A RESOLUTION

To support moving NASA headquarters to Ohio.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

WHEREAS, Ohio is the birthplace of aviation and has produced some of our nation's greatest pioneers in space exploration, including more astronauts than any other state; and

WHEREAS, Ohio continues to lead the nation in aerospace research and development and is home to world-class research institutions such as NASA Glenn Research Center, NASA Neil Armstrong Test Facility, and the Air Force Research Laboratory; and

WHEREAS, The lease on the current NASA headquarters in Washington, D.C. will expire in 2028, making this an opportune time to accomplish President Trump's wish to move federal agencies out of Washington, D.C. and reduce federal spending; and
