BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 123.153 be amended and section	6
123.154 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 123.153. (A) As used in this section:	8
(1) "Minority business enterprise" has the same meaning as	9
in section 123.151 of the Revised Code.	10
(2) "EDGE business enterprise" has the same meaning as in	11
section 123.152 of the Revised Code.	12
(3) "Women-owned business enterprise" has the same meaning	13
as in section 123.154 of the Revised Code.	14
(B) Beginning October 1, 2009, and on Not later than the	15
first day of October in each year-thereafter, the director of	16
administrative services shall submit a written report to the	17

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governor and to each member of the general assembly describing	18
the progress made by state agencies in advancing the minority	19
business enterprise program—and—, the encouraging diversity,	20
growth, and equity program, and the women-owned business	21
enterprise program. The report shall highlight the initiatives	22
implemented to encourage participation of minority-owned, as-	23
well as socially and economically disadvantaged, and women-owned	24
businesses in programs funded by federal money received by the	25
state for fiscal stabilization and recovery purposes. The report	26
shall also include the total number of procurement contracts	27
each agency has entered into with certified minority business	28
enterprises-and_, EDGE business enterprises, and women-owned	29
business enterprises.	30
Sec. 123.154. (A) As used in this section:	31
"Women-owned business enterprise" means any individual,	32
partnership, corporation, or joint venture of any kind that is	33
owned and controlled by women who are United States citizens and	34
residents of this state or of a reciprocal state.	35
"Owned and controlled" means that at least fifty-one per_	36
cent of the business, including corporate stock if it is a	37
corporation, is owned by women and that such owners have control	38
over the day-to-day operations of the business and an interest	39
in the capital, assets, and profits and losses of the business	40
proportionate to their percentage of ownership. In order to	41
qualify as a women-owned business, a business shall have been	42
owned by such owners at least one year.	43
(B) The director of administrative services shall	4 4
establish a business assistance program known as the women-owned	45
business enterprise program and shall adopt rules in accordance	46
with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code to administer the program	47

that do all of the following:	
(1) Establish procedures by which a business enterprise	49

(2) Except as provided in division (B)(13) of this	52
section, establish agency procurement goals for contracting with	53

(C) Business and personal financial information and trade	107
secrets submitted by women-owned business enterprise applicants	108
to the director pursuant to this section are not public records	109
for purposes of section 149.43 of the Revised Code, unless the	110
director presents the financial information or trade secrets at	111
a public hearing or public proceeding regarding the applicant's	112
eligibility to participate in the program.	113
(D) The director of administrative services, upon approval	114
of the attorney general, may enter into a reciprocal agreement	115
with the appropriate officials of one or more states, when the	116
other state has a business assistance program or programs	117
substantially similar to the women-owned business enterprise	118
program of this state. The agreement shall provide that a	119
business certified by the other state as a women-owned business	120
enterprise, which is owned and controlled by a resident or	121
residents of that other state, shall be considered a women-owned	122
business enterprise in this state under this section. The	123
agreement shall provide that a women-owned business enterprise	124
certified under this section, which is owned and controlled by a	125
resident or residents of this state, shall be considered	126
certified in the other state and eligible for programs of that	127
state that provide an advantage or benefit to such businesses.	128
Section 2. That existing section 123.153 of the Revised	129
Code is hereby repealed.	130
