### A BILL

То	amend sections 4507.50 and 4507.52 of the	1
	Revised Code to provide that any nondriver	2
	identification card that is issued to a person	3
	who is 80 years of age or older be issued	4
	without payment of any fee of any kind and have	5
	no expiration date.	6

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4507.50 and 4507.52 of the	/
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	8
Sec. 4507.50. (A) The registrar of motor vehicles or a	9
deputy registrar, upon receipt of an application filed in	10
compliance with section 4507.51 of the Revised Code by any	11
person who is a resident or a temporary resident of this state	12
and, except as otherwise provided in this section, is not	13
licensed as an operator of a motor vehicle in this state or	14
another licensing jurisdiction, and, except as provided in	15
division (B) of this section, upon receipt of a fee of three	16
dollars and fifty cents, shall issue an identification card to	17
that person.	18

Any person who is a resident or temporary resident of this	19
state whose Ohio driver's or commercial driver's license has	20
been suspended or canceled, upon application in compliance with	21
section 4507.51 of the Revised Code and, except as provided in	22
division (B) of this section, payment of a fee of three dollars	23
and fifty cents, may be issued a temporary identification card.	24
The temporary identification card shall be identical to an	25
identification card, except that it shall be printed on its face	26
with a statement that the card is valid during the effective	27
dates of the suspension or cancellation of the cardholder's	28
license, or until the birthday of the cardholder in the fourth	29
year after the date on which it is issued, whichever is shorter.	30
The cardholder shall surrender the identification card to the	31
registrar or any deputy registrar before the cardholder's	32
driver's or commercial driver's license is restored or reissued.	33

Except as provided in division (B) of this section, the 34 deputy registrar shall be allowed a fee of two dollars and 35 seventy-five cents commencing on July 1, 2001, three dollars and 36 twenty-five cents commencing on January 1, 2003, and three 37 dollars and fifty cents <del>commencing on January 1, 2004,</del> for each 38 identification card issued under this section. The fee allowed 39 to the deputy registrar shall be in addition to the fee for 40 issuing an identification card. 41

Neither the registrar nor any deputy registrar shall 42 charge a fee in excess of one dollar and fifty cents for 43 laminating an identification card or temporary identification 44 card. A deputy registrar laminating such a card shall retain the 45 entire amount of the fee charged for lamination, less the actual 46 cost to the registrar of the laminating materials used for that 47 lamination, as specified in the contract executed by the bureau 48 for the laminating materials and laminating equipment. 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This card is not valid for the purpose of operating a	79
motor vehicle. It is provided solely for the purpose of	80
establishing the identity of the bearer described on the card,	81
who currently is not licensed to operate a motor vehicle in the	82

The identification card shall display substantially the 84 same information as contained in the application and as 85 described in division (A)(1) of section 4507.51 of the Revised 86 Code, but shall not display the cardholder's social security 87 number unless the cardholder specifically requests that the 88 cardholder's social security number be displayed on the card. If 89 federal law requires the cardholder's social security number to 90 be displayed on the identification card, the social security 91 number shall be displayed on the card notwithstanding this 92 section. The identification card also shall display the color 93 photograph of the cardholder. If the cardholder has executed a 94 durable power of attorney for health care or a declaration 95 governing the use or continuation, or the withholding or 96 withdrawal, of life-sustaining treatment and has specified that 97 the cardholder wishes the identification card to indicate that 98 the cardholder has executed either type of instrument, the card 99 also shall display any symbol chosen by the registrar to 100 indicate that the cardholder has executed either type of 101 instrument. On and after October 7, 2009, if If the cardholder 102 has specified that the cardholder wishes the identification card 103 to indicate that the cardholder is a veteran, active duty, or 104 reservist of the armed forces of the United States and has 105 presented a copy of the cardholder's DD-214 form or an 106 equivalent document, the card also shall display any symbol 107 chosen by the registrar to indicate that the cardholder is a 108 veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed forces of the 109

United States. The card shall be sealed in transparent plastic	110
or similar material and shall be so designed as to prevent its	111
reproduction or alteration without ready detection.	112
The identification card for persons under twenty-one years	113
of age shall have characteristics prescribed by the registrar	114
distinguishing it from that issued to a person who is twenty-one	115
years of age or older, except that an identification card issued	116
to a person who applies no more than thirty days before the	117
applicant's twenty-first birthday shall have the characteristics	118
of an identification card issued to a person who is twenty-one	119
years of age or older.	120
Every identification card issued to a resident of this	121
state shall expire, unless canceled or surrendered earlier, on	122
the birthday of the cardholder in the fourth year after the date	123
on which it is issued, except every identification card that is	124
issued to a person who is eighty years of age or older shall	125
have no expiration date. Every identification card issued to a	126
temporary resident shall expire in accordance with rules adopted	127
by the registrar and is nonrenewable, but may be replaced with a	128
new identification card upon the applicant's compliance with all	129
applicable requirements. A cardholder may renew the cardholder's	130
identification card within ninety days prior to the day on which	131
it expires by filing an application and paying the prescribed	132
fee in accordance with section 4507.50 of the Revised Code.	133

A cardholder may obtain a replacement identification card	150
that reflects any change of the cardholder's name by furnishing	151
suitable proof of the change to the registrar or a deputy	152
registrar and surrendering the cardholder's existing card.	153
When Except as provided in division (B)(3) of this	154

(D) (1) No agent of the state or its political subdivisions shall condition the granting of any benefit, service, right, or privilege upon the possession by any person of an identification card. Nothing in this section shall preclude any publicly operated or franchised transit system from using an identification card for the purpose of granting benefits or services of the system.  (2) No person shall be required to apply for, carry, or possess an identification card.	180

No. 170 Page 8 As Introduced person who applies no more than thirty days before the 198 applicant's twenty-first birthday, neither the registrar nor any 199 deputy registrar shall issue an identification card to a person 200 under twenty-one years of age that does not have the 201 characteristics prescribed by the registrar distinguishing it 202 from the identification card issued to persons who are twenty-203 one years of age or older. 204 (F) Whoever violates division (E) of this section is 205 guilty of a minor misdemeanor. 206

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Section 2. That existing sections 4507.50 and 4507.52 of

the Revised Code are hereby repealed.
