BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4501.21 and 4503.772 be amended 4 and section 4503.875 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as 5 follows: 6 7 Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state treasury the license plate contribution fund. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar69receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to70special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions71for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.72

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 73 receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 74 children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 75 contributions for its research and other programs. 76

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 78 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 79 contributions into its general account to be used for 80 educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 81 America foundation. 82

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 88 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 89 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 90 scholarships and other educational activities. 91

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those contributions for scholarships for students who are members of that organization.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 97 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 98 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 99 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 100 section. A university or college that receives contributions 101 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 102 scholarship fund. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar104receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the105university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of106

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awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend107the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it108receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program.109The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the110university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such111funds as provided in this section.112

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 113 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 114 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 115 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 116 cyclists of all ages. 117

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 118 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 119 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 120 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 121 of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 122 expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 123 educational, and cultural events at the monument. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar125receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the126fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for127the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the128lighthouses of fairport harbor.129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130 receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 131 Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 132 contributions only to promote and support the football team of 133 Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 134

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 135

receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 136 United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 137 four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 138 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 139 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 140 sponsors within this state. 141

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 142 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 143 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 144 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 145 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 146 activities. 147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of child caring agencies, which shall use the money it receives under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services to children, young adults, and families in this state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 155 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 156 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 157 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 158 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 159 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 160 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 161 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 162 the improvement of patient outcomes. 163

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 164 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 165

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thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation166organized under the laws of this state, to assist that167organization in paying for the charitable activities and168programs it sponsors in support of United States military169personnel, veterans, and their families.170

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 171 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 172 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 173 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 174 families. 175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 176 receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 177 pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 178 into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 179 be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 180 hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 181 of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 182 destination. 183

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the189contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section1904503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other191source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is192designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The193Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this194section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and195

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cats and for educational programs concerning the proper196veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio197pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and198maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.199

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar200receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the201rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.202

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 203 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 204 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 205 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 206 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 207 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 208 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 209 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 210 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 211 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 212 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 213 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 214 under this section. 215

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 216 receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 217 Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 218 the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 219 programs. 220

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar221receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the222western reserve historical society, which shall use the223contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.224

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar225receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the226Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple227negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the228contributions for charitable and educational purposes.229

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 230 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 231 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 232 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 233 234 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 235 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 236 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 237 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 238 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 239 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 240 such payments are to be made. 241

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 251 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 252 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 253 the money in support of the park. 254

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 256 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 257 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 258 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 259 local beekeeping programs. 260

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar261receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the262national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the263contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace264legends to inspire future leaders.265

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 266 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 267 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 268 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 269 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 270 commission and that is participating in the license plate 271 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 272 of the county of residence of an applicant. 273

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each274contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of275the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates276that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is277participating in the license plate program pursuant to division278(G) of that section.279

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar280receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to281pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program,282which shall use the contributions for the protection and283preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in284

Ohio and for educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar286receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the287Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council288shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner289throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.290

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 291 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 292 great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of 293 America. The council shall distribute all contributions in an 294 equitable manner throughout the state to regional councils of 295 the girl scouts. 296

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar297receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the298Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council299shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner300throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.301

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar302receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the303Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,304which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.305

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar311receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the312fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall313

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deposit the fees into its general account to be used for314purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 317 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 318 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 319 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 320 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 321 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 322

The registrar shall pay the contributions received323pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio324concerns of police survivors, which shall use those325contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate326to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed327in the line of duty.328

The registrar shall pay the contributions received329pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater330Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those331contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in332the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334 receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 335 fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 336 to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 337 families. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar339receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the340organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL341association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under342

Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association343shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in344administering a program to secure the proper representation in345the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent346children, and for the training and supervision of persons347participating in that program.348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar349receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the350Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the351contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.352

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar353receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to354Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the355contributions into its general account to be used for purposes356of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.357

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the Siegel & Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in Cleveland, Ohio.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar368receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the369Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the370moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section371

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4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written372agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos.373

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 374 receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 375 rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 376 Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 377 used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 378 rotary foundation. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 380 receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 381 Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 382 contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 383 under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 384

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar385receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to386buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the387contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.388

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 389 receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 390 Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 391 maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 392 connection. 393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394 receives pursuant to section 4503.85 of the Revised Code to the 395 Ohio sea grant college program to be used for Lake Erie area 396 research projects. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar398receives pursuant to section 4503.86 of the Revised Code to the399Ohio Lincoln highway historic byway, which shall use those400

contributions solely to promote and support the historical401preservation and advertisement of the Lincoln highway in this402state.403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar404receives pursuant to section 4503.87 of the Revised Code to the405Grove City little league dream field fund, which shall use those406contributions solely to build, maintain, and improve youth407baseball fields within the municipal corporation of Grove City.408

