## A BILL

То	amend sections 3301.53, 3313.67, 3313.671, and	1
	3328.24 and to enact section 3701.138 of the	2
	Revised Code to make changes to the law	3
	governing immunizations for pupils	4

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That sections 3301.53, 3313.67, 3313.671, and	5
3328.24 be amended and section 3701.138 of the Revised Code be	6
enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 3301.53. (A) The state board of education, in	8
consultation with the director of job and family services, shall	9
formulate and prescribe by rule adopted under Chapter 119. of	10
the Revised Code minimum standards to be applied to preschool	11
programs operated by school district boards of education, county	12
DD boards, community schools, or eligible nonpublic schools. The	13
rules shall include the following:	14
(1) Standards ensuring that the preschool program is	15
located in a safe and convenient facility that accommodates the	16
enrollment of the program, is of the quality to support the	17
growth and development of the children according to the program	18

objectives, and meets the requirements of section 3301.55 of the	19
Revised Code;	20
(2) Standards ensuring that supervision, discipline, and	21
programs will be administered according to established	22
objectives and procedures;	23
(3) Standards ensuring that preschool staff members and	24
nonteaching employees are recruited, employed, assigned,	25
evaluated, and provided inservice education without	26
discrimination on the basis of age, color, national origin,	27
race, or sex; and that preschool staff members and nonteaching	28
employees are assigned responsibilities in accordance with	29
written position descriptions commensurate with their training	30
and experience;	31
(4) A requirement that boards of education intending to	32
establish a preschool program demonstrate a need for a preschool	33
program prior to establishing the program;	34
(5) Requirements that children participating in preschool	35
programs have been immunized to the extent considered	36
appropriate by the state board to prevent the spread of	37
communicable disease and that each entity operating a preschool	38
program keeps an immunization record for each child	39
participating in the program that complies with the requirements	40
of division (C) of section 3313.67 of the Revised Code and	41
reports a summary of those immunization records that complies	42
with the requirements of division (D)(1) of that section;	43
(6) Requirements that the parents of preschool children	44
complete the emergency medical authorization form specified in	45
section 3313.712 of the Revised Code.	46
(B) The state board of education in consultation with the	47

director of job and family services shall ensure that the rules	48
adopted by the state board under sections 3301.52 to 3301.58 of	49
the Revised Code are consistent with and meet or exceed the	50
requirements of Chapter 5104. of the Revised Code with regard to	51
child day-care centers. The state board and the director of job	52
and family services shall review all such rules at least once	53
every five years.	54
(C) The state board of education, in consultation with the	55
director of job and family services, shall adopt rules for	56
school child programs that are consistent with and meet or	57
exceed the requirements of the rules adopted for school-age	58
child care centers under Chapter 5104. of the Revised Code.	59
Sec. 3313.67. (A) (1) Except as provided in division (A) (2)	60
of this section, the board of education of each city, exempted	61
village, or local school district may make and enforce such	62
rules to secure the immunization of, and to prevent the spread	63
of communicable diseases among the pupils attending or eligible	64
to attend the schools of the district, as in its opinion the	65
safety and interest of the public require.	66
(2) A board of education shall not adopt rules under	67
division (A)(1) of this section that are inconsistent with	68
divisions (B) and (C) of section 3313.671 of the Revised Code.	69
(B) Boards of health, legislative authorities of municipal	70
corporations, and boards of township trustees, on application of	71
the board of education of the district, at the public expense,	72
without delay, shall provide the means of immunization to pupils	73
who are not so provided by their parents or guardians.	74
(C) The board of education shall keep an immunization	75

