



House Bill 60 Sponsor Testimony

Chairman Hill, Vice Chairman Burkley, Ranking Member Patterson, and members of the House Agriculture and Rural Development Committee, thank you for the opportunity to offer sponsor testimony on House Bill 60, which addresses the laws governing companion animals.

If enacted, H.B. 60—known as Goddard’s Law—is set to: revise provisions and penalties regarding treatment of companion animals, to revise the definition of "companion animal" in the Offenses Relating to Domestic Animals Law, and to provide a state collaborative effort to assist veterinarians in identifying clients who may use their animals to secure opioids for abuse.

This bill is very important to the constituents I represent in the 70th House District. As many of you know, companion animals become part of our families, and we care for them with great concern and love. We want to better protect companion animals for all Ohio families from the dangers of abuse by elevating punishments for these abusers.

More importantly, however, the bill will better identify serial criminals, as Rep. Patmon pointed out, and allow us to identify these potential abusers of people thereby helping us protect our children and families.
