То	enact sections 122.09, 122.091, 122.092,	1

	establish the residential broadband expansion	5
	program within the Development Services Agency	6

	expansion in municipal corporations and	8
	townships and to make an appropriation.	9

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 122.09, 122.091, 122.092,	10
122.093, 122.095, 122.096, 122.097, 122.098, 122.0910, 122.0911,	11
122.0912, 122.0913, 122.0915, and 122.0916 of the Revised Code	12
be enacted to read as follows:	
Sec. 122.09. As used in sections 122.09 to 122.0916 of the Revised Code:	14 15
(A) "Broadband funding gap" means the difference between	16
the total amount of money a broadband provider calculates is	17

necessary to construct the last mile of a specific broadband	18
telecommunications network and the total amount of money that	19
the provider has determined is the maximum amount of money that	20
is cost effective for the provider to invest in last mile	21
construction for that network.	22
(B)(1) "Broadband provider" means one of the following:	23
(a) A video service provider as defined in section 1332.21	24
of the Revised Code;	25
(b) A telecommunications service provider that is capable	26
of providing broadband service.	27
(2) "Broadband provider" does not include a publicly	28
funded broadband network service provider.	29
(C) "Broadband service" means broadband telecommunications	30
service capable of providing a minimum download speed of twenty-	31
five megabits per second and a minimum upload speed of three	32
megabits per second.	33
(D) "Eligible area" means a residential area within the	34
boundaries of a municipal corporation or township that is	35
without access to broadband service.	36
(E) "Last mile" means the last portion of a physical	37
broadband telecommunications network that connects an eligible	38
area to the broader telecommunications system.	39
(F) "Project sponsor" means a municipal corporation or	40
township that is applying for, or participating in, the	41
residential broadband expansion program established under	42
sections 122.091 to 122.0916 of the Revised Code in order to	43
provide broadband service to an eligible area.	44
(G) "Telecommunications service" has the same meaning as	45

in section 1332.21 of the Revised Code.	46
Sec. 122.091. The director of development services shall	47
establish a residential broadband expansion program to provide	48
funds to assist with residential broadband service expansion	49
projects in eligible areas. Subject to the availability of funds	50
authorized for this purpose, the development services agency	51
shall provide grants to project sponsors that apply under the	52
program to meet broadband funding gaps.	53
Sec. 122.092. A project sponsor may apply for funds under	54
the residential broadband expansion program established under	55
sections 122.091 to 122.095 of the Revised Code for the purpose	56
of providing broadband service to eligible areas within the	57
municipal corporation or township.	58
Sec. 122.093. (A) Each fiscal year, the development	59
services agency shall fund applications for residential	60
broadband expansion projects until program funds for that fiscal	61
year are no longer available. Funding for applications shall be	62
provided on a first-come, first-served basis in an amount that	63
is equal to one-third of the total cost of the broadband funding	64
gap for each project. The cumulative total of the grants for a	65
biennium shall not exceed two million dollars.	66
(B) Any application pending at the end of the fiscal year	67
shall be deemed denied, but may be refiled in a subsequent	68
fiscal year provided that all information in the application is	69
still current or has been updated.	70
Sec. 122.095.(A) Each fiscal year, the director of	71
development services shall accept applications from project	72
sponsors that are requesting funding under the residential	73
broadband expansion program established under sections 122.091	74

to 122.095 of the Revised Code. To apply for a grant, a project	75
sponsor shall submit an application to the director on a form	76
prescribed by the director. The director shall review	77
applications in the order that they are received and shall	78
review each application within sixty days after receiving it.	79
(B) An application shall include, at a minimum, the	80
following information:	81
(1) The location and description of the residential	82
<pre>broadband expansion project;</pre>	83
(2) The amount of the broadband funding gap and the amount	84
of funds requested;	85
(3) A copy of the ordinance or resolution enacted or	86
adopted under section 122.0912 of the Revised Code by the	
legislative authority of the project sponsor;	88
(4) A copy of the resolution or memorandum of	89
understanding adopted under section 122.0913 of the Revised Code	90
by the board of county commissioners of the county in which the	91
<pre>project is located;</pre>	92
(5) A copy of the agreement between the project sponsor	93
and a broadband provider, or a written acknowledgment of the	94
agreement, that confirms the provider's commitment to construct	95
the broadband infrastructure in the eligible area of the project	96
upon receipt of payment of the total amount of the broadband	97
<pre>funding gap;</pre>	98
(6) Any other information, prescribed by rule, that the	99
director determines is necessary.	100
Sec. 122.096. (A) A residential broadband expansion	101
project under sections 122.09 to 122.0916 of the Revised Code	102

shall not proceed unless funding in an amount equal to the	103
broadband funding gap has been approved. The broadband funding	104
<pre>gap shall be funded as follows:</pre>	105
(1) One-third of the total amount shall be funded by the	106
project sponsor with municipal corporation or township video	107
service provider fees, as applicable, collected under section	108
1332.32 of the Revised Code;	109
(2) One-third of the total amount shall be funded by	110
matching funds from the county in which the project is located;	111
(3) One-third of the total amount shall be funded by a	112
residential broadband expansion grant under sections 122.091 to	113
122.095 of the Revised Code.	114
(B) The project sponsor's share described in division (A)	115
(1) of this section shall be paid by one of the following	116
<pre>methods:</pre>	117
(1) In a single lump sum payment;	118
(2) In two or more payments over a period of time.	119
(C) If the project sponsor pays its share over a period of	120
time, payments shall be in the form of a deduction from the	121
broadband provider's quarterly video service provider fee as	122
specified in the agreement established between the provider and	123
the project sponsor under section 122.098 of the Revised Code.	124
Sec. 122.097. Before submitting a residential broadband	125
expansion program application to the development services agency	126
pursuant to section 122.095 of the Revised Code, a project	127
sponsor shall do the following:	128
(A) Identify the eligible area of the residential	129
broadband expansion project for which the project sponsor will	130

