Duration of emergency rules	
Reduces the current duration of most emergency administrative rules from 120 days to 10 days (<i>R.C. 111.15(B) and 119.03(G)</i>).	Reduces the current rule duration to 30 days (<i>R.C. 111.15(B) and 119.03(G)</i>).
Extending an emergency rule	
No provision.	Allows an emergency rule to be extended for up to an additional 65 days if the adopting agency requests an extension and a majority of the members of the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review (JCARR) vote to approve the extension. Specifies that if JCARR does not vote on a request to extend a rule it is as though JCARR voted not to extend the rule. (<i>R.C. 106.07(A)(2) and (C)</i> .)
Invalidating an emergency rule	
No provision.	Permits JCARR, by a majority vote, to recommend the adoption of a concurrent resolution invalidating the emergency rule before it expires. Permits the House of Representatives and Senate to adopt a concurrent invalidating resolution any

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	<p>time before the emergency rule expires.</p> <p>Prohibits an agency from using the emergency rule adoption procedures to readopt an invalidated rule, the substance of the rule, or a restriction in the rule. <i>(R.C. 106.07(A)(1) and (B).)</i></p>
Review by Common Sense Initiative Office	
<p>Requires an adopting agency to electronically file the final version of an emergency rule with the Common Sense Initiative Office (CSIO) <i>(R.C. 111.15(B) and 119.03(G)).</i></p> <p>Requires CSIO to determine whether the rule has an adverse impact on business; and, if so, permits CSIO to make recommendations to the agency on how to eliminate or reduce the impact. Specifies that the evaluation does not prevent the emergency rule from taking effect. <i>(R.C. 107.54.)</i></p> <p>Requires CSIO to include the number of emergency rules it reviewed and a description of its recommendations in the annual report that CSIO prepares for specified officials <i>(R.C. 107.55).</i></p>	<p>No provision.</p>
