	personnel in public safety vehicles to report	3
	traffic law violations under certain	4
	circumstances.	_

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

<b>Section 1.</b> That section 4511.45 be amended and section	6
4511.454 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 4511.45. (A)(1) Upon the approach of a public safety	8
vehicle or coroner's vehicle, equipped with at least one	9
flashing, rotating or oscillating light visible under normal	10
atmospheric conditions from a distance of five hundred feet to	11
the front of the vehicle and the driver is giving an audible	12
signal by siren, exhaust whistle, or bell, no driver of any	13
other vehicle shall fail to yield the right-of-way, immediately	14
drive if practical to a position parallel to, and as close as	15
possible to, the right edge or curb of the highway clear of any	16
intersection, and stop and remain in that position until the	17
public safety vehicle or coroner's vehicle has passed, except	18
when otherwise directed by a police officer.	19

(2) Upon the approach of a public safety vehicle or	20
coroner's vehicle, as stated in division (A)(1) of this section,	21
no operator of any streetcar or trackless trolley shall fail to	22
immediately stop the streetcar or trackless trolley clear of any	23
intersection and keep it in that position until the public	24
safety vehicle or coroner's vehicle has passed, except when	25
otherwise directed by a police officer.	26
(B) This section does not relieve the driver of a public	27
safety vehicle or coroner's vehicle from the duty to drive with	28
due regard for the safety of all persons and property upon the	29
highway.	30
(C) This section applies to a coroner's vehicle only when	31
the vehicle is operated in accordance with section 4513.171 of	32
the Revised Code. As used in this section, "coroner's vehicle"	33
means a vehicle used by a coroner, deputy coroner, or coroner's	34
investigator that is equipped with a flashing, oscillating, or	35
rotating red or blue light and a siren, exhaust whistle, or bell	36
capable of giving an audible signal.	37
(D) Except as otherwise provided in this division or in	38
section 4511.454 of the Revised Code, whoever violates division	39
(A)(1) or (2) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the	40
fourth degree on a first offense. On a second offense within one	41
year after the first offense, the person is guilty of a	42
misdemeanor of the third degree, and, on each subsequent offense	43
within one year after the first offense, the person is guilty of	44
a misdemeanor of the second degree.	45
Sec. 4511.454. (A) When the failure of a motor vehicle	46
operator to yield the right-of-way to a public safety vehicle as	47
required by division (A) of section 4511.45 of the Revised Code	48
impedes the ability of the public safety vehicle to respond to	49

an emergency, any emergency personnel in the public safety	50
vehicle may report the license plate number and a general	51
description of the vehicle and the operator of the vehicle to	52
the law enforcement agency exercising jurisdiction over the area	53
where the alleged violation occurred. Any such emergency	54
personnel also may report any other apparent violation of the	55
traffic laws of this state occurring at the same time.	56
(B)(1) Upon receipt of a report under this section, the	57
law enforcement agency may conduct an investigation to attempt	58
to determine or confirm the identity of the operator of the	59
vehicle at the time of the alleged violation.	60
(2) If the identity of the operator at the time of an	61
alleged violation of division (A) of section 4511.45 of the	62
Revised Code is established, the law enforcement agency has	63
probable cause to issue a written warning for that violation and	64
shall issue the written warning to the operator. Upon issuing a	65
written warning under this division, the law enforcement agency	66
shall notify the registrar of motor vehicles that a written	67
warning has been issued under this division. The registrar shall	68
retain a record of the issuance of a written warning.	69
If the operator previously has been issued a written	70
warning under this section for a violation of division (A) of	71
section 4511.45 of the Revised Code, the law enforcement agency	72
has probable cause to issue a citation for the violation and	73
shall issue the citation to the operator.	74
(3) In the case of other reported apparent traffic law	75
violations or if the identity of the operator of the vehicle at	76
the time of the alleged violation cannot be established, the law	77
enforcement agency may issue a written warning to the person who	78
owned the vehicle at the time of the alleged violation. However,_	79

in the case of a leased or rented vehicle, the law enforcement	80	
agency shall issue the written warning to the person who leased	81	
or rented the vehicle at the time of the alleged violation.		
(C) Whoever violates division (A) of section 4511.45 of	83	
the Revised Code based on a report filed under this section is	84	
guilty of a minor misdemeanor and shall be fined one hundred	85	
fifty dollars if both of the following apply:	86	
(1) The person's identity was established by the law	87	
<pre>enforcement agency;</pre>	88	
(2) The person previously has been issued a written	89	
warning under division (B)(2) of this section.		
(D) As used in this section:	91	
(1) "License plate" includes any temporary license placard	92	
issued under section 4503.182 of the Revised Code or similar law		
of another jurisdiction.		
(2) "Public safety vehicle" does not include a vehicle	95	
used by a public law enforcement officer or other person sworn	96	
to enforce the criminal and traffic laws of the state or a	97	
vehicle used by the motor carrier enforcement unit for the	98	
enforcement of orders and rules of the public utilities		
commission.		
Section 2. That existing section 4511.45 of the Revised	101	
Code is hereby repealed.	102
