### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

(A) The board of education of each city, exempted village, 1	0

(2) Geography, the history of the United States and of	19

ethnic and racial groups in Ohio and the United States;	24

(4) Natural science, including instruction in the	26

(5) Health education, which shall include instruction in:	28
(a) The nutritive value of foods, including natural and	29
organically produced foods, the relation of nutrition to health,	30
and the use and effects of food additives;	31
(b) The harmful effects of and legal restrictions against	32
the use of drugs of abuse, alcoholic beverages, and tobacco;	33
(c) Venereal disease education, except that upon written	34
request of the student's parent or guardian, a student shall be	35
excused from taking instruction in venereal disease education;	36
(d) In grades kindergarten through six, instruction in	37
personal safety and assault prevention, except that upon written	38
request of the student's parent or guardian, a student shall be	39
excused from taking instruction in personal safety and assault	40
prevention;	41
(e) In grades seven through twelve, age-appropriate	42
instruction in dating violence prevention education, which shall	43
include instruction in recognizing dating violence warning signs	44
and characteristics of healthy relationships.	45

In order to assist school districts in developing a dating	46
violence prevention education curriculum, the department of	47
education shall provide on its web site links to free curricula	48
addressing dating violence prevention.	49
If the parent or legal guardian of a student less than	50
eighteen years of age submits to the principal of the student's	51
school a written request to examine the dating violence	52
prevention instruction materials used at that school, the	53
principal, within a reasonable period of time after the request	54

(9) Handwriting instruction in kindergarten through fifth	68
grade to ensure that students develop the ability to print	69
letters and words legibly by third grade and to create readable	70
documents using legible cursive handwriting by the end of fifth	71

(B) Except as provided in division (E) of this section,	73
every school or school district shall include in the	74

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requirements for promotion from the eighth grade to the ninth grade one year's course of study of American history. A board may waive this requirement for academically accelerated students who, in accordance with procedures adopted by the board, are able to demonstrate mastery of essential concepts and skills of the eighth grade American history course of study.

- (C) As specified in divisions (B)(6) and (C)(6) of section 3313.603 of the Revised Code, except as provided in division (E) of this section, every high school shall include in the requirements for graduation from any curriculum one-half unit each of American history and government.
- (D) Except as provided in division (E) of this section, basic instruction or demonstrated mastery in geography, United States history, the government of the United States, the government of the state of Ohio, local government in Ohio, the Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution, and the Constitution of the state of Ohio shall be required before pupils may participate in courses involving the study of social problems, economics, foreign affairs, United Nations, world government, socialism, and communism.
- (E) For each cooperative education school district established pursuant to section 3311.521 of the Revised Code and each city, exempted village, and local school district that has territory within such a cooperative district, the curriculum adopted pursuant to divisions (A) to (D) of this section shall only include the study of the subjects that apply to the grades operated by each such school district. The curriculums for such schools, when combined, shall provide to each student of these districts all of the subjects required under divisions (A) to (D) of this section.

(G) Upon the request of any parent or legal guardian of a	110
student, the board of education of any school district shall	111

(1) Any survey or questionnaire, prior to its	114

(2) Any textbook, workbook, software, video, or other	116
instructional materials being used by the district in connection	117

(4) Copies of the statewide academic standards and each	121
model curriculum developed pursuant to section 3301.079 of the	122

Section 2. That existing section 3313.60 of the Revised	125
Code is hereby repealed.	126
Section 3. The Department of Education shall assist school	127
districts in identifying the most appropriate means for	128
integrating the requirements of division (A)(9) of section	129
3313.60, as amended by this act, into the existing curriculum	130
and in identifying instructional materials to meet those	131
