## A BILL

To amend sections 3313.60 and 3319.073 and to enact	1
sections 3314.0310 and 3326.091 of the Revised	2
Code with respect to age-appropriate student	3
instruction in child sexual abuse and sexual	4
violence prevention and in-service staff	5
training in child sexual abuse prevention.	6

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3313.60 and 3319.073 be amended	7
and sections 3314.0310 and 3326.091 of the Revised Code be	8
enacted to read as follows:	9
Sec. 3313.60. Notwithstanding division (D) of section	10
3311.52 of the Revised Code, divisions (A) to (E) of this	11
section do not apply to any cooperative education school	12
district established pursuant to divisions (A) to (C) of section	13
3311.52 of the Revised Code.	14
(A) The board of education of each city, exempted village,	15
and local school district and the board of each cooperative	16
education school district established, pursuant to section	17

3311.521 of the Revised Code, shall prescribe a curriculum for 18 all schools under its control. Except as provided in division 19 (E) of this section, in any such curriculum there shall be 20 included the study of the following subjects: 21 (1) The language arts, including reading, writing, 22 spelling, oral and written English, and literature; 23 (2) Geography, the history of the United States and of 24 Ohio, and national, state, and local government in the United 25 States, including a balanced presentation of the relevant 26 contributions to society of men and women of African, Mexican, 27 Puerto Rican, and American Indian descent as well as other 28 ethnic and racial groups in Ohio and the United States; 29 30 (3) Mathematics; (4) Natural science, including instruction in the 31 conservation of natural resources; 32 (5) Health education, which shall include instruction in: 33 (a) The nutritive value of foods, including natural and 34 organically produced foods, the relation of nutrition to health, 35 and the use and effects of food additives; 36 (b) The harmful effects of and legal restrictions against 37 the use of drugs of abuse, alcoholic beverages, and tobacco; 38 (c) Venereal disease education, except that upon written 39 request of the student's parent or quardian, a student shall be 40 excused from taking instruction in venereal disease education; 41 (d) In grades kindergarten through six, annual age-42 appropriate instruction in child sexual abuse prevention, 43 including information on available counseling and resources for 44 children who are sexually abused; 45

(e) In grades kindergarten through six, instruction in 46 personal safety and assault prevention, except that upon written 47 request of the student's parent or guardian, a student shall be 48 excused from taking instruction in personal safety and assault 49 prevention; 50

(e) (f) In grades seven through twelve, age-appropriate instruction in dating violence prevention education and sexual violence prevention education, which shall include instruction in recognizing dating violence warning signs and characteristics of healthy relationships.

In order to assist school districts in developing a dating 56 violence prevention education <u>and sexual violence prevention</u> 57 <u>education curriculum</u>, the department of education shall provide 58 on its web site links to free curricula addressing dating 59 violence prevention<u>and sexual violence prevention</u>. 60

If the parent or legal guardian of a student less than61eighteen years of age submits to the principal of the student's62school a written request to examine the dating violence63prevention and sexual violence prevention instruction materials64used at that school, the principal, within a reasonable period65of time after the request is made, shall allow the parent or66guardian to examine those materials at that school.67

(f) (g)Prescription opioid abuse prevention, with an68emphasis on the prescription drug epidemic and the connection69between prescription opioid abuse and addiction to other drugs,70such as heroin;71

(g) (h)The process of making an anatomical gift under72Chapter 2108. of the Revised Code, with an emphasis on the life-73saving and life-enhancing effects of organ and tissue donation.74

(E) For each cooperative education school district 106 established pursuant to section 3311.521 of the Revised Code and 107 each city, exempted village, and local school district that has 108 territory within such a cooperative district, the curriculum 109 adopted pursuant to divisions (A) to (D) of this section shall 110 only include the study of the subjects that apply to the grades 111 operated by each such school district. The curriculums for such 112 schools, when combined, shall provide to each student of these 113 districts all of the subjects required under divisions (A) to 114 (D) of this section. 115

(F) The board of education of any cooperative education school district established pursuant to divisions (A) to (C) of section 3311.52 of the Revised Code shall prescribe a curriculum for the subject areas and grade levels offered in any school under its control.

