**"Sec. 3317.014.** (A) The multiples for the following 6  
categories of career-technical education programs approved by 7  
the department of education under section 3317.161 of the 8  
Revised Code shall be as follows: 9

(1) A multiple of 0.6230 for students enrolled in career- 10  
technical education workforce development programs in 11  
agricultural and environmental systems, construction 12  
technologies, engineering and science technologies, finance, 13  
health science, information technology, and manufacturing 14  
technologies, each of which shall be defined by the department 15  
in consultation with the governor's office of workforce 16  
transformation; 17



(2) A multiple of 0.5905 for students enrolled in workforce development programs in business and administration, hospitality and tourism, human services, law and public safety, transportation systems, and arts and communications, each of which shall be defined by the department in consultation with the governor's office of workforce transformation;

(3) A multiple of 0.2154 for students enrolled in career-based intervention programs, which shall be defined by the department in consultation with the governor's office of workforce transformation;

(4) A multiple of 0.1830 for students enrolled in workforce development programs in education and training, marketing, workforce development academics, public administration, and career development, each of which shall be defined by the department of education in consultation with the governor's office of workforce transformation;

(5) A multiple of 0.1570 for students enrolled in family and consumer science programs, which shall be defined by the department of education in consultation with the governor's office of workforce transformation.

(B) The multiple for career-technical education associated services, as defined by the department, shall be 0.0294.

(C) The department of education shall calculate career-technical education funds for each funding unit that is a city, local, exempted village, or joint vocational school district or the community and STEM school unit as follows:

(1) For fiscal years 2022 and 2023, the sum of the following:

section 3317.023 of the Revised Code, the department shall ~~pay~~ 114

community school established under Chapter 3314. of the Revised 117  
Code, and STEM school established under Chapter 3326. of the 118  
Revised Code that is part of a career technical planning 119

(2) The lead district of a career technical planning 133  
district shall use career awareness and exploration funds in 134  
accordance with division (H) of this section. 135

(F) (1) In any fiscal year, a school district receiving 136  
funds calculated under division (C) of this section shall spend 137  
those funds only for the purposes that the department designates 138  
as approved for career-technical education expenses. Career- 139  
technical education expenses approved by the department shall 140  
include only expenses connected to the delivery of career- 141  
technical programming to career-technical students. The 142  
department shall require the school district to report data 143  
annually so that the department may monitor the district's 144  
compliance with the requirements regarding the manner in which 145  
funding calculated under division (C) of this section may be 146  
spent. 147

(2) All funds received under division (C) of this section 148  
shall be spent in the following manner: 149

(a) At least seventy-five per cent of the funds shall be 150  
spent on curriculum development, purchase, and implementation; 151  
instructional resources and supplies; industry-based program 152  
certification; student assessment, credentialing, and placement; 153  
curriculum specific equipment purchases and leases; career- 154  
technical student organization fees and expenses; home and 155  
agency linkages; work-based learning experiences; professional 156  
development; and other costs directly associated with career- 157  
technical education programs including development of new 158  
programs. 159

(b) Not more than twenty-five per cent of the funds shall 160  
be used for personnel expenditures. 161

(G) In any fiscal year, a school district receiving funds calculated under division (D) of this section, or through a transfer of funds pursuant to division (I) of section 3317.023 of the Revised Code, shall spend those funds only for the purposes that the department designates as approved for career-technical education associated services expenses, which may include such purposes as apprenticeship coordinators, coordinators for other career-technical education services, career-technical evaluation, and other purposes designated by the department. The department may deny payment of funds calculated under division (D) of this section to any district that the department determines is not operating those services or is using funds calculated under division (D) of this section, or through a transfer of funds pursuant to division (I) of section 3317.023 of the Revised Code, for other purposes.

(H) In any fiscal year, a lead district of a career-technical planning district receiving funds under division (E) of this section, ~~or through a transfer of funds pursuant to division (I) of section 3317.023 of the Revised Code, shall disperse~~ shall utilize those funds to school districts, community schools, and STEM schools receiving services from that district that provide plans for the use of those funds that are deliver relevant career awareness and exploration programs to all students within its career technical planning district in a manner that is consistent with the career-technical planning district's plan that is on file with the department of education. ~~A The lead district or school~~ that receives funds under this division shall spend those funds only for the following purposes:

(1) Delivery of career awareness programs to students enrolled in grades kindergarten through twelve;

(2) Provision of a common, consistent curriculum to students throughout their primary and secondary education;	193 194
(3) Assistance to teachers in providing a career development curriculum to students;	195 196
(4) Development of a career development plan for each student that stays with that student for the duration of the student's primary and secondary education;	197 198 199
(5) Provision of opportunities for students to engage in activities, such as career fairs, hands-on experiences, and job shadowing, across all career pathways at each grade level.	200 201 202
The department may deny payment under this division to any district or school that the department determines is using funds paid under this division for other purposes. "	203 204 205