apply for matching funds;	131
(B) Contact one or more broadband providers to determine	132
if any provider is capable of providing broadband service to the	133
eligible area and willing to enter into an agreement with the	134
project sponsor to construct, install, and support the necessary	135
broadband infrastructure for the project;	136
(C) Determine, in conjunction with the providers, the	137
broadband funding gap for each provider interested in	138
participating in the project;	139
(D) Determine if the project sponsor collects or has	140
available sufficient video service provider fees to fund one-	141
third of the broadband funding gap for the project;	142
(E) Determine the availability of county matching funds	143
for the project.	144
Sec. 122.098. (A) A project sponsor shall review the	145
broadband funding gap for, and the broadband service	146
capabilities of, each broadband provider contacted under section	147
122.097 of the Revised Code and willing to participate in the	148
residential broadband expansion project proposed by the project	149
sponsor.	150
(B) After determining which provider would offer the best	151
service at the best price for the project, the project sponsor	152
may propose an agreement with the provider to construct,	153
install, and support last mile broadband service to the eligible	154
area. The terms of the agreement shall require that:	155
(1) The provider construct, install, and support last mile	156
broadband infrastructure to a specific eligible area of the	157
municipal corporation or township, as applicable;	158

(2) The project sponsor remit to the provider a payment in	159
the amount of the broadband funding gap applicable to the	160
eligible area as determined under section 122.096 of the Revised	161
<u>Code;</u>	162
(3) The project sponsor specify whether the sponsor's	163
share of the payment will be paid as a lump sum or deducted from	164
the provider's quarterly video service provider fee according to	165
a schedule of deductions over a specified period of time.	166
Sec. 122.0910. An agreement under section 122.098 of the	167
Revised Code is subject to the approval of the legislative	168
authority of the project sponsor and contingent upon the	169
distribution of funds approved for the project as provided in	170
sections 122.095, 122.096, and 122.0912 of the Revised Code.	171
Sec. 122.0911. After establishing the terms of an	172
agreement under section 122.098 of the Revised Code, the project	173
sponsor shall develop a project plan, which, at a minimum, shall	
<pre>include the following:</pre>	175
(A) A specific description of the eligible area to receive	176
broadband service under the project;	177
(B) The total amount of the broadband funding gap,	178
including the amount of funds to be provided by the project	179
sponsor, the state, and the county in which the project is	180
<pre>located;</pre>	181
(C) A copy of the agreement with the broadband provider	182
<pre>for the project;</pre>	183
(D) A copy of the residential broadband expansion program	184
application submitted to the development services agency	185
pursuant to section 122.095 of the Revised Code:	186

(E) A written proposal requesting county funds from the	187
county in which the project is located.	188
Sec. 122.0912. Before a residential broadband expansion	189
project under sections 122.09 to 122.0916 of the Revised Code	190
may commence, the legislative authority of the project sponsor	191
shall review the residential broadband expansion project	192
agreement and plan. Within ninety days of receiving the	193
agreement and plan, the legislative authority shall approve or	194
reject the agreement and plan. To approve the agreement and	195
plan, the legislative authority shall adopt an ordinance or	196
resolution authorizing the project sponsor to do the following:	197
(A) Enter into the project agreement with the broadband	198
<pre>provider;</pre>	199
(B) Submit the residential broadband expansion program	200
application for the project to the development services agency;	201
(C) Submit the proposal requesting matching funds for the	202
project to the appropriate county.	203
Sec. 122.0913. Upon approval of the legislative authority	204
of a project sponsor for a residential broadband expansion	205
project under sections 122.0910 and 122.0912 of the Revised	206
Code, the project sponsor shall submit to the board of county	207
commissioners of the county in which the project is located a	208
proposal requesting county matching funds for the project. The	209
request shall be for the amount equal to one-third of the	210
project's broadband funding gap as determined in section 122.096	211
of the Revised Code.	212
The board of county commissioners shall approve or reject	213
a proposal for county matching funds for the project within	214
ninety days of receiving the request. To approve the funding	215

request, the board shall adopt a resolution or a memorandum of	216
understanding authorizing the distribution of the funds to the	217
project sponsor.	218
Sec. 122.0915. The development services agency shall	219
include the following residential broadband expansion program	220
information in its annual report filed under section 121.18 of	221
the Revised Code:	222
(A) The number of program applications received;	223
(B) The number of applications that received funding under	224
the program;	225
(C) The number of miles of broadband infrastructure	226
<pre>constructed in eligible areas;</pre>	227
(D) The number of new residences receiving broadband under	228
the program.	229
Sec. 122.0916. The director of development services shall	230
adopt rules for the residential broadband expansion program	231
established under sections 122.09 to 122.0916 of the Revised	232
Code. The rules shall establish an application form and	233
application procedures for the program. The rules may include	234
requirements for a program application in addition to the	235
requirements described in section 122.095 of the Revised Code.	236
Section 2. All items in this section are hereby	237
appropriated as designated out of any moneys in the state	238
treasury to the credit of the designated fund. For all	239
appropriations made in this act, those in the first column are	240
for fiscal year 2018 and those in the second column are for	241
fiscal year 2019. The appropriations made in this act are in	242
addition to any other appropriations made for the FY 2018-FY	243
2019 biennium	244
