Previous Version (As Passed by the House)	Latest Version (I_134_0355-6)
Application	
Applies from the effective date of the bill through December 31, 2021, or the end of the COVID-19 state of emergency declared by the Governor, whichever is sooner (Governor DeWine terminated the state of emergency on June 18, 2021). <i>(Section 3.)</i>	Applies during an epidemic, pandemic, or other state of emergency. <i>(R.C. 3721.20(B), (D), and (F).)</i>
Declares the bill to be an emergency measure to provide relief for long-term care facility residents in need of compassionate care visits, thereby making it go into immediate effect. <i>(Section 4.)</i>	No provision.
Impact of COVID-19 restrictions	
Exempts compassionate care visits and entry by direct care providers from COVID-19 severity restrictions. <i>(Section 1(E).)</i>	No provision.

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Transmission-based precautions	
<p>Defines “transmission-based precautions” as, “precautions that are used when the route of infection transmission is not completely interrupted using standard precautions alone.” <i>(Section 1(A)(3).)</i></p> <p>Specifies that compassionate care situations include, among other circumstances, when a resident is in transmission-based precautions for COVID-19. <i>(Section 1(B)(1)(f).)</i></p>	<p>Same, and clarifies that transmission-based precautions are precautions used in addition to standard precautions. <i>(R.C. 3721.20(A)(3).)</i></p> <p>Instead, specifies that compassionate care situations include when a resident is in transmission-based precautions for a disease or illness, in addition to other circumstances that are consistent between the bills. <i>(R.C. 3721.20(B)(1)(f).)</i></p>
Screening	
<p>Requires all compassionate caregivers and health workers to undergo screening for COVID-19 symptoms before entering a long-term care facility. Symptoms that caregivers and workers must be screened for include cough, shortness of breath, and temperature over 100° Fahrenheit. <i>(Section 1(C)(2)(a).)</i></p>	<p>Instead, requires all compassionate caregivers and health workers to undergo screening to ascertain exposure to a contagious disease or illness and to disclose any symptoms before entering a long-term care facility. The facility determines the necessary extent of screening. <i>(R.C. 3721.20(C)(2)(a).)</i></p>
Visitation policy	
<p>Requires each long-term care facility to develop and implement a visitation policy regulating visits by compassionate caregivers. Among other requirements, the policy must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Require screening of compassionate caregivers for COVID-19 symptoms in the same manner as facility staff; ▪ Designate a single point of entry for compassionate caregivers to sign in and be screened for COVID-19 symptoms; ▪ Require communication of the COVID-19 testing policy to compassionate caregivers; 	<p>Instead of these requirements, and in addition to requirements that are consistent between the bills, the visitation policy must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Require compassionate caregivers to comply with the disease or illness screening policy developed by the facility; ▪ No provision; ▪ Require communication of the visitation policy to compassionate caregivers;

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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Permit evening and weekend visits to accommodate a compassionate caregiver's schedule; ▪ No provision; ▪ Require compassionate caregivers to do all of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▫ Sign in upon arrival at the facility's single entry point and be screened for COVID-19 symptoms; ▫ Provide the facility with valid federal or state identification, a current phone number, and a current address; ▫ Wear all necessary personal protection equipment. This includes, at minimum, a facial covering; ▫ Perform frequent hand hygiene; ▫ Maintain social distancing of at least six feet with other residents and staff; ▫ Conduct compassionate care visits using social distancing protocols, or following other appropriate infection prevention guidelines regarding personal contact; ▫ Inform the facility if the caregiver develops COVID-19 symptoms within 14 days of a visit with the resident; ▫ Schedule compassionate care visits in advance; ▫ Not conduct compassionate care visits in a resident's room if the resident shares a room. <p><i>(Section 1(D).)</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Permit visitation at any time to accommodate a compassionate caregiver's schedule; ▪ Specify whether compassionate caregivers must schedule compassionate care visits, other than end-of-life visits, with the facility in advance; ▪ No provision. <p><i>(R.C. 3721.20(D).)</i></p>

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Requires each long-term care facility to develop and implement the visitation policy within two weeks of the effective date of the bill. <i>(Section 1(D).)</i>	Requires each long-term care facility to develop and implement the visitation policy within 30 days of the effective date of the bill. <i>(R.C. 3721.20(D).)</i>
