## A BILL

То	amend sections 3301.53, 3313.67, 3313.671, and	1
	5104.014 and to enact sections 3701.1310 and	2
	3701.1311 of the Revised Code to make changes to	3
	the law governing immunization of children	4
	enrolled in school, preschool programs, and day-	5
	care programs.	6

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3301.53, 3313.67, 3313.671, and	7
5104.014 be amended and sections 3701.1310 and 3701.1311 of the	8
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	9
Sec. 3301.53. (A) The state board of education, in	10
consultation with the director of job and family services, shall	11
formulate and prescribe by rule adopted under Chapter 119. of	12
the Revised Code minimum standards to be applied to preschool	13
programs operated by school district boards of education, county	14
boards of developmental disabilities, community schools, or	15
eligible nonpublic schools. The rules shall include the	16
following:	17
(1) Standards ensuring that the preschool program is	18

located in a safe and convenient facility that accommodates the	19
enrollment of the program, is of the quality to support the	20
growth and development of the children according to the program	21
objectives, and meets the requirements of section 3301.55 of the	22
Revised Code;	23
(2) Standards ensuring that supervision, discipline, and	24
programs will be administered according to established	25
objectives and procedures;	26
(3) Standards ensuring that preschool staff members and	27
nonteaching employees are recruited, employed, assigned,	28
evaluated, and provided inservice education without	29
discrimination on the basis of age, color, national origin,	30
race, or sex; and that preschool staff members and nonteaching	31
employees are assigned responsibilities in accordance with	32
written position descriptions commensurate with their training	33
and experience;	34
(4) A requirement that boards of education intending to	35
establish a preschool program demonstrate a need for a preschool	36
program prior to establishing the program;	37
(5) Requirements that children participating in preschool	38
programs have been immunized to the extent considered	39
appropriate by the state board to prevent the spread of	40
communicable disease and that each entity operating a preschool	41
program keeps an immunization record for each child	42
participating in the program that complies with the requirements	43
of division (C) of section 3313.67 of the Revised Code and	44
reports a summary of those immunization records that complies	45
with the requirements of division (D)(1) of that section;	46
(6) Requirements that the parents of preschool children	47

complete the emergency medical authorization form specified in	48
section 3313.712 of the Revised Code.	49
(B) The state board of education in consultation with the	50
director of job and family services shall ensure that the rules	51
adopted by the state board under sections 3301.52 to 3301.58 of	52
the Revised Code are consistent with and meet or exceed the	53
requirements of Chapter 5104. of the Revised Code with regard to	54
child day-care centers. The state board and the director of job	55
and family services shall review all such rules at least once	56
every five years.	57
(C) The state board of education, in consultation with the	58
director of job and family services, shall adopt rules for	59
school child programs that are consistent with and meet or	60
exceed the requirements of the rules adopted for school-age	61
child care centers under Chapter 5104. of the Revised Code.	62
Sec. 3313.67. (A) (1) Except as provided in division (A) (2)	63
of this section, the board of education of each city, exempted	64
village, or local school district may make and enforce such	65
rules to secure the immunization of, and to prevent the spread	66
of communicable diseases among the pupils attending or eligible	67
to attend the schools of the district, as in its opinion the	68
safety and interest of the public require.	69
(2) A board of education shall not adopt rules under	70
division (A)(1) of this section that are inconsistent with	71
divisions (B) and (C) of section 3313.671 of the Revised Code.	72
(B) Boards of health, legislative authorities of municipal	73
corporations, and boards of township trustees, on application of	74
the board of education of the district, at the public expense,	75
without delay, shall provide the means of immunization to pupils	76

who are not so provided by their parents or guardians.	77
(C) The board of education shall keep an immunization	78
record for each pupil, available in writing to the pupil's	79
parent or guardian upon request, which shall include:	80
(1) Immunizations against the diseases mentioned specified	81
in division (A) of section 3313.671 of the Revised Code;	82
(2) Any tuberculin tests given pursuant to section 3313.71	83
of the Revised Code;	84
(3) Any other immunizations required by the board pursuant	85
to division (A) of this section.	86
(D) $\underline{\text{(1)}}$ Annually by the fifteenth day of October, the board	87
shall report a summary, by school, of the immunization records	88
of all <u>initial entry</u> pupils <u>enrolled</u> in the district to the	89
director of health, on forms in an electronic format to be	90
uploaded to the department of health's web site in the manner	91
prescribed by the director in consultation with the department	92
of education. The summary shall include the following:	93
(a) By immunization, the percentage of pupils who have	94
been immunized against a disease;	95
(b) By immunization, the percentage of pupils who have not	96
been immunized against a disease on each of the following	97
grounds:	98
(i) Reasons of conscience including religious convictions;	99
(ii) Medical contraindications.	100
(2) Annually by the first of December, the department of	101
health shall publish on the department's web site, by school and	102
school district, the information reported pursuant to division	103

