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To amend sections 4501.21 and 5910.07 and to enact 1  
section 4503.4913 of the Revised Code to create 2  
the "1905 Wright Flyer III" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That sections 4501.21 and 5910.07 be amended 4  
and section 4503.4913 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as 5  
follows: 6

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 7  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 8  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 9  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 10  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 11  
in division (B) of this section. 12

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 13  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 14

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 15  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 16  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 17  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 18  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 19  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 20

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 21  
other abortion-related activities. 22

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 23  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 24  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 25  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 26  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 27  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 28  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 29  
other money in that fund. 30

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 31  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 32  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 33  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 34

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 35  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 36  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 37  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 38  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 39  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 40  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 41  
directly to their clients. 42

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 43  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 44  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 45  
it receives under this section to assist those who have 46  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 48  
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 49

Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 50  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 51  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 52

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 53  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 54  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 55  
its research and other programs. 56

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 57  
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 58  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 59  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 60

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 61  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 62  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 63  
contributions for its research and other programs. 64

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 65  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 66  
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 67  
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 68  
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 69

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 70  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 71  
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 72  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 73  
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 74

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 75  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4912 of the Revised Code to 76  
the Ben Morrison memorial fund, which shall use the 77  
contributions for scholarships and other programs that support 78

mental health. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4913 of the Revised Code to 81  
the treasurer of state for deposit in the Ohio war orphans and 82  
severely disabled veterans' children scholarship donation fund 83  
created by section 5910.07 of the Revised Code. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 86  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 87  
contributions into its general account to be used for 88  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 89  
America foundation. 90

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 91  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 92  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 93  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 94  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 95

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 96  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 97  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 98  
scholarships and other educational activities. 99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 100  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 101  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 102  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 103  
that organization. 104

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 105  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 106  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 107

scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 108  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 109

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 110  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 111  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 112  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 113  
programming. 114

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 115  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 116  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 117  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 118  
need. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 121  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 122  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 123

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 124  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 125  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 126  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 127  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 128  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 129  
scholarship fund. 130

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 131  
receives pursuant to section 4503.512 of the Revised Code to the 132  
Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega 133  
chapter in Ohio. The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated 134  
Delta Theta Omega chapter shall use the contributions for the 135  
development and perpetuation of scholarship, leadership, 136

citizenship, fidelity, and brotherhood among men and youth in 137  
this state. 138

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 139  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 140  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 141  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 142  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 143  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 144  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 145  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 146  
funds as provided in this section. 147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 148  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 149  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 150  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 151  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 152  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 153  
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 154  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 155  
funds as provided in this section. 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 157  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 158  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 159  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 160  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 161  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 162  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 163  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 164  
funds as provided in this section. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166

receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 167  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 168  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 169

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 170  
receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 171  
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 172  
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 173  
advocates for addiction recovery). 174

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 175  
receives pursuant to section 4503.520 of the Revised Code to 176  
Purdue university in West Lafayette, Indiana, for purposes of 177  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 178  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 179  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 180  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with 181  
Purdue university to effectuate the distribution of such funds 182  
as provided in this section. 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 184  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 185  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 186  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 187  
cyclists of all ages. 188

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 189  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 190  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 191  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 192  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 193  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 194  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 195

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 196  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 197  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 198  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 199  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 200

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 201  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 202  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 203  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 204  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 205

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 206  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 207  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 208  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 209  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 210  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 211  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 212  
sponsors within this state. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 215  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 216  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 217  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 218  
activities. 219

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 220  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 221  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 222  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 223  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 224  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 225



The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 226  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 227  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 228  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 229  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 230  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 231  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 232  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 233  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 234

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 235  
receives pursuant to section 4503.53 of the Revised Code to the 236  
Indiana Kentucky Ohio regional council of carpenters. The 237  
council shall use the money it receives to assist its members 238  
who are experiencing financial hardship. 239

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 240  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 241  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 242  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 243  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 244  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 245  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 246

