BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4/15.09, 4/15.20, 4/23.32,	/
4725.26, 4725.59, 4730.02, 4731.41, 4731.43, and 4731.60 of the	8
Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	9
Sec. 4715.09. (A) No person shall practice dentistry	10
without a current license from the state dental board. No person	11
shall practice dentistry while the person's license is under	12
suspension by the state dental board.	13
(B) No dentist shall use the services of any person not	14
licensed to practice dentistry in this state, or the services of	15
any partnership, corporation, or association, to construct,	16
alter, repair, or duplicate any denture, plate, bridge, splint,	17
or orthodontic or prosthetic appliance, without first furnishing	1.8

the unlicensed person, partnership, corpor	ation, or association 19
with a written work authorization on forms	prescribed by the 20
state dental board.	21

The unlicensed person, partnership, corporation, or association shall retain the original work authorization, and the dentist shall retain a duplicate copy of the work authorization, for two years from its date. Work authorizations required by this section shall be open for inspection during the two-year period by the state dental board, its authorized agent, or the prosecuting attorney of a county or the director of law of a municipal corporation wherein the work authorizations are located.

(C) If the person, partnership, association, or corporation receiving a written authorization from a licensed dentist engages another person, firm, or corporation, referred to in this division as "subcontractor," to perform some of the services relative to the work authorization, he or it the person shall furnish a written sub-work authorization with respect thereto on forms prescribed by the state dental board.

The subcontractor shall retain the sub-work authorization and the issuer thereof shall retain a duplicate copy, attached to the work authorization received from the licensed dentist, for inspection by the state dental board or its duly authorized agents, for a period of two years in both cases.

(D) No unlicensed person, partnership, association, or

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corporation shall perform any service described in division (B)

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of this section without a written work authorization from a

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licensed dentist. Provided, that if a written work authorization

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is demanded from a licensed dentist who fails or refuses to

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furnish it for any reason, the unlicensed person, partnership,

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association, or corporation shall not, in such event, be subject	49
to the enforcement provisions of section 4715.05 or the penal	50
provisions of section 4715.99 of the Revised Code.	51
(E) No dentist shall employ or use conscious intravenous	52
sedation unless the dentist possesses a valid permit issued by	53
the state dental board authorizing him the dentist to do so.	54
(F) This section does not apply to a person who meets both	55
of the following:	56
(1) The person has a license in good standing to practice	57
dentistry issued by another state.	58
(2) The person is practicing as a volunteer without	59
remuneration during a charitable event that lasts not more than	60

person's scope of practice is limited to the procedures that a	63
dentist licensed under this chapter is authorized to perform.	64

(B) Persons who sell optical accessories but do not assume	198
to adapt them to the eye, and neither practice nor profess to	199
practice optometry;	200
(C) An instructor in a school of optometry that is located	201
in this state and approved by the state vision professionals	202
board under section 4725.10 of the Revised Code who holds a	203
valid current license to practice optometry from a licensing	204
body in another jurisdiction and limits the practice of	205
optometry to the instruction of students enrolled in the school.	206
(D) A student enrolled in a school of optometry, located	207
in this or another state and approved by the board under section	208
4725.10 of the Revised Code, while the student is participating	209
in this state in an optometry training program provided or	210
sponsored by the school, if the student acts under the direct,	211

the board or authorized to practice pursuant to division (C) of	213

(E) An individual who is licensed or otherwise	215
specifically authorized by the Revised Code to engage in an	216

specifically authorized by the Revised Code to engage in an	219

activity that is included in the practice of optometry, but is	220
acting pursuant to the rules for delegation of optometric tasks	221
adopted under section 4725.09 of the Revised Code.	222
(G) An individual who holds a valid license to practice	223
optometry from a licensing body in another jurisdiction and is	224
practicing as a volunteer without remuneration during a	225
charitable event that lasts not more than seven days. When an	226
individual meets the requirements of this division, the	227
individual's scope of practice is limited to the procedures an	228
optometrist licensed under this chapter is authorized to	229
perform.	230
Sec. 4725.59. (A) Sections 4725.40 to 4725.59 of the	231
Revised Code do not apply to:	232
(1) A physician authorized under Chapter 4731. of the	233
Revised Code to practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic	234
medicine and surgery, or to persons while in the employment and	235
under the supervision of \underline{a} physician at the physician's office;	236
(2) An optometrist licensed under sections 4725.01 to	237
4725.34 of the Revised Code, or to persons while in the	238
employment and under the supervision of an optometrist at the	239
optometrist's office;	240
(3) A person who holds a valid license from another state	241
to engage in optical dispensing and is engaging in optical	242
dispensing as a volunteer without remuneration during a	243
charitable event that lasts not more than seven days.	244
When a person meets the requirements of division (A)(3) of	245
this section, the person's scope of practice is limited to the	246
procedures that a dispensing optician licensed under this	247
chapter is authorized to perform.	248

