BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4741.16 of the Revised Code be	6
amended to read as follows:	7
Sec. 4741.16. (A) A license to practice veterinary	8
medicine issued by the state veterinary medical licensing board	9
pursuant to sections 4741.11 to 4741.13 of the Revised Code	10
expires biennially on the first day of March in even-numbered	11
years. A limited license to practice veterinary medicine issued	12
by the board pursuant to those sections expires biennially on	13
the first day of July. A license or limited license may be	14
renewed in accordance with the standard renewal procedures	15
contained in Chapter 4745. of the Revised Code upon payment of	16
the required renewal fee and fulfillment of the continuing	17
education requirements contained in division (B) of this section	18
unless otherwise provided by law. The board shall issue a	19

duplicate certificate to any holder upon request and upon due		
proof of loss of the original.		
(B) As a condition precedent to each renewal of a license	22	
or limited license, a licensed veterinarian shall demonstrate,	23	
to the satisfaction of the board, that the licensed veterinarian		
has completed thirty hours of continuing education during the	25	
two years immediately preceding renewal of the licensed	26	
veterinarian's license or limited license that meets the	27	
requirements established by rule of the board as to form and	28	
content.	29	
(C)(1) A licensed veterinarian may receive up to two hours	30	
of continuing education for purposes of division (B) of this	31	
section each biennium if the licensed veterinarian performs free	32	
spaying and neutering services in accordance with this division.	33	
The licensed veterinarian shall provide the services at a	34	
practice, facility, or property that is appropriately equipped	35	
and staffed to provide such services. In addition, the licensed	36	
veterinarian shall perform the services in conjunction with one	37	
of the following:	38	
(a) A county humane society operating pursuant to section	39	
1717.05 of the Revised Code;	40	
(b) A county dog pound operating pursuant to section	41	
955.15 of the Revised Code;	42	
(c) A municipal dog pound operating under the authority of	43	
section 955.221 of the Revised Code;	44	
(d) An organization that is exempt from federal income	45	
taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code	46	
that is dedicated to animal protection and welfare.

that the licensed veterinarian performs, the licensed	49
veterinarian shall receive one-half hour of continuing education	50
credit.	51
(2) In order to receive continuing education credits under	52
division (C)(1) of this section, a licensed veterinarian who	53
offers free spaying and neutering services shall, in accordance	54
with division (C)(3) of this section, make provisions for free	55
follow-up services for any post-operative complications related	56
to the surgery that arise within twenty-four hours of performing	57
the surgery.	58
(3) The state veterinary medical licensing board shall_	59
adopt policies and procedures necessary for the administration	60
of division (C)(2) of this section, including allowing a	61
licensed veterinarian who performs free spaying and neutering	62
services to assign another licensed veterinarian to provide free	63
follow-up services for any post-operative complications.	64
(D) The board may waive the requirement of division (B) of	65
this section if the licensee submits an affidavit evidencing	66
that the licensee was prevented from attending an approved	67
educational program during a year because of the occurrence of	68
an unusual and prolonged emergency, provided the licensee	69
otherwise complies with such requirements as the board	70
determines.	71
(D) (E) Educational program requirements not completed	72
during the biennial license period, due to a waiver granted by	73
the board under division $\frac{(C)-(D)}{(D)}$ of this section, are cumulative	74
on the requirements for the succeeding biennial license period.	75
(E) (F) Any license or limited license which is not	76
renewed at the end of the biennium becomes an inactive license	77

or limited license. A licensee may reactivate an inactive		
license or limited license upon application to the board. The		
board shall prescribe continuing education and other		
requirements as it considers necessary to reactivate a license	81	
or limited license. Any license or limited license which has	82	
been inactive for more than four years expires if the licensee	83	
has not applied for reactivation of the license or limited	84	
license. Upon expiration, a license or limited license becomes	85	
void.		
$\frac{(F)-(G)}{(G)}$ Division $\frac{(E)-(F)}{(F)}$ of this section does not apply to	87	
any veterinarian who serves solely in a professional capacity	88	
with any federal, state, or local government agency or with any		
branch of the armed forces of the United States.
