WHEREAS, 2015 marks the 25th anniversary of the enactment	3
of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), Pub. L.	4
No. 101-336, 104 Stat. 328; and	5
WHEREAS, The ADA was enacted to protect the rights of	6
people with disabilities; and	7
WHEREAS, The ADA has been misused for financial gain,	8
rather than the protection of rights; and	9
WHEREAS, The integrity of the ADA is at stake; and	10
WHEREAS, Businesses across the country and here in Ohio are	11
facing an increasing number of demand letters for money with the	12
only alternative being costly litigation; and	13
WHEREAS, The number of lawsuits brought under Title III of	14
the ADA rose by more than sixty-three per cent from 2013 to	15
