### Highlights

#### Specialty license plates

- The Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) will incur costs of at least \$6.35 to produce each specialty license plate issued, of which the bill creates 19. That cost will generally be offset by the collection of the \$10 BMV administrative fee that is charged under existing law when a specialty license plate is issued or renewed.
- The Public Safety – Highway Purposes Fund (Fund 5TM0), used by the Department of Public Safety, and certain local governments may experience a minimal decrease in revenue from the bill's waiver of registration taxes and fees for each "Law Enforcement Purple Heart" license plate issued, which is also created by the bill.

#### Highway designations

- The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur costs of approximately \$1,400 to produce and install each set of signs for 25 of the 36 designated highways or bridges in the bill. In total, 11 municipalities may incur some costs for installing the signs. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.

### Detailed Analysis

#### Specialty license plates

The bill creates a total of 19 specialty license plates, 18 of which are available to all Ohio motorists, and requires a person to pay an additional amount that ranges from \$20 to \$40, depending on the license plate, when the plate is issued and renewed. A portion of that fee is retained by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV), with the remainder distributed to a designated recipient. The following table shows each of those 18 license plates and the distribution of the

additional amount. The bill also creates the “Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate that is available to Ohio motorists who have been awarded the Law Enforcement Purple Heart. That license plate is discussed separately under the heading below entitled “Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate.

\*The bill prohibits the Registrar of Motor Vehicles from rejecting an application for the license plate if the applicant does not provide a contribution.

Specialty license plates are produced by the BMV via a digital print-on-demand process at a cost of \$6.35 for a single license plate, or \$7.70 for a pair.<sup>1</sup> These costs will be offset by the collection of the \$10 BMV administrative fee which is paid at the initial issuance of the license plate and for each subsequent renewal and credited to the Public Safety – Highway Purposes Fund (Fund 5TMO), which is used in part to pay the BMV’s expenses related to titling motor vehicles, licensing drivers, and registering motor vehicles.

Each of these 18 specialty license plates are subject to existing law’s implementation procedure, meaning that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles does not have to issue the license plate until written statements from at least 150 people indicating their intent to apply for and obtain the license plate have been received.<sup>2</sup>

Assuming the minimum number of applicants meets the threshold of 150 for the first year that each specialty license plate is available, the BMV will incur production costs of at least \$952.50 (150 persons x \$6.35), which will be offset by the collection of at least \$1,500 (150 persons x \$10) in BMV fees. The amount generated by each specialty license plate for each designated recipient will range from at least \$1,500 (150 persons x \$10) to at least \$4,500 (150 persons x \$30), depending on the license plate. In subsequent years, those amounts will vary and depend on the number of each type of plate that is issued or renewed.

### **“Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate**

The bill also creates the “Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate, which is available to Ohio motorists who have been awarded the Law Enforcement Purple Heart by the National Association of Chiefs of Police, generally without payment of any registration or service fee, or motor vehicle license tax.<sup>3</sup> When applicable, the bill also requires that the “Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate display the international symbol of access.

By waiving the registration fees and license taxes associated with the “Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate, the bill may minimally reduce the amount of BMV registration fee revenue generated and credited to Fund 5TMO, and the amount of local tax distributions received by certain local governments.

The bill also provides Law Enforcement Purple Heart recipients who wish to obtain a personalized license plate the option to do so upon payment of 75% of the additional fees that apply to such license plates.<sup>4</sup> To the extent that personalized “Law Enforcement Purple Heart”

license plates are issued, the BMV will receive either \$18.75 or \$37.50, depending on the type of personalized license plate issued, \$6.25 to \$12.50 less than what is normally charged. Such revenue will be credited to Fund 5TMO.

According to the National Association of Chiefs of Police, a Law Enforcement Purple Heart may be issued to officers who are injured or disabled in the line of duty.<sup>5</sup> There is no comprehensive list of Law Enforcement Purple Heart recipients in Ohio, but LBO assumes the number of applications for such license plates will be relatively small.

The “Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate is subject to existing law’s implementation procedure, meaning that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles may require that written statements from at least 150 people indicating their intent to apply for and obtain the license plate be submitted. However, the Registrar may opt to exempt these requirements.

### **Criminal penalties**

The bill prohibits willfully and falsely representing eligibility as a Law Enforcement Purple Heart recipient to obtain the “Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate and knowingly owning a motor vehicle that bears a “Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate unless the owner is a Law Enforcement Purple Heart recipient. A violation of either provision is a fourth degree misdemeanor, which is subject to a fine of up to \$250, a jail term of not more than 30 days, or both. As previously mentioned, LBO assumes that the number of applicants for the “Law Enforcement Purple Heart” license plate will be relatively small. As a result, the bill’s criminal penalties are not expected to have a discernible, if any, fiscal effect on local criminal justice systems.

### **Highway designations**

The table below summarizes details about the highways designated by the bill, including the location and the entity responsible for installing the signs. The cost of producing and installing signs is approximately \$1,400. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years. ODOT produces the signs and is often responsible for the installation. However, if the designated highway is located within municipal boundaries, as is the case with 11 of the highways designated by this bill, the municipality may install the signs and may need to reimburse ODOT for the production costs.