(D)(1) of this section and division (A)(5) of section 3301.53 of	104
the Revised Code. The department shall not publish any	105
information that could be used to identify a pupil.	106
(3) The department of education shall post a link on its	107
web site to the information published by the department of	108
health under division (D) (2) of this section.	109
Sec. 3313.671. (A) As used in this section:	110
(1) "Chicken pox epidemic" means the occurrence of cases	111
of chicken pox in numbers greater than expected in the school's	112
population or for a particular period of time;	113
(2) "Immunization form" means the form developed by the	114
department of health pursuant to section 3701.1310 of the	115
<pre>Revised Code;</pre>	116
(3) "Immunized" means having received an immunization by a	117
method approved by the department of health pursuant to section	118
3701.13 of the Revised Code;	119
(4) "In the process of being immunized" has the same	120
meaning as in section 5104.014 of the Revised Code;	121
(5) "Other documentation of immunization" means any of the	122
<pre>following documents:</pre>	123
(a) Information obtained from an immunization database	124
<pre>maintained by a public health department;</pre>	125
(b) Documentation of immunization from any public health	126
<pre>department;</pre>	127
(c) Documentation of immunization from any immunization	128
<pre>provider;</pre>	129
(d) School immunization records	130

(6) "School" means an elementary or high school for which	131
the state board of education prescribes minimum standards	132
pursuant to division (D) of section 3301.07 of the Revised Code.	133
(B)(1) Except as otherwise provided in division $\frac{(B)}{(C)}$ of	134
this section, no pupil, at the time of initial entry or at the	135
beginning of each school year, to an elementary or high school	136
for which the state board of education prescribes minimum	137
standards pursuant to division (D) of section 3301.07 of the	138
Revised Code, who begins kindergarten, seventh grade, or twelfth	139
grade shall be permitted to remain in school for more than	140
fourteen days unless the <del>pupil presents written evidence</del>	141
satisfactory pupil's parent or guardian provides to the person	142
in charge of admission, an immunization form or other	143
documentation of immunization indicating that the pupil has been	144
immunized by a method of immunization approved by the department-	145
of health pursuant to section 3701.13 of the Revised Code	146
against or is in the process of being immunized against mumps,	147
poliomyelitis, diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, rubeola, and	148
rubella or is in the process of being immunized.	149
(2) Except as provided in division $\frac{(B)}{(C)}$ of this	150
section, no pupil who begins kindergarten at an elementary	151
school subject to the state board of education's minimum	152
standards , seventh grade, or twelfth grade shall be permitted	153
to remain in school for more than fourteen days unless the <del>pupil</del>	154
presents written evidence satisfactory pupil's parent or	155
<u>quardian provides</u> to the person in charge of admission <u>an</u>	156
immunization form or other documentation of immunization	157
indicating that the pupil has been immunized by a department of	158
health-approved method of immunization against or is in the	159
process of being immunized against both of the following:	160

(a) During or after the school year beginning in 1999,	161
hepatitis B;	162
(b) During or after the school year beginning in 2006,	163
chicken pox.	164
(3) Except as provided in division (B) (C) of this	165
section, during and after the school year beginning in 2016, no	166
pupil who is the age or older than the age at which immunization	167
against meningococcal disease is recommended by the state-	168
department of health shall be permitted to remain in a-school	169
subject to the state board of education's minimum standards for	170
more than fourteen days unless the <del>pupil presents written</del>	171
evidence satisfactory pupil's parent or quardian provides to the	172
person in charge of admission an immunization form or other	173
documentation of immunization indicating that the pupil has been	174
immunized by a department of health-approved method of	175
immunization, against or is in the process of being immunized,	176
against meningococcal disease.	177
(4) As used in divisions (A)(1), (2), and (3) of this	178
section, "in the process of being immunized" means the pupil has-	179
been immunized against mumps, rubeola, rubella, and chicken pox,	180
and if the pupil has not been immunized against poliomyelitis,	181
diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, hepatitis B, and meningococcal	182
disease, the pupil has received at least the first dose of the	183
immunization sequence, and presents written evidence to the	184
pupil's building principal or chief administrative officer of	185
each subsequent dose required to obtain immunization at the	186
intervals prescribed by the director of health. Any student	187
pupil previously admitted under the "in process of being	188
immunized" provision and who has not complied with the	189
immunization intervals or catch-up schedule prescribed by the	190

