BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) The Chancellor of Higher Education shall	8
create the SmartOhio Financial Literacy Pilot Program at the	9
University of Cincinnati to operate for the 2016-2017 school	10
year. Under the pilot program, the Chancellor shall provide	11
funding, as appropriated by the General Assembly for this	12
purpose, for the development and implementation of regional	13
financial education programs with the goal of increasing	14

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financial literacy for students in grades kindergarten through	15
eight.	16
(B) The regional financial education programs shall be	17
operated by the University of Cincinnati and delivered through a	18
joint partnership between the Ohio Council on Economic Education	19
and OSU Extension.	20
The partnership shall do both of the following with regard	21
to the programs:	22
(1) Develop curricula and instructional materials that do	23
all of the following:	24
(a) Provide age-appropriate education to students in	25
grades kindergarten through eight to promote financial literacy	26
at an early age;	27
(b) Enable students to develop the skills necessary to	28
develop and maintain a budget, understand credit and	29
investments, and use the banking system;	30
(c) Integrate financial literacy education into the	31
existing curriculum on mathematics and English language arts.	32
(2) Provide teacher training and professional development	33
opportunities on these curricula and instructional materials to	34
enable teachers across the state to provide financial literacy	35
education to students in grades kindergarten through eight.	36