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 247  
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 248  
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 249  
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 250

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 251  
receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 252  
nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 253  
health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 254  
further the nonprofit's mission. 255

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 256  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 257  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 258  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 259  
families. 260

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 261  
receives pursuant to section 4503.536 of the Revised Code to 262  
save a warrior, incorporated, which shall use the contributions 263  
to prevent suicide by active members of the armed forces of the 264  
United States, veterans of those armed forces, and first 265  
responders. 266

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 267  
receives pursuant to section 4503.542 of the Revised Code to the 268  
Ohio craft brewers association. 269

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 270  
receives pursuant to section 4503.541 of the Revised Code to 271  
Dolly Parton's imagination library of Ohio. The library shall 272  
use the money it receives under this section for operational 273  
costs, including the distribution of books. 274

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 275  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 276  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 277  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 278  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 280  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 281  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 282  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 283  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 284

hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 285  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 286  
destination. 287

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 288  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 289  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 290  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 291  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 292  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 293  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 294  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 295  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 296  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 297  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 298

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 299  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 300  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 301

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 302  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 303  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 304  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 305  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 306  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 307  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 308  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 309  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 310  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 311  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 312  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 313  
under this section. 314

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 315  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 316  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 317  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 318  
programs. 319

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 320  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 321  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 322  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 325  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 326  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 327  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 328

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 329  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 330  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 331  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 332  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 333  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 334

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 335  
receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 336  
playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 337  
the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 338  
producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 339  
arts education, and creating a superior destination for 340  
entertainment, business, and residential living. 341

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 342  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 343

state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 344  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 345  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 346  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 347  
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 348  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 349  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 350  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 351  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 352  
such payments are to be made. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 354  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 355  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 356  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 357  
river watershed. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 360  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 361  
nature preserve. 362

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 364  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 365  
the money in support of the park. 366

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 367  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 368  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 369  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 370

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 371  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 372

girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 373  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 374

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 375  
receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 376  
Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 377  
the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 378  
rehabilitation, and educational programs. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 380  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 381  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 382  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 383  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 384  
local beekeeping programs. 385

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 386  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 387  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 388  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 389  
legends to inspire future leaders. 390

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 391  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 392  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 393  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 394  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 395  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 396  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 399  
Ohio state coalition-national council of negro women, 400  
incorporated, which shall use the contributions for educational 401

purposes. 402

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 403  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 404  
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 405  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 406

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 407  
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 408  
progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 409  
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 410  
center. 411

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 412  
receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 413  
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 414  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 415

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 416  
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.584 of the 417  
Revised Code to the Ohio natural energy foundation to fund 418  
scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and 419  
natural gas industry. 420

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 421  
receives pursuant to section 4503.585 of the Revised Code to the 422  
Terrace Park recreation committee, inc. to offer scholarships to 423  
young athletes of, and maintain athletic facilities in, the 424  
municipal corporation of Terrace Park. 425

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 426  
receives pursuant to section 4503.586 of the Revised Code to the 427  
Ohio mountain bike alliance. 428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 429  
receives pursuant to section 4503.588 of the Revised Code to the 430

Ohio grange patrons of husbandry foundation, which shall use the 431  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 432

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 433  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 434  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 435  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 436  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 437  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 438  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 439  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 440

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 441  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 442  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 443  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 444  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 445  
(G) of that section. 446

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 447  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 448  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 449  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 450  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 451  
Ohio and for educational programs. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 454  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 455  
supporting cancer research. 456

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 457  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 458  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 459



The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 460  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 461  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 462

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 463  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 464  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 465  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 466  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 468  
receives pursuant to section 4503.598 of the Revised Code 469  
equally to the Jackson local schools foundation and the Jackson 470  
high school alumni association. The foundation and alumni 471  
association shall use the contributions for the foundation's and 472  
alumni association's purposes. 473

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 474  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 475  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 476  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 477  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 478

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 479  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 480  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 481  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 482  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 483  
scouts. 484
