### **Referral Report**

**June 10, 2021**

Representative \_\_\_\_\_ reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills and Senate Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

**H. B. No. 321 – Representatives Kick, Young, B.**

To eliminate the apprentice auctioneer and special auctioneer's license and to make other revisions to the law governing auctions.

**To the committee on Agriculture and Conservation**

**H. B. No. 322 – Representative Jones**

Regarding the teaching of certain current events and certain concepts regarding race and sex in public schools.

**To the committee on State and Local Government**

**H. B. No. 323 – Representative Fowler Arthur**

To authorize a personal income tax credit for certain primary and secondary education expenses.

**To the committee on Ways and Means**

**H. B. No. 324 – Representatives Click, Lipps**

To permit hospital visitation during a public health emergency or outbreak of a contagious disease, to establish criteria for those visits, and to name this act Shirley and Wilma's Law.

**To the committee on Health**

**H. B. No. 325 – Representative Wiggam**

Regarding a political subdivision's emergency powers when suppressing a riot, mob, or potential riot or mob and the preservation of rights regarding firearms during an emergency.

**To the committee on Government Oversight**

**H. B. No. 326 – Representative Fowler Arthur**

To change the first day of office of a county treasurer from the first Monday of September next after the election to the second Monday of March next after the election.

**To the committee on State and Local Government**

**H. B. No. 327 – Representatives Grendell, Fowler Arthur**

To prohibit school districts, community schools, STEM schools, and state agencies from teaching, advocating, or promoting divisive concepts.

**H. B. No. 328 – Representative Brown**

To establish the Governor's Office of Drug Policy.

**To the committee on Behavioral Health and Recovery Supports**

**H. B. No. 329 – Representative Powell**

To prohibit the state from conducting a lottery dependent on an individual's COVID-19 vaccination status, to name the act the "Taxpayer Protection Against the Frivolous Vaccine Lottery Act," to make an appropriation, and to declare an emergency.

**To the committee on Finance**

**H. B. No. 330 – Representative Lepore-Hagan**

To designate a bridge along State Route 46 in Mahoning County as the "Air Force 2nd Lt. William Vaughan Memorial Bridge."

**To the committee on Transportation and Public Safety**

**H. B. No. 331 – Representatives Smith, K., Blackshear**

To require certain law enforcement officers to wear a clearly visible badge and identification on their person while on duty.

**To the committee on State and Local Government**

**H. B. No. 332 – Representatives West, Denson**

To provide that qualified immunity does not apply in civil actions against peace officers employed by a political subdivision who, under color of law, subject any individual to a deprivation of rights and to provide for indemnification by the political subdivision of a peace officer against whom judgment is found.

**H. B. No. 333 – Representatives Miranda, White**

To require the Department of Education to make recommendations for a job description for school counselors and to designate at least one staff member as a school counselor liaison.

**To the committee on Primary and Secondary Education**

**H. B. No. 334 – Representatives Sobecki, Ingram**

Regarding school district board member compensation and ethics and open meetings training.

**To the committee on Primary and Secondary Education**

**H. B. No. 335 – Representative Schmidt**

To require the Ohio Ethics Commission to post certain financial disclosure statements online and to make an appropriation.

**To the committee on Government Oversight**

**H. B. No. 336 – Representatives Lipps, West**

To impose requirements relating to health plan issuers, Medicaid, pharmacies, and cancer drugs.

**H. B. No. 337 – Representatives Riedel, Plummer**

To provide a one-time bonus award to eligible first responders and to make an appropriation.

**To the committee on Finance**

**H. B. No. 338 – Representative Hoops**

To make changes to the laws related to the motorcycle safety and education program.

**To the committee on Transportation and Public Safety**

**H. B. No. 339 – Representative Swearingen**

To expand the laws on wills, declarations or living wills, durable powers of attorney for health care, and transfer on death designation affidavits by providing for their execution electronically.

**H. B. No. 340 – Representatives Bird, Blackshear**

To designate September as "International Underground Railroad Month."

**To the committee on State and Local Government**

**H. B. No. 341 – Representatives Miller, A., Weinstein**

To create the Bureau of Hate Crimes in the Office of the Attorney General and to authorize the Attorney General to prosecute a hate crime.

**To the committee on Criminal Justice**

**H. B. No. 342 – Representative Blackshear**

To allow county recorders to record COVID-19 vaccination record cards.

**To the committee on State and Local Government**

**H. B. No. 343 – Representative White**

To make changes relative to the rights of crime victims.

**To the committee on Criminal Justice**

**S. B. No. 12 – Senator Brenner**

To create the "Little Brown Jug" license plate.

**To the committee on Transportation and Public Safety**

**Sub. S. B. No. 16 – Senator Schaffer**

Regarding assault or menacing committed or directed against, and targeting, an emergency service responder, family member, or co-worker, the offense of unlawfully impeding public passage of an emergency service responder, and the inclusion of Casino Control Commission gaming agents as peace officers under the standard definition of that term.

**Sub. S. B. No. 52 – Senators Reineke, McColley**

To permit a board of county commissioners to designate energy development districts and to permit a board of township trustees or a board of county commissioners to prevent power siting board certification of certain wind and solar facilities.

**To the committee on Public Utilities**

**S. B. No. 54 – Senator Gavarone**

To include within the offense of telecommunications fraud providing misleading or inaccurate caller identification information, allow the Attorney General to prosecute offenses of unauthorized use of property and telecommunications fraud, and prohibit any person, entity, or merchant from violating the federal Telemarketing and Consumer Fraud and Abuse Prevention Act.

**S. B. No. 56 – Senator Blessing**

To regulate the use of indemnity provisions in professional design contracts related to public improvements.

**To the committee on Civil Justice**

**Sub. S. B. No. 58 – Senators Antonio, Brenner**

To permit a resident of a long-term care facility to conduct electronic monitoring of the resident's room and to designate this act as Esther's Law.

**To the committee on Families, Aging, and Human Services**

**S. B. No. 83 – Senators Williams, Rulli**

To require the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency to conduct a study to determine where brownfield sites are located in this state and to make an appropriation.

**S. B. No. 102 – Senator Roegner**

To exempt homebrewers of beer or home fermenters of wine from specified liquor control laws.

**Sub. S. B. No. 105 – Senators Sykes, Schuring**

To require political subdivisions to recognize state certifications of minority business enterprises, women-owned business enterprises, and veteran-friendly business enterprises.
