BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) As used in this act, "older adult" means a	3		
person sixty years of age or older.	4		
(B) There is hereby created the Malnutrition Prevention	5		
Commission, consisting of the following members:			
(1) The Director of Health or the Director's designee;	7		
(2) The Director of Aging or the Director's designee;	8		
(3) The Director of Job and Family Services or the	9		
Director's designee;	10		
(4) The Director of Agriculture or the Director's	11		
designee;	12		
(5) The chairpersons of the standing committees of the	13		
House of Representatives and Senate with primary responsibility	14		
for health legislation:	1.5		

(6) The following individuals appointed by the Governor:	16
(a) A physician authorized by Chapter 4731. of the Revised	17
Code to practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic medicine	18
and surgery;	19
(b) A university researcher with expertise in the field of	20
gerontology, nutrition, or both;	21
(c) A dietitian licensed under Chapter 4759. of the	22
Revised Code who is actively involved with a program funded	23
under the "Older Americans Act of 1965," 42 U.S.C. 3001;	24
(d) An individual who represents hospitals or integrated	25
health systems;	26
(e) Two registered nurses licensed under Chapter 4723. of	27
the Revised Code who actively provide home health care;	28
(f) A dietitian licensed under Chapter 4759. of the	29
Revised Code who actively practices in a nursing home, as	30
defined in section 3721.01 of the Revised Code;	31
(g) A dietitian licensed under Chapter 4759. of the	32
Revised Code who represents the Ohio Academy of Nutrition and	33
Dietetics;	34
(h) An individual who represents the Ohio Association of	35
Area Agencies on Aging.	36
(C) The Commission members described in division (B)(6) of	37
this section shall be appointed not later than thirty days after	38
the effective date of this section. An appointed member shall	39
hold office until the Commission ceases to exist. A vacancy	40
shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.	41
The Director of Health or the Director's designee shall	42

serve as chairperson of the Commission.	43
A member shall serve without compensation except to the	44
extent that serving on the Commission is considered part of the	45
member's regular duties of employment.	46
Section 2. (A) The Malnutrition Prevention Commission	47
created under Section 1 of this act shall do all of the	48
following:	49
(1) Study the impact of malnutrition on older adults in	50
all health care settings in this state;	51
(2) Investigate effective strategies for reducing the	52
incidence of malnutrition among older adults;	53
(3) Monitor the influence of malnutrition on older adults'	54
health care costs and outcomes, quality indicators, and quality	55
of life measures;	56
(4) Develop strategies for improving data collection and	57
analysis regarding malnutrition risks, health care costs, and	58
protective factors for older adults;	59
(5) Develop strategies for maximizing the dissemination of	60
proven, effective malnutrition prevention intervention models,	61
including community nutrition programs, medical nutrition	62
therapy, and oral nutrition supplements;	63
(6) Identify evidence-based strategies that raise public	64
awareness of malnutrition among older adults, such as	65
educational materials, social marketing, and statewide	66
campaigns;	67
(7) Identify evidence-based malnutrition prevention	68
intervention models, including community nutrition programs,	69
that reduce the rate of malnutrition among older adults and	70

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reduce the rate of rehospitalizations due to conditions caused	71
by malnutrition, and identify barriers to those intervention	72
models;	73
(8) Identify models for integrating the value of	74
malnutrition care into health care quality evaluations across	75
health care payment models;	76
(9) Examine the components and key elements of	77
malnutrition prevention intervention initiatives, consider their	78
applicability in this state, and develop strategies for testing,	79
implementation, and evaluation of the initiatives.	80
(B) The Commission shall prepare a report of its findings	81
and recommendations. Not later than twelve months after the	82
effective date of this section, the Commission shall submit a	83
copy of the report to the Governor and, in accordance with	84
section 101.68 of the Revised Code, the General Assembly. The	85
Commission shall cease to exist upon the submission of the	86
report.	87
