of Ohio were deeply saddened to learn of the death of Alan J. Zaleski
and extend our heartfelt condolences to his family and friends; and

WHEREAS, Alan Zaleski left an indelible impression on the people
whose lives he touched, and he will be remembered as a spirited
individual who contributed immeasurably to the world around him. A
decorated U.S. Marine Corps veteran of the Vietnam War, he was a stock
broker and an assistant vice president, the owner of Arthur Products,
and a parishioner of Saint Mary Catholic Church, and he served his
fellow citizens as a city councilman and a county commissioner before
being elected as a member of the Ohio Senate, representing the 13th
District from 1982 to 1998. Indeed, his love for Ohio and his sincere

in our society was clearly evident in his personal sacrifices of time