record for each pupil, available in writing to the pupil's

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caretaker parent or guardian as defined in section 3313.671 of	77
the Revised Code upon request, which shall include:	78
(1) Immunizations against the diseases mentioned specified	79
in division (A) of section 3313.671 of the Revised Code;	80
(2) Any tuberculin tests given pursuant to section 3313.71	81
of the Revised Code;	82
(3) Any other immunizations required by the board pursuant	83
to division (A) of this section.	84
(D) $\underline{(1)}$ Annually by the fifteenth day of October, the board	85
shall report a summary, by school, of the immunization records	86
of all initial entry pupils enrolled in the district to the	87
director of health, on forms prescribed by the director in	88
consultation with the department of education. The summary shall	89
<pre>include the following:</pre>	90
(a) By disease, the number of pupils who have been	91
<pre>immunized against the disease;</pre>	92
(b) By disease, the number of pupils and the percentage of	93
pupils who have not been immunized against the disease on each	94
of the following grounds:	95
(i) Religious convictions;	96
(ii) Medical contraindications.	97
(2) Annually by the first of December, the department of	98
health shall publish on the department's web site, by school and	99
school district, the information reported pursuant to division	100
(D) (1) of this section and division (A) (5) of section 3301.53 of	101
the Revised Code. The department shall not publish any	102
information that could be used to identify a pupil.	103

(3) The department of education shall post a link on its	104
web site to the information published by the department of	105
health under division (D)(2) of this section.	106
Sec. 3313.671. (A) As used in this section:	107
(1) "Caretaker parent" has the same meaning as in section	108
5104.01 of the Revised Code;	109
(2) "Chicken pox epidemic" means the occurrence of cases	110
of chicken pox in numbers greater than expected in the school's	111
population or for a particular period of time;	112
(3) "Immunization form" means the form developed by the	113
department of health pursuant to section 3701.138 of the Revised	114
Code;	115
(4) "Immunized" means having received an immunization by a	116
method approved by the department of health pursuant to section	117
3701.13 of the Revised Code;	118
(5) "In the process of being immunized" has the same	119
meaning as in section 5104.014 of the Revised Code;	120
(6) "School" means an elementary or high school for which	121
the state board of education prescribes minimum standards	122
pursuant to division (D) of section 3301.07 of the Revised Code.	123
(B)(1) Except as otherwise provided in division $\frac{(B)}{(C)}$ of	124
this section, no pupil, at the time of initial entry or at the	125
beginning of each school year, to an elementary or high school-	126
for which the state board of education prescribes minimum-	127
standards pursuant to division (D) of section 3301.07 of the	128
Revised Code, who begins kindergarten, seventh grade, or	129
eleventh grade shall be permitted to remain in school for more	130
than fourteen days unless the pupil presents written evidence	131

satisfactory pupil's caretaker parent provides to the person in	132
charge of admission, an immunization form indicating that the	133
pupil has been immunized by a method of immunization approved by	134
the department of health pursuant to section 3701.13 of the	135
Revised Code against or is in the process of being immunized	136
against mumps, poliomyelitis, diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus,	137
rubeola, and rubella or is in the process of being immunized.	138
(2) Except as provided in division $\frac{(B)}{(C)}$ of this	139
section, no pupil who begins kindergarten at an elementary	140
school subject to the state board of education's minimum	141
standards , seventh grade, or eleventh grade shall be permitted	142
to remain in school for more than fourteen days unless the <del>pupil</del>	143
presents written evidence satisfactory pupil's caretaker parent	144
provides to the person in charge of admission an immunization	145
form indicating that the pupil has been immunized by a	146
department of health approved method of immunization against or	147
is in the process of being immunized against both of the	148
following:	149
(a) During or after the school year beginning in 1999,	150
hepatitis B;	151
(b) During or after the school year beginning in 2006,	152
chicken pox.	153
(3) Except as provided in division $\frac{(B)}{(C)}$ of this	154
section, during and after the school year beginning in 2016, no	155
pupil who is the age or older than the age at which immunization	156
against meningococcal disease is recommended by the state-	157
department of health shall be permitted to remain in $a-$ school	158
subject to the state board of education's minimum standards for	159
more than fourteen days unless the <del>pupil presents written</del>	160
evidence satisfactory nunil's caretaker parent provides to the	161

