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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.589 of the Revised Code to create the "Ohio 2  
NAACP" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.589 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10  
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18

quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20  
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28  
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40  
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44  
it receives under this section to assist those who have 45  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47

receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 48  
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 49  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 50  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 52  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 53  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 54  
its research and other programs. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56  
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 60  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 61  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 62  
contributions for its research and other programs. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 65  
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 66  
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 67  
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70  
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72  
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4912 of the Revised Code to 75  
the Ben Morrison memorial fund, which shall use the 76

contributions for scholarships and other programs that support 77  
mental health. 78

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 80  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 81  
contributions into its general account to be used for 82  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 83  
America foundation. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 86  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 87  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 88  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 91  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 92  
scholarships and other educational activities. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 94  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 95  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 96  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 97  
that organization. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 99  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 100  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 101  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 102  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 105

aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 106  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 107  
programming. 108

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 109  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 110  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 111  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 112  
need. 113

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 114  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 115  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 116  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 117

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 118  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 119  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 120  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 121  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 122  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 123  
scholarship fund. 124

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 125  
receives pursuant to section 4503.512 of the Revised Code to the 126  
Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega 127  
chapter in Ohio. The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated 128  
Delta Theta Omega chapter shall use the contributions for the 129  
development and perpetuation of scholarship, leadership, 130  
citizenship, fidelity, and brotherhood among men and youth in 131  
this state. 132

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 133  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 134

university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 135  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 136  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 137  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 138  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 139  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 140  
funds as provided in this section. 141

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 142  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 143  
Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 144  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 145  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 146  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 147  
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 148  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 149  
funds as provided in this section. 150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 151  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 152  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 153  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 154  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 155  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 156  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 157  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 158  
funds as provided in this section. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 161  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 162  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 164

receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 165  
equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 166  
Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 167  
advocates for addiction recovery). 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169  
receives pursuant to section 4503.520 of the Revised Code to 170  
Purdue university in West Lafayette, Indiana, for purposes of 171  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 172  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 173  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 174  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with 175  
Purdue university to effectuate the distribution of such funds 176  
as provided in this section. 177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 179  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 180  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 181  
cyclists of all ages. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 184  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 185  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 186  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 187  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 188  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 189

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 190  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 191  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 192  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 193  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 194

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the contributions only to promote and support the football team of Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the United States power squadron district seven which shall annually distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron district shall use the money it receives under this section to pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or sponsors within this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis international, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it receives under this section to provide educational scholarships to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession,



to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 225  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 226  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 227  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 228

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 229  
receives pursuant to section 4503.53 of the Revised Code to the 230  
Indiana Kentucky Ohio regional council of carpenters. The 231  
council shall use the money it receives to assist its members 232  
who are experiencing financial hardship. 233

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 234  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 235  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 236  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 237  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 238  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 239  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 240

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 241  
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 242  
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 243  
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 244

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 245  
receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 246  
nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 247  
health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 248  
further the nonprofit's mission. 249

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 250  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 251  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 252  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 253

families. 254

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255  
receives pursuant to section 4503.536 of the Revised Code to 256  
save a warrior, incorporated, which shall use the contributions 257  
to prevent suicide by active members of the armed forces of the 258  
United States, veterans of those armed forces, and first 259  
responders. 260

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 261  
receives pursuant to section 4503.542 of the Revised Code to the 262  
Ohio craft brewers association. 263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 264  
receives pursuant to section 4503.541 of the Revised Code to 265  
Dolly Parton's imagination library of Ohio. The library shall 266  
use the money it receives under this section for operational 267  
costs, including the distribution of books. 268

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 269  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 270  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 271  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 272  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 273

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 274  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 275  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 276  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 277  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 278  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 279  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 280  
destination. 281

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 282

contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 283  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 284  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 285  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 286  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 287  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 288  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 289  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 290  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 291  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 292

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 293  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 294  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 297  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 298  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 299  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 300  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 301  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 302  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 303  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 304  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 305  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 306  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 307  
under this section. 308

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 309  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 310  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 311  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 312

programs. 313

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 314  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 315  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 316  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 319  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 320  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 321  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 322

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 323  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 324  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 325  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 326  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 327  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 329  
receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 330  
playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 331  
the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 332  
producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 333  
arts education, and creating a superior destination for 334  
entertainment, business, and residential living. 335

