Dear Chairman Huffman,

I write today to offer my support for Senate Bill 55, which I believe would greatly assist the ongoing battle against human trafficking happening across Ohio.

A loophole exists in current Ohio law that allows some massage operators to conduct business without licensed employees based solely on how the services are described. If an individual performs a massage for a medical or therapeutic purpose, they are considered massage therapists and training and a state-issued license is required. If the same individual performs a similar massage for relaxation or a non-therapeutic purpose, no training or licensure is required.

It is these so called “relaxation massage parlors” that are often used by human trafficking rings where women are made to provide sex under the guise of massage. In 2019, nearly two dozen such operations in Ohio were investigated or closed down entirely. In Northeast Ohio, 13 massage parlors across 7 counties were raided as part of a coordinated investigation by law enforcement. Several members of the human trafficking ring were brought up on charges by a grand jury as a result of these raids.

The passage of Senate Bill 55 will not only create uniform regulatory standards for massage, it will also make it more difficult for these businesses to be used to promote prostitution and human trafficking. Employees will be required to be trained and licensed, and state inspectors will have better access to these facilities to check not only for public health concerns, but also for potential illicit activity.

My hope is that this legislation will help shine a light in a dark place, and put an end to this line of business as a possible front for promoting human trafficking.

I applaud Senator Brenner for his leadership on this important and timely issue. I would be happy to discuss this bill with you and members of your committee at your convenience.
