BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3717.60 of the Revised Code be	7

Sec. 3717.60. (A) A food service operation that donates to	9			
an agency perishable food that is fit for human consumption at	10			
the time of donation may submit an application for a rebate from				
the director of health on a form prescribed by the director in				
rules adopted under this section.				
(B) The director shall approve or deny an application	14			
submitted under division (A) of this section. If the director				
approves an application, the director shall do both of the	16			
following:	17			

(1) Issue the rebate not later than ninety days after	18		
approval of the application;	19		
(2) Issue the rebate in an amount equal to ten cents for	20		
each pound of perishable food that is donated to an agency.	21		
(C) The director shall adopt rules in accordance with	22 23

OHIO FOOD WASTE REDUCTION REBATE PROGRAM

The foregoing appropriation item 440XXX, Ohio Food Waste Reduction Rebate Program, shall be used by the Department of Health to administer the Ohio Food Waste Reduction Rebate Program in accordance to section 3717.60 of the Revised Code.

Section 3. Within the limits set forth in this act, the 61 Director of Budget and Management shall establish accounts 62 indicating the source and amount of funds for each appropriation 63 made in this act, and shall determine the form and manner in 64 which appropriation accounts shall be maintained. Expenditures 65 from appropriations contained in this act shall be accounted for 66 as though made in the main operating appropriations act of the 67 131st General Assembly. 68