(B) Nothing in sections 4725.40 to 4725.59 of the Revised	249
Code shall prevent or restrict any individual, firm, or	250
corporation from employing or from engaging in optical	251
dispensing through persons licensed or registered under such	252
sections.	253
Sec. 4730.02. (A) No person shall hold that person out as	254
being able to function as a physician assistant, or use any	255
words or letters indicating or implying that the person is a	256
physician assistant, without a current, valid license to	257
practice as a physician assistant issued pursuant to this	258
chapter.	259
(B) No person shall practice as a physician assistant	260
without the supervision, control, and direction of a physician.	261
(C) No person shall practice as a physician assistant	262
without having entered into a supervision agreement with a	263
supervising physician under section 4730.19 of the Revised Code.	264
(D) No person acting as the supervising physician of a	265
physician assistant shall authorize the physician assistant to	266
perform services if either of the following is the case:	267
(1) The services are not within the physician's normal	268
course of practice and expertise;	269
(2) The services are inconsistent with the supervision	270
agreement under which the physician assistant is being	271
supervised, including, if applicable, the policies of the health	272
care facility in which the physician and physician assistant are	273
practicing.	274
(E) No person practicing as a physician assistant shall	275
prescribe any drug or device to perform or induce an abortion,	276
or otherwise perform or induce an abortion.	277

(F) No person shall advertise to provide services as a	278
physician assistant, except for the purpose of seeking	279
employment.	280
(G) No person practicing as a physician assistant shall	281
fail to wear at all times when on duty a placard, plate, or	282
other device identifying that person as a "physician assistant."	283
(H) This section does not apply to a person who meets both	284
of the following:	285
(1) The person holds a valid license or other form of	286
authority to practice as a physician assistant issued by another	287
state.	288
(2) The person is practicing as a volunteer without	289
remuneration during a charitable event that lasts not more than	290
seven days.	291
When a person meets the requirements of this division, the	292
person's scope of practice is limited to the procedures that a	293
physician assistant licensed under this chapter is authorized to	294
perform.	295
Sec. 4731.41. (A) No person shall practice medicine and	296
surgery, or any of its branches, without the appropriate license	297
or certificate from the state medical board to engage in the	298
practice. No person shall advertise or claim to the public to be	299
a practitioner of medicine and surgery, or any of its branches,	300
without a license or certificate from the board. No person shall	301
open or conduct an office or other place for such practice	302
without a license or certificate from the board. No person shall	303
conduct an office in the name of some person who has a license	304
or certificate to practice medicine and surgery, or any of its	305
branches. No person shall practice medicine and surgery, or any	306

of its branches, after the person's license or certificate has	307
been revoked, or, if suspended, during the time of such	308
suspension.	309
A license or certificate signed by the secretary of the	310
board to which is affixed the official seal of the board to the	311
effect that it appears from the records of the board that no	312
such license or certificate to practice medicine and surgery, or	313
any of its branches, in this state has been issued to the person	314
specified therein, or that a license or certificate to practice,	315
if issued, has been revoked or suspended, shall be received as	316

When a person meets the requirements of this division, the	346
person's scope of practice is limited to the procedures that an	347
individual authorized under this chapter to practice medicine	348
and surgery is authorized to perform.	349
Sec. 4731.43. No person shall announce or advertise	350
that person as an osteopathic physician and surgeon, or shall	351
practice as such, without a license from the state medical board	352
or without complying with all the provisions of law relating to	353
such practice, or shall practice after such license has been	354
revoked, or if suspended, during the time of such suspension.	355
A (B) Division (A) of this section does not apply to a	356
person who holds a valid license to practice as an osteopathic	357
physician and surgeon issued by another state and is practicing	358
as a volunteer without remuneration during a charitable event	359
that lasts not more than seven days. When a person meets the	360
requirements of this division, the person's scope of practice is	361
limited to the procedures that an individual authorized under	362
this chapter to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery is	363
authorized to perform.	364

(C) A license certified by the secretary, under the	365
official seal of the said -board to the effect that it appears	366
from the records of the board that no license to practice	367
osteopathic medicine and surgery has been issued to any person	368
specified therein, or that a license, if issued, has been	369
revoked or suspended shall be received as prima-facie evidence	370
of the record in any court or before any officer of the state.	371
Sec. 4731.60. (A) (1) No person shall engage in the	372
practice of podiatric medicine and surgery without a current,	373
valid license to practice podiatric medicine and surgery issued	374
by the state medical board.	375
(2) No person shall advertise or claim to be authorized to	376
practice podiatric medicine and surgery unless the person holds	377
a current, valid license to practice podiatric medicine and	378
surgery issued by the board under this chapter.	379
(3) No person shall practice podiatric medicine and	380
surgery after the person's license has been revoked, or if	381
suspended, during the time of such suspension.	382
(B) A document that is signed by the president and	383
secretary of the board and has affixed the official seal of the	384
board to the effect that it appears from the records of the	385
board that a license to practice podiatric medicine and surgery	386
in this state has not been issued to a particular person, or	387
that a license, if issued, has been revoked or suspended, shall	388
be received as prima-facie evidence of the record of the board	389
in any court or before any officer of this state.	390
(C) Division (A) of this section does not apply to a	391
person who holds a valid license to practice podiatric medicine	392
and surgery issued by another state and is practicing as a	393

volunteer without remuneration during a charitable event that	394
lasts not more than seven days. When a person meets the	395
requirements of this division, the person's scope of practice is	396
limited to the procedures that an individual authorized under	397
this chapter to practice podiatric medicine and surgery is	398
authorized to perform.	399
Section 2. That existing sections 4715.09, 4715.20,	400
4723.32, 4725.26, 4725.59, 4730.02, 4731.41, 4731.43, and	401
4731.60 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	402