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 336  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 337  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 338  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 339  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 340  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 341

ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 342  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 343  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 344  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 345  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 346  
such payments are to be made. 347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 348  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 349  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 350  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 351  
river watershed. 352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 353  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 354  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 355  
nature preserve. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 358  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 359  
the money in support of the park. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 362  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 363  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 366  
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 367  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 369  
receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 370

Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 371  
the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 372  
rehabilitation, and educational programs. 373

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 374  
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 375  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 376  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 377  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 378  
local beekeeping programs. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 380  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 381  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 382  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 383  
legends to inspire future leaders. 384

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 385  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 386  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 387  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 388  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 389  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 390  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 391

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 393  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 394  
the contributions for educational purposes. 395

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 396  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 397  
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 398  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the center.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the Ohio natural energy foundation to fund scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and natural gas industry.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.585 of the Revised Code to the Terrace Park recreation committee, inc. to offer scholarships to young athletes of, and maintain athletic facilities in, the municipal corporation of Terrace Park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.586 of the Revised Code to the Ohio mountain bike alliance.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.588 of the Revised Code to the Ohio grange patrons of husbandry foundation, which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.589 of the Revised Code to the Ohio conference of units of the national association for the advancement of colored people (NAACP), which shall use the

contributions to further the mission of the association. 429

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 430  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 431  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 432  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 433  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 434  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 435  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 436  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 437

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 438  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 439  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 440  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 441  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 442  
(G) of that section. 443

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 444  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 445  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 446  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 447  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 448  
Ohio and for educational programs. 449

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 450  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 451  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 452  
supporting cancer research. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 455  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 456

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 457



receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 458  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 459

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 460  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 461  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 462  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 463  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 464

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 465  
receives pursuant to section 4503.598 of the Revised Code 466  
equally to the Jackson local schools foundation and the Jackson 467  
high school alumni association. The foundation and alumni 468  
association shall use the contributions for the foundation's and 469  
alumni association's purposes. 470

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 471  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 472  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 473  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 474  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 475

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 476  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 477  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 478  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 479  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 480  
scouts. 481

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 482  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 483  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 484  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 485  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 486

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 487  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 488  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 489  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 490

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 491

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.959 of the Revised Code to the Dublin food pantry, which shall use the contributions to provide food, hygiene products, and other resources to individuals and families experiencing food insecurity.

purpose. 1298

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1299  
receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to 1300  
Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use 1301  
contributions to fund college and career technical training 1302  
scholarships for students. 1303

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1304  
receives pursuant to section 4503.965 of the Revised Code to the 1305  
Norton music boosters association. The association shall use the 1306  
contributions to provide financial assistance to the Norton high 1307  
school music boosters for equipment, travel, and programming 1308  
expenses. 1309

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1310  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1311  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1312  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1313  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1314

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1315

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1320  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1321

section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1324  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1325  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1326

Sec. 4503.589. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1328  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1329  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1330  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1331  
and issuance of "Ohio NAACP" license plates. The application may 1332  
be combined with a request for a special reserved license plate 1333  
under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon 1334  
receipt of the completed application and compliance by the 1335  
applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the 1336

or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon receipt of an 1351  
application for registration of a motor vehicle under this 1352

section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any applicable motor 1354  
vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. of the Revised 1355  
Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by section 1356  
4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1357  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1358  
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1359  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1360  
vehicles. 1361

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1362  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1363  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of fifteen 1364  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1365  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1366  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1367

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1368  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1369  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1370  
of "Ohio NAACP" license plates, into the state treasury to the 1371  
credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created in 1372  
section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1373

**Section 2.** That existing section 4501.21 of the Revised 1374  
Code is hereby repealed. 1375

**Section 3.** Section 4501.21 of the Revised Code is 1376  
presented in this act as a composite of the section as amended 1377  
by both H.B. 315 and S.B. 163 of the 135th General Assembly. The 1378  
General Assembly, applying the principle stated in division (B) 1379  
of section 1.52 of the Revised Code that amendments are to be 1380  
harmonized if reasonably capable of simultaneous operation, 1381  
finds that the composite is the resulting version of the section 1382  
in effect prior to the effective date of the section as 1383

presented in this act.

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
