Highlights

- The Bureau of Motor Vehicles and the Ohio Traffic Safety Office may incur minimal one-time costs to update online materials to reflect the bill's changes to probationary driver's license eligibility and to launch a promotional campaign to raise awareness of those changes.

Detailed Analysis

The bill may result in minimal additional one-time costs for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles and the Ohio Traffic Safety Office, both of which are located within the Department of Public Safety. Those divisions will need to update online materials to reflect the bill's changes to probationary driver's license eligibility and launch a promotional campaign to raise awareness of those changes. The bill lowers the age in which a temporary instruction permit can be obtained from 15.5 to 15 years and increases the amount of time that a juvenile must hold that permit prior to being eligible for a probationary driver's license from six months to one year. Any related increase in costs and workload is expected to be absorbed utilizing existing resources.
