Highlights

- The bill allows an individual whose license to practice as a medical or osteopathic physician was revoked by the State Medical Board to apply for license reinstatement if certain conditions are met. This will result in minimal administrative and rule promulgation costs, which could be offset by application revenue collected.

Detailed Analysis

The bill authorizes an individual whose license to practice as a medical or osteopathic physician was revoked by the State Medical Board to apply for license reinstatement if certain conditions are met. The bill outlines these conditions. If the Board reinstates a license to practice, the bill requires the Board to impose specified terms and conditions on the license holder. The Board may impose additional terms and conditions as well as those specified under the bill. These provisions will result in minimal administrative costs for the Board. However, the bill requires each application to include a fee of at least \$610, which will help offset costs. Total costs, as well as revenues received, will depend on the number of applications received. Lastly, the bill allows the Board to adopt any rules it considers necessary to implement the bill, which will result in minimal rule promulgation costs.

Fee revenue collected by the Board is deposited into the State Medical Board Operating Fund (Fund 5C60). Fund 5C60 is the Board's operating account into which receipts are deposited and from which expenses are paid.