409 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.871 of the Revised Code to the 410 Solon city school district. The school district shall use the 411 contributions it receives to pay the expenses it incurs in 412 providing services to the school district's students that assist 413 in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being 414 of the students. The services provided may include bereavement 415 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 416 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 417 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 418 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 432 receives pursuant to section 4503.874 of the Revised Code to St. 433 Edward high school located in the municipal corporation of 434 Lakewood. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 435 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 436 students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 437 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 438 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 439 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 440 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 441 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 442 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 443 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 444 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 445 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 446 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 447 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 448 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 449 services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 450 organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 451 subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 460 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 461 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 462

emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may	463
include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving	464
techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and	465
education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug	466
abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of	467
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the	468

The services provided may include 484 bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 485 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 486 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 487 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. The school 488 district superintendent or, in the school district 489 superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 490 appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 491 organizations that the school district hires to provide those 492 services. The school district also may use the contributions it 493

receives to pay for members of the faculty of the school 494 district to receive training in providing such services to the 495 students of the school district. The school district shall 496 ensure that any charitable organization that is hired by the 497 district is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 498 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school district 499 shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 500 501 purpose.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.89 of the Revised Code to the American red cross of greater Columbus on behalf of the Ohio chapters of the American red cross, which shall use the contributions for disaster readiness, preparedness, and response programs on a statewide basis.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.90 of the Revised Code to the nationwide children's hospital foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 511 receives pursuant to section 4503.901 of the Revised Code to the 512 Ohio association for pupil transportation, which shall use the 513 money to support transportation programs, provide training to 514 school transportation professionals, and support other 515 initiatives for school transportation safety. 516

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 517 receives pursuant to section 4503.902 of the Revised Code to St. 518 Ignatius high school located in the municipal corporation of 519 Cleveland. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 520 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 521 students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to 522 pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 523

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students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 524 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 525 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 526 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 527 528 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 529 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 530 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 531 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 532 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 533 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 534 services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 535 organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 536 subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 537 shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 538 purpose. 539

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 540 receives pursuant to section 4503.903 of the Revised Code to the 541 Brecksville-Broadview Heights city school district. The school 542 district shall use the contributions it receives to pay the 543 expenses it incurs in providing services to the school 544 district's students that assist in developing or maintaining the 545 mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services 546 provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in 547 defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the 548 counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating 549 violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. 550 The school district superintendent or, in the school district 551 superintendent's discretion, the appropriate school principal or 552 appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable 553 organizations that the school district hires to provide those 554

services. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 595 receives pursuant to section 4503.94 of the Revised Code to the 596 Michelle's leading star foundation, which shall use the money 597 solely to fund the rental, lease, or purchase of the simulated 598 driving curriculum of the Michelle's leading star foundation by 599 boards of education of city, exempted village, local, and joint 600 vocational school districts. 601

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar602receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the603friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money604to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free605emergency medical first response throughout Israel.606

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar607receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the608Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and609activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the610city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park."611

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall
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distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this615section the investment income the fund earned the previous616calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an617entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity618received from the fund during the previous calendar year.619

Sec. 4503.772. (A) Each school or school district for620which a license plate is established under section 4503.871,6214503.874, 4503.875, 4503.877, 4503.902, 4503.903, or 4503.904 of622the Revised Code shall produce an annual report containing all623of the following information:624

(1) The total amount received during the prior year from license plate contributions;

(2) An itemized list of each expenditure, and a
description of each expenditure, made using funds received from
license plate contributions during the prior year;

(3) The total percentage of spending that was used to
provide services to students to assist in developing and
631
maintaining mental and emotional well-being.
632

(B) (1) Not later than the first day of December of each 633 year, the school or school district shall submit the report to 634 the department of mental health and addiction services and to 635 the registrar of motor vehicles. If a school or school district 636 fails to submit the report by the thirty-first day of December 637 of any year, the registrar shall begin transmitting the 638 contribution for each registration involving the license plate 639 for that school or school district to the treasurer of state for 640 deposit into the general revenue fund, instead of for deposit in 641 the license plate contribution fund created in section 4501.21 642 of the Revised Code. 643

(2) Immediately after receiving a report from a school or

school district for which contributions are being diverted under
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division (B) (1) of this section, the registrar shall resume
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transmitting the contributions received for that license plate
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to the treasurer of state for deposit into the license plate
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contribution fund and for later distribution to the school or

Sec. 4503.875. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 651 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, 652 motorcycle, cab-enclosed motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, motor 653 scooter, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar 654 of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the 655 registration of the vehicle and issuance of "Walsh Jesuit High 656 School" license plates. The application for "Walsh Jesuit High 657 School" license plates may be combined with a request for a 658 special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 659 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application 660 and compliance with division (B) of this section, the registrar 661 shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle 662 registration and a set of "Walsh Jesuit High School" license 663 plates with a validation sticker or a validation sticker alone 664 when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 665

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily666inscribed thereon, "Walsh Jesuit High School" license plates667shall bear words and markings selected by Walsh Jesuit high668school. The registrar shall approve the final design.