person in charge of admission an immunization form indicating	162
that the pupil has been immunized by a department of health-	163
approved method of immunization, against or is in the process of	164
being immunized $_{\overline{r}}$ against meningococcal disease.	165
(4) As used in divisions (A)(1), (2), and (3) of this	166
section, "in the process of being immunized" means the pupil has-	167
been immunized against mumps, rubeola, rubella, and chicken pox,	168
and if the pupil has not been immunized against poliomyelitis,	169
diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, hepatitis B, and meningococcal	170
disease, the pupil has received at least the first dose of the	171
immunization sequence, and presents written evidence to the	172
pupil's building principal or chief administrative officer of	173
each subsequent dose required to obtain immunization at the	174
intervals prescribed by the director of health. Any student-	175
<pre>pupil previously admitted under the "in process of being</pre>	176
immunized" provision and who has not complied with the	177
immunization intervals or catch-up schedule prescribed by the	178
director of health shall be excluded from school on the	179
fifteenth day of the following school year. Any student pupil so	180
excluded shall be readmitted upon showing evidence when the	181
pupil's caretaker parent provides to the student's pupil's	182
building principal or chief administrative officer of an	183
immunization form indicating progress on the director of	184
health's interval <u>or catch-up</u> schedule.	185
(B) (C) (1) A pupil who has had natural rubeola, and	186
presents a signed statement from the pupil's parent, guardian,	187
or physician to that effect, is not required to be immunized	188
against rubeola if the immunization form provided pursuant to	189
division (B) of this section indicates that the pupil has had	190
natural rubeola.	191

(2) A pupil who has had natural mumps, and presents a	192
signed statement from the pupil's parent, guardian, or physician	193
to that effect, is not required to be immunized against mumps if	194
the immunization form provided pursuant to division (B) of this	195
section indicates that the pupil has had natural mumps.	196
(3) A pupil who has had natural chicken pox, and presents	197
a signed statement from the pupil's parent, guardian, or	198
physician to that effect, is not required to be immunized	199
against chicken pox_if the immunization form provided pursuant_	200
to division (B) of this section indicates that the pupil has had	201
natural chicken pox.	202
(4) A pupil who presents a written statement of the	203
pupil's parent or guardian in which is not required to be	204
immunized against a disease specified in division (B) of this	205
section if the immunization form provided pursuant to division	206
(B) of this section indicates that the pupil's parent or	207
guardian declines declined to have the pupil immunized against	208
the disease for reasons of conscience, including religious	209
convictions, is not required to be immunized.	210
(5) A child whose physician certifies in writing pupil is	211
not required to be immunized against a disease specified in	212
division (B) of this section if the immunization form provided	213
pursuant to division (B) of this section indicates that such	214
immunization against <u>any the</u> disease is medically	215
contraindicated is not required to be immunized against that	216
<del>disease</del> .	217
(C) As used in this division, "chicken pox epidemic" means	218
the occurrence of cases of chicken pox in numbers greater than-	219
expected in the school's population or for a particular period-	220
of time.	221

(D) Notwithstanding division $(B)$ $(C)$ of this section, a	222
school may deny admission to a pupil otherwise exempted from the	223
chicken pox immunization requirement if the director of the	224
state department of health notifies the school's principal or	225
chief administrative officer that a chicken pox epidemic exists	226
in the school's population. The denial of admission shall cease	227
when the director notifies the principal or officer that the	228
epidemic no longer exists.	229
The board of education or governing body of each school	230
subject to this section shall adopt a policy that prescribes	231
methods whereby the academic standing of a pupil who is denied	232
admission during a chicken pox epidemic may be preserved.	233
(D) Boards of health, legislative authorities of	234
municipal corporations, and boards of township trustees on	235
application of the board of education of the district or proper	236
authority of any school affected by this section, shall provide	237
at the public expense, without delay, the means of immunization	238
against mumps, poliomyelitis, rubeola, rubella, diphtheria,	239
pertussis, tetanus, and hepatitis B to pupils who are not so	240
provided by their parents or guardians.	241
$\frac{(E)-(F)}{(F)}$ The department of health shall specify the age at	242
which immunization against meningococcal disease, as required by	243
division $\frac{A}{B}$ (3) of this section, is recommended, and approve	244
a method of immunization against meningococcal disease.	245
(G) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this	246
section, a pupil who has transferred from another state and does	247
not satisfy the requirements of division (B) of this section may	248
be permitted to remain in school if either of the following	249
<pre>conditions are satisfied:</pre>	250

