BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3332.031 be amended and section	5
3333.0414 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	6

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faculty and instructional staff in all instructional programs at	74

study portion of any degree program, unless the person holds a	80

(Q) Adopt a rule prohibiting a school or branch campus	105
thereof from claiming accreditation from an accrediting agency	106

United States department of education.	
(R) Annually post on its web site the career placement	110
rates for each school disaggregated by program. The information	
shall be presented in such a way that data can be searched by	
school, degree or certificate type, and program.	113

post on the department of higher education's web site a link to	115
the information provided by the state board of career colleges	
and schools under division (R) of section 3332.031 of the	117
Revised Code.
