369receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the370Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use371the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and372

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rehabilitation, and educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 374 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 376 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 377 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 378 local beekeeping programs. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 380 receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 381 382 national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 383 legends to inspire future leaders. 384

385 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 386 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 387 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 388 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 389 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 390 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 391

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 393 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 394 the contributions for educational purposes. 395

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 396 receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 397 Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 398 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 400 receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 401

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progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which402shall use the contributions to support the activities of the403center.404

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar405receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the406American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the407contributions to support the activities of the organization.408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar409receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the410Ohio natural energy foundation to fund scholarships for students411pursuing careers in the oil and natural gas industry.412

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar413receives pursuant to section 4503.585 of the Revised Code to the414Terrace Park recreation committee, inc. to offer scholarships to415young athletes of, and maintain athletic facilities in, the416municipal corporation of Terrace Park.417

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.586 of the Revised Code to the Ohio mountain bike alliance.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar421receives pursuant to section 4503.588 of the Revised Code to the422Ohio grange patrons of husbandry foundation, which shall use the423contributions to support the activities of the organization.424

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created425pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each426contribution the registrar receives under that section that an427applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a428professional sports team located in the county of that sports429commission and that is participating in the license plate430

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program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 431 of the county of residence of an applicant. 432 The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 433 contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 434 the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 435 that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 436 participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 437 (G) of that section. 438 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 439 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 440 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 441 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 442 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 443 Ohio and for educational programs. 444 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 445 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 446 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 447 supporting cancer research. 448 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 449 receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 450 Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 451 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 452 receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 453

Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 454 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 455 receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 456 Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 457

contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville458pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event.459

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 460 receives pursuant to section 4503.598 of the Revised Code 461 equally to the Jackson local schools foundation and the Jackson 462 high school alumni association. The foundation and alumni 463 association shall use the contributions for the foundation's and 464 alumni association's purposes. 465

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar466receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the467Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council468shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner469throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.470

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 471 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 472 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 473 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 474 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 475 scouts. 476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar477receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the478Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council479shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner480throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.481

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar482receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the483charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m.,484which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.485

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar486receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the487Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar495receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the496Ohio state moose association.497

The registrar shall pay the contributions received514pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio515concerns of police survivors, which shall use those516contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate517

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to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed in the line of duty. The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater

Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 522 contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 523 the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 524

The registrar shall pay the contributions received525pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio526association of chiefs of police.527

The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1275 1276 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1277 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1278 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1280receives pursuant to section 4503.959 of the Revised Code to the1281Dublin food pantry, which shall use the contributions to provide1282food, hygiene products, and other resources to individuals and1283families experiencing food insecurity.1284

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1285receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1286Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1287corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1288contributions for any political purpose.1289

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1290receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1291Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1292Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1293any political purpose.1294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1296 Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1297 high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1298 purpose. 1299

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1300receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to1301Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use1302contributions to fund college and career technical training1303scholarships for students.1304

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1305 receives pursuant to section 4503.965 of the Revised Code to the 1306 Norton music boosters association. The association shall use the 1307 contributions to provide financial assistance to the Norton high 1308 school music boosters for equipment, travel, and programming 1309 expenses. 1310

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1311 receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1312 friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1313 to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1314 emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1316receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the1317Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and1318activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the1319city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park."1320

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this

section the investment income the fund earned the previous1325calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an1326entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity1327received from the fund during the previous calendar year.1328

Sec. 4503.736. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1329 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1330 vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1331 may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1332 and issuance of "Play Golf Ohio" license plates. The application 1333 may be combined with a request for a special reserved license 1334 plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon 1335 receipt of the completed application and compliance by the 1336 applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the 1337 registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 1338 registration and a set of "Play Golf Ohio" license plates and a 1339 validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required 1340 by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1341

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1342 inscribed on the license plates, "Play Golf Ohio" license plates 1343 shall display an appropriate logo and words that are selected by 1344 representatives of the northern Ohio PGA and southern Ohio PGA 1345 golf foundations and approved by the registrar. "Play Golf Ohio" 1346 license plates shall display county identification stickers that 1347 identify the county of registration as required under section 1348 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1349