(G) Upon the request of any parent or legal guardian of a
student, the board of education of any school district shall
permit the parent or guardian to promptly examine, with respect
to the parent's or guardian's own child:

(1) Any survey or questionnaire, prior to itsadministration to the child;126

(2) Any textbook, workbook, software, video, or other
instructional materials being used by the district in connection
with the instruction of the child;

(3) Any completed and graded test taken or survey orquestionnaire filled out by the child;131

(4) Copies of the statewide academic standards and each 132

model curriculum developed pursuant to section 3301.079 of the133Revised Code, which copies shall be available at all times134during school hours in each district school building.135

Sec. 3314.0310. (A) If a community school serves students136in any of grades kindergarten through six, the school's137curriculum for those grades shall include annual age-appropriate138instruction in child sexual abuse prevention, including139information on available counseling and resources for children140who are sexually abused.141

(B) (1) If a community school serves students in any of142grades seven through twelve, the school's curriculum for those143grades shall include age-appropriate instruction in sexual144violence prevention education.145

(2) If the parent or legal guardian of a student less than 146 eighteen years of age who is attending a community school\_ 147 submits to the principal of the student's school a written 148 request to examine the sexual violence prevention education 149 instruction materials used at that school, the principal, within 150 a reasonable period of time after the request is made, shall 151 allow the parent or quardian to examine those materials at that 152 school. 153

Sec. 3319.073. (A) The board of education of each city and 154 exempted village school district and the governing board of each 155 educational service center shall adopt or adapt the curriculum 156 developed by the department of education for, or shall develop 157 in consultation with public or private agencies or persons 158 involved in child abuse prevention or intervention programs, a 159 program of in-service training in the prevention of child abuse, 160 violence, and substance abuse and the promotion of positive 161 youth development. Each person employed by any school district 162

or service center to work in a school as a nurse, teacher, 163 counselor, school psychologist, or administrator shall complete 164 at least four hours of the in-service training within two years 165 of commencing employment with the district or center, and every 166 five years thereafter. A person who is employed by any school 167 district or service center to work in an elementary school as a 168 nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or administrator 169 on March 30, 2007, shall complete at least four hours of the in-170 service training not later than March 30, 2009, and every five 171 years thereafter. A person who is employed by any school 172 district or service center to work in a middle or high school as 173 a nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or 174 administrator on October 16, 2009, shall complete at least four 175 hours of the in-service training not later than October 16, 176 2011, and every five years thereafter. 177

(B) Each board shall incorporate training in school safety 178 and violence prevention, including human trafficking content, 179 into the in-service training required by division (A) of this 180 section. For this purpose, the board shall adopt or adapt the 181 curriculum developed by the department or shall develop its own 182 curriculum in consultation with public or private agencies or 183 persons involved in school safety and violence prevention 184 programs. 185

(C) Each board shall incorporate training on the board's 186 harassment, intimidation, or bullying policy adopted under 187 section 3313.666 of the Revised Code into the in-service 188 training required by division (A) of this section. Each board 189 also shall incorporate training in the prevention of dating 190 violence into the in-service training required by that division 191 for middle and high school employees. The board shall develop 192 its own curricula for these purposes. 193

(D) Each board shall incorporate training in youth suicide 194 awareness and prevention into the in-service training required 195 by division (A) of this section for each person employed by a 196 school district or service center to work in a school as a 197 nurse, teacher, counselor, school psychologist, or 198 administrator, and any other personnel that the board determines 199 200 appropriate. For this purpose, the board shall adopt or adapt the curriculum developed by the department or shall develop its 201 own curriculum in consultation with public or private agencies 202 or persons involved in youth suicide awareness and prevention 203 204 programs.

The training completed under this division shall count205toward the satisfaction of requirements for professional206development required by the school district or service center207board, and the training may be accomplished through self-review208of suitable suicide prevention materials approved by the board.209

(E) Each board shall incorporate training on child sexual abuse into the in-service training required by division (A) of this section. The training completed under this division shall count toward the satisfaction of requirements for professional development required by the school district or service center board.

Sec. 3326.091. (A) If a STEM school serves students in any216of grades kindergarten through six, the school's curriculum for217that grade shall include annual age-appropriate instruction in218child sexual abuse prevention, including information on219available counseling and resources for children who are sexually220abused.221

(B) (1) If a STEM school serves students in any of grades222seven through twelve, the school's curriculum for those grades223
