the "1905 Wright Flyer III" license plate.
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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 5910.07 be amended
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and section 4503.4913 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as
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follows:
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Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state
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treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall
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consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid
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by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of
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motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced
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in division (B) of this section.
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(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the
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registrar collects in the fund as follows:
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The registrar shall pay the contributions received
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pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast
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cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for
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programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast
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cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to
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quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of
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the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or
other abortion-related activities. 21
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends
other money in that fund. 23
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The registrar shall pay the contributions received
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 31
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services
directly to their clients. 35
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money
it receives under this section to assist those who have
pancreatic cancer and their families. 43
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 48
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Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 50
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs. 53
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 57
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs. 61
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 65
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers. 70
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4912 of the Revised Code to the Ben Morrison memorial fund, which shall use the contributions for scholarships and other programs that support 75
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mental health. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80
receives pursuant to section 4503.4913 of the Revised Code to 81
the treasurer of state for deposit in the Ohio war orphans and 82
severely disabled veterans' children scholarship donation fund 83
created by section 5910.07 of the Revised Code. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 86
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 87
contributions into its general account to be used for 88
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 89
America foundation. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 92
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 93
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 94
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 95

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 96
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 97
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 98
scholarships and other educational activities. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 101
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 102
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 103
that organization. 104

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 105
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 106
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 107

scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.	108 109
The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational programming.	110 111 112 113 114
The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in need.	115 116 117 118 119
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the Ohio chapters of a kid again.	120 121 122 123
The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.	124 125 126 127 128 129 130
The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.512 of the Revised Code to the Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega chapter in Ohio. The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega chapter shall use the contributions for the development and perpetuation of scholarship, leadership,	131 132 133 134 135 136

citizenship, fidelity, and brotherhood among men and youth in 137
this state. 138

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 139
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 140
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 141
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 142
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 143
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 144
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 145
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 146
funds as provided in this section. 147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 148
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 149
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 150
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 151
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 152
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 153
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 154
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 155
funds as provided in this section. 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 158
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 159
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 160
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 161
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 162
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166

receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 167
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar
receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.53 of the Revised Code to the Indiana Kentucky Ohio regional council of carpenters. The council shall use the money it receives to assist its members who are experiencing financial hardship.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws of this state, to assist that organization in paying for the charitable activities and programs it sponsors in support of United States military personnel, veterans, and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to further the nonprofit's mission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families. 256
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.536 of the Revised Code to save a warrior, incorporated, which shall use the contributions to prevent suicide by active members of the armed forces of the United States, veterans of those armed forces, and first responders. 261
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.542 of the Revised Code to the Ohio craft brewers association. 267
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.541 of the Revised Code to Dolly Parton's imagination library of Ohio. The library shall use the money it receives under this section for operational costs, including the distribution of books. 270
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The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 275
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 280
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hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose	285
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel	286
destination.	287
The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the	288
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section	289
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other	290
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is	291
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The	292
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this	293
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and	294
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper	295
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio	296
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and	297
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.	298
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	299
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the	300
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.	301
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	302
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the	303
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit	304
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section,	305
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the	306
members shall use the money only to pay for educational,	307
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that	308
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The	309

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 324
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The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides. 329

Ohio and for educational programs. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453

pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 455
supporting cancer research. 456

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 457
