Referral Report

February 10, 2021

Representative Sykes reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills and Senate Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

H. B. No. 68 – Representatives Cross, Sweeney

To require owners of private construction projects to timely pay a contractor.

H. B. No. 69 – Representatives Kelly, Jarrells

To increase the state minimum wage.

To make changes to the law governing passing a school bus.
