Thank you for the opportunity to provide proponent testimony on House Bill 248.

My name is Jennifer Davenport and I am Health and Safety Coordinator as well as a Human Resources Administrative Assistant for a small steel business in this great state of Ohio. The reason I support House Bill 248 is because people's health should be an individual and personal responsibility and should always be a private and personal matter. No public sector, nor private sector, nor person(s) including government officials, should ever be granted access to anyone's private and confidential health information up to and including during a pandemic or other health emergency. Further, no public sector, nor private sector, nor person(s) including government officials, should ever be allowed to ask for proof of any type of "vaccination" and especially not one that is still under EUA. Those choices should be made by each individual person.

I could cite all of the data I have gathered over the years and especially this past year for my workplace, including basic law, constitutional law, human rights law, safety data reporting sheets, efficacy data and so on, but I am sure you already know all of this same information, as Representative Gross has a medical background. So I will simply say: I am not "anti-vax", I believe in medicines and vaccinations that have been proven over time, and have gone through ample testing up to and including long term effects. It is a discrimination matter for any public sector, private sector, or person(s) including government officials to ask for proof or documentation on ANY private health matter up to and including vaccinations. Any person(s) health is an individual and personal responsibility and should always be a private and personal matter.
