To create the Ohio Local and Organic Food and Farm

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:	
Section 1. (A) There is hereby created the Ohio Local and	3
Organic Food and Farm Task Force to make recommendations to the	4
General Assembly for expanding and supporting a state, local,	5
and organic food system.	6
(B) The task force shall consist of the following members	7
appointed by the Governor:	8
(1) One representative each from the Departments of	9
Agriculture, Commerce, and Health;	10
(2) Four organic farmers, representing the dairy, meat,	11
vegetable, and grains sectors;	12
(3) Four organic specialty crop producers, representing	13
different flower, fruit, viticulture, aquaculture, fiber,	14
vegetable, and ornamental sectors;	15
(4) Two organic food processors;	16
(5) One organic distributor and one non-organic	17
distributor:	18

(6) Three representatives of not-for-profit educational	19
organizations;	20
(7) One organic certifier;	21
(8) One consumer representative;	22
(9) Two representatives of farm organizations;	23
(10) One university agricultural specialist;	24
(11) One philanthropic organization representative;	25
(12) One food retailer representative;	26
(13) Two municipal corporation representatives from	27
different communities in this state;	28
(14) Four representatives from community-based	29
organizations focusing on food access, to include at least three	30
members who represent under-represented ethnicities or minority	31
groups;	32
(15) One chef specializing in the preparation of locally	33
grown organic foods.	34
(C) The Governor shall make appointments to the task force	35
not later than sixty days after the effective date of this	36
section. Each member of the task force shall serve until the	37
report is submitted in accordance with division (D) of this	38
section. Each member is subject to removal at the pleasure of	39
the Governor. Any vacancy on the task force shall be filled in	40
the same manner as the original appointment.	41
(D) The task force shall develop a plan containing policy	42
and funding recommendations for expanding and supporting a	43
state, local, and organic food system. The task force shall	44
identify and describe all of the following in the plan:	45

(1) Obstacles to increasing locally grown food and local	46
organic food production;	47
(2) Land preservation and acquisition opportunities for	48
local and organic agriculture in rural, suburban, and urban	49
areas;	50
(2) Farmer training and development opportunities;	51
(3) Financial incentives, technical support, and training	52
necessary to help Ohio farmers to transition to local, organic,	53
and specialty crop production by minimizing their financial	54
losses during the transition period;	55
(4) Strategies and funding needs to make fresh and	56
affordable Ohio-grown foods more accessible, both in rural and	57
urban communities, with an emphasis on creating new food outlets	58
in communities that need them;	59
(5) Financial and technical support necessary to build	60
connections between landowners, farmers, buyers, and consumers;	61
(6) Financial and technical support necessary to build a	62
local food infrastructure of processing, storage, and	63
distribution;	64
(7) Financial and technical support necessary to develop	65
new food and agriculture-related businesses for local food and	66
organic food production and distribution, such as on-farm	67
processing, micro-markets, incubator kitchens, and marketing and	68
communications businesses;	69
(8) Financial and technical support necessary to expand	70
the development of farmers markets, roadside markets, and local	71
grocery stores in unserved and underserved areas, as well as the	72
creation of year-round public markets in large communities;	73

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(9) Best practices and opportunities for the development	74
of local food and organic food production;	75
(10) Opportunities to educate the public and producers	76
about the benefits of local foods systems and about the	77
development opportunities described in this section;	78
(11) Legal impediments to local food and organic food	79
production and recommendations for a remedy to those	80
impediments.	81
The task force shall prepare and submit its plan in a	82
report to the General Assembly not later than two years after	83
the effective date of this section.	84
(E) The task force created under this section ceases to	85
exist once the task force submits its plan in a report to the	86
General Assembly under division (D) of this section.	87