director of health shall be excluded from school on the	191
fifteenth day of the following school year. Any student pupil so	192
excluded shall be readmitted <del>upon showing evidence when the</del>	193
pupil's parent or guardian provides to the student's pupil's	194
building principal or chief administrative officer of an	195
immunization form or other documentation of immunization	196
<pre>indicating progress on the director of health's interval or</pre>	197
<pre>catch-up schedule.</pre>	198
(B) (C) (1) A pupil who has had natural rubeola, and	199
presents a signed statement from the pupil's parent, guardian,	200
or physician to that effect, is not required to be immunized	201
against rubeola if the immunization form or other documentation	202
of immunization provided pursuant to division (B) of this	203
section indicates that the pupil has had natural rubeola.	204
(2) A pupil who has had natural mumps, and presents a	205
signed statement from the pupil's parent, guardian, or physician	206
to that effect, is not required to be immunized against mumps_if_	207
the immunization form or other documentation of immunization	208
provided pursuant to division (B) of this section indicates that	209
the pupil has had natural mumps.	210
(3) A pupil who has had natural chicken pox, and presents	211
a signed statement from the pupil's parent, guardian, or	212
physician to that effect, is not required to be immunized	213
against chicken pox if the immunization form or other	214
documentation of immunization provided pursuant to division (B)	215
of this section indicates that the pupil has had natural chicken	216
pox.	217
(4) A pupil who presents a written statement of the	218
pupil's parent or guardian in which is not required to be	219
immunized against a disease specified in division (B) of this	220

section if the immunization form or other documentation of	221
immunization provided pursuant to division (B) of this section	222
<u>indicates that</u> the <u>pupil's</u> parent or guardian <del>declines</del> <u>declined</u>	223
to have the pupil immunized <u>against the disease</u> for reasons of	224
conscience, including religious convictions, is not required to	225
be immunized.	226
(5) A child whose physician certifies in writing pupil is	227
not required to be immunized against a disease specified in	228
division (B) of this section if the immunization form or other	229
documentation of immunization provided pursuant to division (B)	230
of this section indicates that such immunization against any the	231
disease is medically contraindicated is not required to be	232
immunized against that disease.	233
(C) As used in this division, "chicken pox epidemic" means	234
the occurrence of cases of chicken pox in numbers greater than	235
expected in the school's population or for a particular period	236
of time.	237
(D) Notwithstanding division (B) (C) of this section, a	238
school may deny admission to a pupil otherwise exempted from the	239
chicken pox immunization requirement if the director of the	240
state department of health notifies the school's principal or	241
chief administrative officer that a chicken pox epidemic exists	242
in the school's population. The denial of admission shall cease	243
when the director notifies the principal or officer that the	244
epidemic no longer exists.	245
The board of education or governing body of each school	246
subject to this section shall adopt a policy that prescribes	247
methods whereby the academic standing of a pupil who is denied	248
admission during a chicken pox epidemic may be preserved.	249

(D) Boards of health, legislative authorities of	250
municipal corporations, and boards of township trustees on	251
application of the board of education of the district or proper	252
authority of any school affected by this section, shall provide	253
at the public expense, without delay, the means of immunization	254
against mumps, poliomyelitis, rubeola, rubella, diphtheria,	255
pertussis, tetanus, and hepatitis B to pupils who are not so	256
provided by their parents or guardians.	257
$\frac{(E)}{(F)}$ The department of health shall specify the age at	258
which immunization against meningococcal disease, as required by	259
division $\frac{A}{B}$ (3) of this section, is recommended, and approve	260
a method of immunization against meningococcal disease.	261
(G) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this	262
section, a pupil who has transferred from another state and does	263
not satisfy the requirements of division (B) of this section may	264
be permitted to remain in school if the pupil's parent or	265
guardian submits proof of immunization within fourteen days	266
after the pupil's date of enrollment.	267
Sec. 3701.1310. (A) The department of health shall develop	268
and publish on its web site an immunization form to document a	269
child's immunization history. During and after the school year	270
beginning in 2019, the form shall be used to satisfy the	271
requirements of section 3313.671 of the Revised Code.	272
(B) The immunization form shall include all of the	273
<pre>following:</pre>	274
(1) A component for indicating the dates that a child	275
received immunizations against each of the diseases specified in	276
section 3313.671 of the Revised Code and any other diseases	277
against which the director of health recommends immunization;	278

