То	amend section 4507.52 of the Revised Code to	1
	provide that any nondriver identification card	2
	that is issued to a resident of Ohio who is	3
	permanently disabled must be issued without an	4
	expiration date.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4507.52 of the Revised Code be	6
amended to read as follows:	7
Sec. 4507.52. (A) (1) Each identification card issued by	8
the registrar of motor vehicles or a deputy registrar shall	9
display a distinguishing number assigned to the cardholder, and	10
shall display the following inscription:	11
"STATE OF OHIO IDENTIFICATION CARD	12
This card is not valid for the purpose of operating a	13
motor vehicle. It is provided solely for the purpose of	14
establishing the identity of the bearer described on the card,	15
who currently is not licensed to operate a motor vehicle in the	16
state of Ohio."	17
(2) The identification card shall display substantially	18

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the same information as contained in the application and as	19
described in division (A)(1) of section 4507.51 of the Revised	20
Code, but shall not display the cardholder's social security	21
number unless the cardholder specifically requests that the	
cardholder's social security number be displayed on the card. If	
federal law requires the cardholder's social security number to	
be displayed on the identification card, the social security	
number shall be displayed on the card notwithstanding this	26
section.	27
(3) The identification card also shall display the color	28
photograph of the cardholder.	29
(4) If the cardholder has executed a durable power of	30
attorney for health care or a declaration governing the use or	31
continuation, or the withholding or withdrawal, of life-	32
sustaining treatment and has specified that the cardholder	33
wishes the identification card to indicate that the cardholder	34
has executed either type of instrument, the card also shall	
display any symbol chosen by the registrar to indicate that the	36
cardholder has executed either type of instrument.	37
(5) If the cardholder has specified that the cardholder	38
wishes the identification card to indicate that the cardholder	39
is a veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed forces of	40
the United States and has presented a copy of the cardholder's	41
DD-214 form or an equivalent document, the card also shall	42
display any symbol chosen by the registrar to indicate that the	43
cardholder is a veteran, active duty, or reservist of the armed	
forces of the United States.	45
(6) The card shall be sealed in transparent plastic or	46
similar material and shall be so designed as to prevent its	47

reproduction or alteration without ready detection.

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(7) The identification card for persons under twenty-one	49
years of age shall have characteristics prescribed by the	50
registrar distinguishing it from that issued to a person who is	51
twenty-one years of age or older, except that an identification	52
card issued to a person who applies no more than thirty days	53
before the applicant's twenty-first birthday shall have the	
characteristics of an identification card issued to a person who	55
is twenty-one years of age or older.	56
Every (8) (a) Except as provided in division (A) (8) (b) of	57
this section, every identification card issued to a resident of	58
this state shall expire, unless canceled or surrendered earlier,	59
on the birthday of the cardholder in the fourth year after the	60
date on which it is issued.	61
(b) The registrar or a deputy registrar shall issue an	62
identification card without an expiration date to a resident of	63
this state who is permanently disabled. The registrar shall	64
adopt rules governing the documentation a cardholder shall	
submit to certify that the cardholder is permanently disabled.	66
As used in division (A)(8)(b) of this section,	67
"permanently disabled" means a condition of disability from	68
which there is no present indication of recovery.	69
(c) Every identification card issued to a temporary	70
resident shall expire in accordance with rules adopted by the	71
registrar and is nonrenewable, but may be replaced with a new	72
identification card upon the applicant's compliance with all	73
applicable requirements.	74
(9) A cardholder may renew the cardholder's identification	75
card within ninety days prior to the day on which it expires by	76
filing an application and paying the prescribed fee in	77

accordance with section 4507.50 of the Revised Code.	
(10) If a cardholder applies for a driver's or commercial	79
driver's license in this state or another licensing	80
jurisdiction, the cardholder shall surrender the cardholder's	81
identification card to the registrar or any deputy registrar	82
before the license is issued.	83
(B) $\underline{(1)}$ If a card is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, the	84
person to whom the card was issued may obtain a duplicate by	85
doing both of the following:	86
(1) (a) Furnishing suitable proof of the loss,	87
destruction, or mutilation to the registrar or a deputy	88
registrar;	89
(2) (b) Filing on application and programting documentary	0.0
(2) (b) Filing an application and presenting documentary	90
evidence under section 4507.51 of the Revised Code.	91
(2) Any person who loses a card and, after obtaining a	92
duplicate, finds the original, immediately shall surrender the	93
original to the registrar or a deputy registrar.	94
(3) A cardholder may obtain a replacement identification	95
card that reflects any change of the cardholder's name by	96
furnishing suitable proof of the change to the registrar or a	97
deputy registrar and surrendering the cardholder's existing	98
card.	99
(4) When a cardholder applies for a duplicate or obtains a	100
replacement identification card, the cardholder shall pay a fee	101
	102
of two dollars and fifty cents. A deputy registrar shall be	
allowed an additional fee equal to the amount established under	
section 4503.038 of the Revised Code for issuing a duplicate or	104
replacement identification card. A disabled veteran who is a	105
cardholder and has a service-connected disability rated at one	106

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hundred per cent by the veterans' administration may apply to	107
the registrar or a deputy registrar for the issuance of a	108
duplicate or replacement identification card without payment of	109
any fee prescribed in this section, and without payment of any	110
lamination fee if the disabled veteran would not be required to	111
pay a lamination fee in connection with the issuance of an	112
identification card or temporary identification card as provided	113
in division (B) of section 4507.50 of the Revised Code.	114
A-(5) Except for a duplicate or replacement identification	115
card that is issued to a resident of this state to whom division	116
(A)(8)(b) of this section applies, a duplicate or replacement	117
identification card shall expire <u>expires</u> on the same date as the	118
card it replaces.	119
(C) The registrar shall cancel any card upon determining	120
that the card was obtained unlawfully, issued in error, or was	121
altered. The registrar also shall cancel any card that is	122
surrendered to the registrar or to a deputy registrar after the	123
holder has obtained a duplicate, replacement, or driver's or	124
commercial driver's license.	125
(D)(1) No agent of the state or its political subdivisions	126
shall condition the granting of any benefit, service, right, or	127
privilege upon the possession by any person of an identification	128
card. Nothing in this section shall preclude any publicly	129
operated or franchised transit system from using an	130
identification card for the purpose of granting benefits or	131
services of the system.	132
(2) No person shall be required to apply for, carry, or	133
possess an identification card.	134

(E) Except in regard to an identification card issued to a 135

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person who applies no more than thirty days before the	136
applicant's twenty-first birthday, neither the registrar nor any	137
deputy registrar shall issue an identification card to a person	138
under twenty-one years of age that does not have the	139
characteristics prescribed by the registrar distinguishing it	140
from the identification card issued to persons who are twenty-	141
one years of age or older.	142
(F) Whoever violates division (E) of this section is	143
