A BILL

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3313.60 and 3319.073 be amended	7
and sections 3314.031 and 3326.091 of the Revised Code be	8
enacted to read as follows:	9
Sec. 3313.60. Notwithstanding division (D) of section	10
3311.52 of the Revised Code, divisions (A) to (E) of this	11
section do not apply to any cooperative education school	12
district established pursuant to divisions (A) to (C) of section	13
3311.52 of the Revised Code.	14
(A) The board of education of each city, exempted village,	15
and local school district and the board of each cooperative	16

education school district established, pursuant to section	17
3311.521 of the Revised Code, shall prescribe a curriculum for	18
all schools under its control. Except as provided in division	19
(E) of this section, in any such curriculum there shall be	20
included the study of the following subjects:	21
(1) The language arts, including reading, writing,	22
spelling, oral and written English, and literature;	23
(2) Geography, the history of the United States and of	24
Ohio, and national, state, and local government in the United	25
States, including a balanced presentation of the relevant	26
contributions to society of men and women of African, Mexican,	27
Puerto Rican, and American Indian descent as well as other	28
ethnic and racial groups in Ohio and the United States;	29
(3) Mathematics;	30
(4) Natural science, including instruction in the	31
conservation of natural resources;	32
(5) Health education, which shall include instruction in:	33
(a) The nutritive value of foods, including natural and	34
organically produced foods, the relation of nutrition to health,	35
and the use and effects of food additives;	36
(b) The harmful effects of and legal restrictions against	37
the use of drugs of abuse, alcoholic beverages, and tobacco;	38
(c) Venereal disease education, except that upon written	39
request of the student's parent or guardian, a student shall be	40
excused from taking instruction in venereal disease education;	41
(d) In grades kindergarten through six, annual age-	42
appropriate instruction in child sexual abuse prevention,	43
including information on available counseling and resources for	44

(e) In grades kindergarten through six, instruction in	46
personal safety and assault prevention, except that upon written	47
request of the student's parent or guardian, a student shall be	48
excused from taking instruction in personal safety and assault	49

(e) (f) In grades seven through twelve, age-appropriate	51
instruction in dating violence prevention education and sexual	52
violence prevention education, which shall include instruction	53
in recognizing dating violence warning signs and characteristics	54
of healthy relationships.	55
In order to assist school districts in developing a dating	56
violence prevention education and sexual violence prevention	57
<pre>education curriculum, the department of education shall provide</pre>	58
on its web site links to free curricula addressing dating	59
violence prevention and sexual violence prevention.	60
If the parent or legal guardian of a student less than	61
eighteen years of age submits to the principal of the student's	62
school a written request to examine the dating violence	63
prevention and sexual violence prevention instruction materials	64
used at that school, the principal, within a reasonable period	65
of time after the request is made, shall allow the parent or	66
guardian to examine those materials at that school.	67

(7) The fine arts, including music;	69
(8) First aid, including a training program in	70

except that upon written request of the student's parent or	72

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cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

- (B) Except as provided in division (E) of this section, 75 every school or school district shall include in the 76 requirements for promotion from the eighth grade to the ninth 77 grade one year's course of study of American history. A board 78 may waive this requirement for academically accelerated students 79 who, in accordance with procedures adopted by the board, are 80 able to demonstrate mastery of essential concepts and skills of 81 the eighth grade American history course of study. 82
- (C) As specified in divisions (B)(6) and (C)(6) of section 3313.603 of the Revised Code, except as provided in division (E) of this section, every high school shall include in the requirements for graduation from any curriculum one-half unit each of American history and government.
- (D) Except as provided in division (E) of this section, 88 basic instruction or demonstrated mastery in geography, United 89 States history, the government of the United States, the 90 government of the state of Ohio, local government in Ohio, the 91 Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution, and 92 the Constitution of the state of Ohio shall be required before 93 pupils may participate in courses involving the study of social 94 problems, economics, foreign affairs, United Nations, world 95 96 government, socialism, and communism.
- (E) For each cooperative education school district established pursuant to section 3311.521 of the Revised Code and each city, exempted village, and local school district that has territory within such a cooperative district, the curriculum adopted pursuant to divisions (A) to (D) of this section shall only include the study of the subjects that apply to the grades operated by each such school district. The curriculums for such

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schools, when combined, shall provide to each student of these	104

(F) The board of education of any cooperative education	107
school district established pursuant to divisions (A) to (C) of	108
section 3311.52 of the Revised Code shall prescribe a curriculum	109

(G) Upon the request of any parent or legal guardian of a	112
student, the board of education of any school district shall	113

Sec. 3319.073. (A) The board of education of each city and	145
exempted village school district and the governing board of each	146
educational service center shall adopt or adapt the curriculum	147
developed by the department of education for, or shall develop	148
in consultation with public or private agencies or persons	149
involved in child abuse prevention or intervention programs, a	150
program of in-service training in the prevention of child abuse,	151
violence, and substance abuse and the promotion of positive	152
youth development. Each person employed by any school district	153
or service center to work in a school as a nurse, teacher,	154
counselor, school psychologist, or administrator shall complete	155
at least four hours of the in-service training within two years	156
of commencing employment with the district or center, and every	157
five years thereafter. A person who is employed by any school	158
district or service center to work in an elementary school as a	159
nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or administrator	160
on March 30, 2007, shall complete at least four hours of the in-	161
service training not later than March 30, 2009, and every five	162

years thereafter. A person who is employed by any school

district or service center to work in a middle or high school as	164
a nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or	165
administrator on October 16, 2009, shall complete at least four	166
hours of the in-service training not later than October 16,	167
2011, and every five years thereafter.	168

- (B) Each board shall incorporate training in school safety and violence prevention, including human trafficking content, into the in-service training required by division (A) of this section. For this purpose, the board shall adopt or adapt the curriculum developed by the department or shall develop its own curriculum in consultation with public or private agencies or persons involved in school safety and violence prevention programs.
- (C) Each board shall incorporate training on the board's harassment, intimidation, or bullying policy adopted under section 3313.666 of the Revised Code into the in-service training required by division (A) of this section. Each board also shall incorporate training in the prevention of dating violence into the in-service training required by that division for middle and high school employees. The board shall develop its own curricula for these purposes.
- (D) Each board shall incorporate training in youth suicide awareness and prevention into the in-service training required by division (A) of this section for each person employed by a school district or service center to work in a school as a nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or administrator, and any other personnel that the board determines appropriate. For this purpose, the board shall adopt or adapt the curriculum developed by the department or shall develop its own curriculum in consultation with public or private agencies
