A BILL

To enact section 4511.531 of the Revised Code to	1
require bicycle operators and passengers under	2
18 years of age to wear protective helmets when	3
the bicycle is operated on a roadway and to	4
establish the Bicycle Safety Fund to be used by	5
the Department of Public Safety to assist low-	6
income families in the purchase of bicycle	7
helmets.	8

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4511.531 of the Revised Code be	9
enacted to read as follows:	10
Sec. 4511.531. (A)(1) No person under eighteen years of	11
age shall operate a bicycle on a roadway unless that person is	12
wearing an approved helmet that is of good fit and is fastened	13
securely on the person's head.	14
(2) No person under eighteen years of age shall be a	15
passenger on a bicycle on a roadway, including as a passenger in	16
a restraining seat or in a bicycle trailer, unless the person is	17
wearing an approved helmet that is of good fit and is fastened	18

securely on the person's head. 19 (B) (1) Whoever violates division (A) of this section shall 20 be fined twenty-five dollars. The parent, guardian, or other 21 person having custody of the offender is responsible for the 22 payment of any fine imposed under this division. 23 (2) Upon receipt by the court of satisfactory proof that 24 the offender has a protective helmet, the court may waive the 25 fine for the violation. 26 (3) All fines collected for a violation of division (A) of 27 this section shall be forwarded to the treasurer of state and 28 credited to the bicycle safety fund, which is hereby created in 29 the state treasury. The department of public safety shall use 30 the money credited to the fund to assist low-income families in 31 the purchase of approved bicycle helmets in accordance with 32 quidelines the director of public safety shall establish. All 33 investment earnings of the bicycle safety fund shall be credited 34 to the fund. 35 (C) The provisions of this section or a violation of those 36 provisions shall not be used as evidence in any civil action. 37 (D) As used in this section: 38 (1) "Approved helmet" means a helmet that meets or exceeds 39 the standards for protective bicycle helmets established by the 40 American national standards institute, the American society for 41 testing and materials, or the Snell memorial foundation. 42 (2) "Low-income family" means a family with an income not 43 exceeding the federal poverty guidelines as defined in section 44 5101.46 of the Revised Code. 45 (E) The offenses established under this section are strict 46

liability offenses and section 2901.20 of the Revised Code does	47
not apply. The designation of these offenses as a strict	48
liability offense shall not be construed to imply that any other	49
offense, for which there is no specified degree of culpability,	50
is not a strict liability offense.	51
Section 2. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the	52
contrary, for the period of one year after the effective date of	53
this act, no law enforcement officer shall issue a ticket,	54
citation, or summons to a person who violates division (A) of	55
section 4511.531 of the Revised Code. During that time, the law	56
enforcement officer instead shall issue the person a written	57
warning explaining the provisions of section 4511.531 of the	58
Revised Code. The written warning may notify the person of the	59
specific date, one year after the effective date of this act,	60
when law enforcement officers shall begin enforcing the	61
provisions of section 4511.531 of the Revised Code.	62
