"Of the foregoing appropriation item 600617, Child Care 19  
Federal, \$44,800,000 in fiscal year 2021 shall be used to 20  
provide grants to child day-care centers and Type A or Type B 21  
family day-care homes licensed under Chapter 5104. of the 22  
Revised Code. Grant funds shall be used for ongoing 23  
infrastructure costs and to help with increased costs to 24  
purchase personal protective equipment and for costs or losses 25  
relating to smaller class sizes, including previously incurred 26  
costs, related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Grants shall be awarded 27  
based on a center's or home's capacity to serve children and its 28  
rating in the Step Up to Quality program established by section 29  
5104.29 of the Revised Code. 30

Of the foregoing appropriation item 600617, Child Care 31  
Federal, \$67,443,557 in fiscal year 2021 shall be used to 32  
provide stipends to certain child care staff and administrators. 33  
These stipends are to be retroactive to October 1, 2020. 34  
Assistant teachers, lead teachers, administrators, lead 35  
administrators, and other verified early childhood professionals 36  
are eligible for \$300 each quarter of fiscal year 2021." 37
