WHEREAS, In order to be awarded a grant under the Smart8City Challenge, a mid-sized city must demonstrate how advanced9data and intelligent transportation system technologies and10applications can be used to reduce congestion, keep travelers11safe, protect the environment, respond to climate change,12connect underserved communities, and support economic vitality;13and14

WHEREAS, The City of Columbus was named as one of seven15finalists from an original pool of seventy-eight applicants that16are eligible to receive funding for capital improvements and17operations for the purpose of demonstrating advanced data and18

Challenge will be awarded a \$40 million USDOT grant, with a	22
potential additional grant of \$10 million from USDOT's electric	23
vehicle vendor, Paul Allen's Vulcan, in addition to tens of	24
millions of dollars of in-kind contributions from Alphabet's	25
Sidewalk Labs, Amazon Web Services, Autodesk, MobileEye, and	26

WHEREAS, Grant money awarded to the city that is selected	28
under the Smart City Challenge will be used to assist that city	29
in implementing its proposed demonstration; now therefore be it	30
RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 131st General	31
Assembly of the State of Ohio, in adopting this resolution, urge	32
USDOT to select the City of Columbus as its winner for the Smart	33
City Challenge based on Columbus' ability to create a twenty-	34
