BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4723.07, 4723.48, and 4731.72 be	9
amended and section 4723.489 of the Revised Code be enacted to	10
read as follows:	11
Sec. 4723.07. In accordance with Chapter 119. of the	12
Revised Code, the board of nursing shall adopt and may amend and	13
rescind rules that establish all of the following:	14
(A) Provisions for the board's government and control of	15
its actions and business affairs;	16
(B) Minimum standards for nursing education programs that	17
prepare graduates to be licensed under this chapter and	18
procedures for granting, renewing, and withdrawing approval of	19

those programs;	20
(C) Criteria that applicants for licensure must meet to be	21
eligible to take examinations for licensure;	22
(D) Standards and procedures for renewal of the licenses	23
and certificates issued by the board;	24
(E) Standards for approval of continuing nursing education	25
programs and courses for registered nurses, licensed practical	26
nurses, certified registered nurse anesthetists, clinical nurse	27
specialists, certified nurse-midwives, and certified nurse	28
practitioners. The standards may provide for approval of	29
continuing nursing education programs and courses that have been	30
approved by other state boards of nursing or by national	31
accreditation systems for nursing, including, but not limited	32
to, the American nurses' credentialing center and the national	33
association for practical nurse education and service.	34
(F) Standards that persons must meet to be authorized by	35

applicant shall be issued as an externship certificate. Under an

externship certificate, the nurse may obtain experience in 106 prescribing drugs and therapeutic devices by participating in an 107 externship that evaluates the nurse's competence, knowledge, and 108 skill in pharmacokinetic principles and their clinical 109 application to the specialty being practiced. During the 110 externship, the nurse may prescribe drugs and therapeutic 111 devices only when one or more physicians are providing 112 supervision in accordance with rules adopted under section 113 4723.50 of the Revised Code. 114

After completing the externship, the holder of an115externship certificate may apply for a new certificate to116prescribe. On receipt of the new certificate, the nurse may117prescribe drugs and therapeutic devices in collaboration with118one or more physicians or podiatrists.119

(B) In the case of an applicant who meets the requirements 120 of division (C) of section 4723.482 of the Revised Code, the 121 initial certificate to prescribe that the board issues to the 122 applicant under this section shall not be an externship 123 certificate. The applicant shall be issued a certificate to 124 prescribe that permits the recipient to prescribe drugs and 125 therapeutic devices in collaboration with one or more physicians 126 127 or podiatrists.

(C) (1) The holder of a certificate issued under this 128 section may delegate to a person not otherwise authorized to 129 administer drugs the authority to administer a drug, other than 130 a controlled substance, listed in the formulary established 131 under division (B)(1) of section 4723.50 of the Revised Code to 132 a specified patient. The delegation shall be in accordance with 133 division (C)(2) of this section and standards and procedures 1.34 established in rules adopted under division (Q) of section 135

4723.07 of the Revised Code.	136

(a) Assess the patient and determine that the drug is	139

Sec. 4723.489. A person not otherwise authorized to	144
administer drugs may administer a drug to a specified patient if	145
all of the following conditions are met:	146
(A) The authority to administer the drug is delegated to	147
the person by an advanced practice registered nurse who is a	148
clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, or certified	149
nurse practitioner and holds a certificate to prescribe issued	150
under section 4723.48 of the Revised Code.	151
(B) The drug is listed in the formulary established under	152
division (B) of section 4723.50 of the Revised Code but is not a	153
controlled substance and is not to be administered	154
intravenously.	155
(C) The drug is to be administered at a location other	156
than a hospital inpatient care unit, as defined in section	157
3727.50 of the Revised Code; a hospital emergency department or	158
a freestanding emergency department; or an ambulatory surgical	159
facility, as defined in section 3702.30 of the Revised Code.	160
(D) The person has successfully completed education based	161
on a recognized body of knowledge concerning drug administration	162
and demonstrates to the person's employer the knowledge, skills,	163

and ability to administer the drug safely.	164
(E) The person's employer has given the advanced practice	165
registered nurse access to documentation, in written or	166
electronic form, showing that the person has met the conditions	167
specified in division (D) of this section.	168
(F) The advanced practice registered nurse is physically	169
present at the location where the drug is administered.	170
Sec. 4731.72. (A) As used in this section:	171
(1) "Anatomic pathology services," "assignment of	172
benefits," "histologic processing," "insurer," "physician," and	173
"referring clinical laboratory" have the same meanings as in	174
section 3701.86 of the Revised Code.	175
(2) "Professional component of an anatomic pathology	176
service" means the entire anatomic pathology service other than	177
histologic processing.	178
(3) "Technical component of an anatomic pathology service"	179
means only histologic processing.	180
(B) No physician shall present or cause to be presented a	181
claim, bill, or demand for payment for anatomic pathology	182
services to any person or entity other than the following:	183
(1) The patient who receives the services or another	184
individual, such as a parent, spouse, or guardian, who is	185
responsible for the patient's bills;	186
(2) A responsible insurer or other third-party payor of a	187
patient who receives the services;	188
(3) A hospital, public health clinic, or not-for-profit	189
health clinic ordering the services;	190

(4) A referring clinical laboratory;	191
(5) A governmental agency or any person acting on behalf	192
of a governmental agency;	193
(6) A physician who is permitted to bill for the services	194
under division (D) of this section.	195
(C) Except as provided in division (D) of this section, no	196
physician shall charge, bill, or otherwise solicit payment,	197
directly or indirectly, for anatomic pathology services unless	198
the services are personally rendered by the physician or	199
rendered under the on-site supervision of the physician.	200
(D) (1) A physician who performs the professional component	201
of an anatomic pathology service on a patient specimen may bill	202
for the amount incurred in doing either of the following:	203
(a) <u>(</u>1) Having a clinical laboratory or another physician	204
perform the technical component of the anatomic pathology	205
service;	206
(b) (2) Obtaining another physician's consultation	207
regarding the patient specimen.	208
(2) A physician may bill for having a clinical laboratory	209
or another physician perform an anatomic pathology service on a	210
dermatology specimen, but only if the billing physician	211
discloses to the person or entity being billed both of the-	212
following:	213
(a) The name and address of the clinical laboratory or	214
physician who performed the service;	215
(b) The amount the billing physician was charged by or-	216
paid to the clinical laboratory or physician who performed the	217

(E) A violation of division (B) or (C) of this section	219
constitutes a reason for taking action under division (B)(20) of	220
section 4731.22 of the Revised Code.	221
(F) Nothing in this section shall be construed to mandate	222
the assignment of benefits for anatomic pathology services.	223
Section 2. That existing sections 4723.07, 4723.48, and	224
4731.72 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	225