(1) The pupil's caretaker parent provides evidence that an	251
appointment has been scheduled with a person who is authorized	252
under the Revised Code to provide the immunizations required	253
under division (B) of this section;	254
(2) The pupil's caretaker parent submits proof of	255
vaccination within fourteen days of the pupil's date of	256
<pre>enrollment.</pre>	257
Sec. 3328.24. A college-preparatory boarding school	258
established under this chapter and its board of trustees shall	259
comply with sections 102.02, 3301.0710, 3301.0711, 3301.0712,	260
3301.0714, 3301.948, 3313.536, 3313.6013, 3313.6411, <u>3313.67</u> ,	261
3313.671, 3313.7112, 3313.721, 3313.89, 3319.39, 3319.391, and	262
3319.46 and Chapter 3365. of the Revised Code as if the school	263
were a school district and the school's board of trustees were a	264
district board of education.	265
Sec. 3701.138. (A) The department of health shall develop	266
and publish on its web site an immunization form to be used by a	267
physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered	268
nurse when documenting a child's immunization history. During	269
and after the school year beginning in 2016, the form shall be	270
used to satisfy the requirements of section 3313.671 of the	271
Revised Code.	272
(B) The immunization form shall include all of the	273
<pre>following:</pre>	274
(1) A component whereby a physician, physician assistant,	275
or advanced practice registered nurse may record the dates that	276
a child received doses of immunizations against each of the	277
diseases specified in section 3313.671 of the Revised Code and	278
any other diseases against which the director of health	279

recommends immunization;	280
(2) A component whereby a physician, physician assistant,	281
or advanced practice registered nurse may indicate whether a	282
child is subject to any of the exceptions specified in section	283
3313.671 of the Revised Code;	284
(3) A component whereby the child's caretaker parent may	285
indicate that the child's parent or guardian has declined for	286
religious convictions to have the child immunized against one or	287
more diseases specified in section 3313.671 of the Revised Code;	288
(4) A component whereby a child's parent or guardian may	289
indicate that the parent or guardian understands that, by	290
declining to have the child immunized, the child may be denied	291
admission to school during an epidemic or outbreak;	292
(5) A component whereby a pharmacist or pharmacy intern	293
may record the date that the pharmacist or pharmacy intern	294
administered an immunization in accordance with section 4729.41	295
of the Revised Code.	296
(C)(1) Each immunization form shall be signed by the	297
physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered	298
nurse responsible for administering immunizations to the child.	299
(2) An immunization form shall be signed by the child's	300
caretaker parent if the child's parent or guardian declines for	301
religious convictions to have the child immunized against one or	302
more diseases specified in section 3313.671 of the Revised Code.	303
(D)(1) If a child's parent or guardian declines for	304
religious convictions to have the child immunized against one or	305
more diseases specified in section 3313.671 of the Revised Code,	306
the physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice	307
registered nurse responsible for administering immunizations to	308

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the child shall inform the caretaker parent of all of the	
<pre>following:</pre>	
(a) The risks and benefits of immunization;	
(b) The health risks presented to the child and community	
by the one or more diseases.	
(2) The signature of the physician, physician assistant,	
or advanced practice registered nurse on the immunization form	
indicates that the information described in division (D)(1) of	
this section was provided to the child's caretaker parent. It	
does not constitute a determination that a pupil is exempt from	
immunization pursuant to division (C)(4) of section 3313.671 of	
the Revised Code.	
Section 2. That existing sections 3301.53, 3313.67,	
3313.671, and 3328.24 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.
