BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3319.2210 of the Revised Code be	5
enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3319.2210. (A) The state board of education, upon	7
submission of the documentation specified in division (C) of	8
this section, shall issue a license to any of the following	9
persons to be employed to work in a substitute capacity by a	10
school district or school:	11
(1) A speech-language pathologist who holds a currently	12
valid license issued under Chapter 4753. of the Revised Code and	13
wishes to be employed as a substitute speech-language	14
pathologist;	15

(2) An audiologist who holds a currently valid license	16
issued under Chapter 4753. of the Revised Code and wishes to be	17
employed as a substitute audiologist;	18

(3) A registered nurse who holds a bachelor's degree in	19
nursing and a currently valid license issued under Chapter 4723.	20
of the Revised Code and wishes to be employed as a substitute	21
nurse;	22
(4) A physical therapist who holds a currently valid	23
license issued under Chapter 4755. of the Revised Code and	24
wishes to be employed as a substitute physical therapist;	25
(5) An occupational therapist who holds a currently valid	26
license issued under Chapter 4755. of the Revised Code and	27
wishes to be employed as a substitute occupational therapist;	28
(6) A physical therapy assistant who holds a currently	29
valid license issued under Chapter 4755. of the Revised Code and	30
wishes to be employed as a substitute physical therapy	31

(2) A control worker who holds a surrently valid license	27
(8) A social worker who holds a currently valid license	37
issued under Chapter 4757. of the Revised Code and wishes to be	38
employed as a substitute social worker.	39
(B) A license may be issued upon the request and	40
recommendation of the superintendent of a school district, the	41
superintendent of an educational service center, the governing	42
authority of a community school established under Chapter 3314.	43
of the Revised Code, the governing body of a science,	44

technology, engineering, and mathematics school established	45
under Chapter 3326. of the Revised Code, the board of trustees	46
of a college-preparatory boarding school established under	47
Chapter 3328. of the Revised Code, or the governing body of a	48
chartered nonpublic school. The term of the license shall be in	49
accordance with section 3319.226 of the Revised Code.	50
(C) A person who wishes to be employed to work in a	51
substitute capacity under this section shall submit both of the	52
following to the state board:	53
(1) A copy of the currently valid occupational license the	54
person holds;	55
(2) All materials required to complete a criminal records	56
check in accordance with section 3319.291 of the Revised Code,	57
including, if necessary, all materials required to enroll the	58
person in the retained applicant fingerprint database pursuant	59
to division (G) of that section.	60
(D) The state board shall not adopt a rule establishing	61
any additional qualifications for a license issued under this	62
section.	63
(E) A person that is employed to work in a substitute	64
capacity by a school district or school under this section shall	65
not be employed by a district or school in a non-substitute	66
capacity without satisfying any licensure or permit requirements	67
established in rules adopted by the state board that are	68
applicable to the person's prospective position of employment.	69
