Honorable Chairman Brenner, Vice-chair Blessing, Ranking member Fedor, and members of the Senate Primary and Secondary Education Committee,


As a constituent and concerned citizen, I am writing to urge you to support Senate Bill 1 regarding financial literacy in public schools across Ohio.

Wisely earning and spending money often determines one's success or failure in life. And yet, for some inexplicable reason, many public schools in Ohio do not have mandatory, stand-alone courses in financial literacy for their students.

It doesn't make sense to wait until people's credit scores are damaged, until they have less than \$50,000 saved for retirement at age 50, or until they get trapped in cycles of predatory loans to finally teach them about financial literacy when this can easily be done in high school. The costs and damage to society are far too great. Prevention is always better than cure.

In conclusion, I strongly urge you to pass Senate Bill 1 that would require at least one-half unit of instruction in the study of financial literacy.