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parent or guardian of both of the following:	308
(a) The risks and benefits of immunization;	309
(b) The health risks presented to the child and community	310
by the one or more diseases.	311
(2) Upon providing information to a child's parent or	312
guardian under division (D)(1) of this section, a physician,	313
physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse,	314
registered nurse employed by a local health department, or	315
pharmacist responsible for administering immunizations to the	316
child shall sign the immunization form. The signature of the	317
physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered	318
nurse, registered nurse employed by a local health department,	319
or pharmacist on the immunization form indicates that the	320
information described in division (D)(1) of this section was	321
provided to the child's parent or guardian. It does not	322
constitute a determination that a pupil is exempt from	323
immunization pursuant to division (C)(4) of section 3313.671 of	324
the Revised Code.	325
Sec. 3701.1311. (A) The department of health, in	326
consultation with the department of job and family services,	327
shall develop and publish on its web site a medical statement of	328
immunization to document a child's immunization history.	329
Beginning on July 1, 2019, the medical statement of immunization	330
shall be used to satisfy the requirements of section 5104.014 of	331
the Revised Code.	332
(B) The medical statement of immunization shall include	333
all of the following:	334
(1) A component for indicating the dates that a child	335
received immunizations against each of the diseases specified in	336

division (B) of section 5104.014 of the Revised Code and any	337
other diseases against which the director of health recommends	338
<pre>immunization;</pre>	339
(2) A component indicating whether a child is subject to	340
any of the exceptions specified in division (C) of section	341
5104.014 of the Revised Code;	342
(3) A component where a child's parent or guardian may	343
indicate that the parent or guardian, in accordance with	344
division (C)(1)(b) of section 5104.014 of the Revised Code, has	345
declined for reasons of conscience, including religious	346
convictions, to have the child immunized;	347
(4) A component whereby a child's parent or guardian may	348
indicate that the parent or guardian understands that, by	349
declining to have the child immunized, the child may be denied	350
admission to a child day-care center, type A family day-care	351
home, or licensed type B family day-care home during an epidemic	352
or outbreak.	353
(C)(1) Each medical statement of immunization shall be	354
signed by the physician, physician assistant, advanced practice	355
registered nurse, registered nurse employed by a local health	356
department, or pharmacist responsible for administering	357
immunizations to the child.	358
(2) A medical statement of immunization shall be signed by	359
the child's parent or guardian if the child's parent or guardian	360
declines for reasons of conscience, including religious	361
convictions, to have the child immunized against one or more	362
diseases.	363
(D)(1) If a child's parent or guardian declines for	364
reasons of conscience, including religious convictions, to have	365

the child immunized against one or more diseases, the physician,	366
physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse,	367
registered nurse employed by a local health department, or	368
pharmacist responsible for administering immunizations to the	369
child shall inform the parent or guardian of both of the	370
<pre>following:</pre>	371
(a) The risks and benefits of immunization;	372
(b) The health risks presented to the child and community	373
by the one or more diseases.	374
(2) Upon providing information to a child's parent or	375
quardian under division (D)(1) of this section, a physician,	376
physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse,	377
registered nurse employed by a local health department, or	378
pharmacist responsible for administering immunizations to the	379
child shall sign the immunization form. The signature of the	380
physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered	381
nurse, registered nurse employed by a local health department,	382
or pharmacist on the medical statement of immunization indicates	383
that the information described in division (D)(1) of this	384
section was provided to the child's parent or guardian. It does	385
not constitute a determination that a pupil is exempt from	386
immunization pursuant to division (C) of section 5104.014 of the	387
Revised Code.	388
Sec. 5104.014. (A) As used in this section:	389
(1) "Child" includes both of the following:	390
(a) An infant, toddler, or preschool age child;	391
(b) A school-age child who is not enrolled in a public or	392
nonpublic school but is enrolled in a child day-care center,	393
type A family day-care home, or licensed type B family day-care	394

home or receives child care from a certified in-home aide.	395
(2) "In the process of being immunized" means having	396
received at least the first dose of an immunization sequence and	397
complying with the immunization intervals or catch-up schedule	398
prescribed by the director of health.	399
(B) Except as provided in division (C) of this section,	400
not later than thirty days after enrollment in a child day-care	401
center, type A family day-care home, or licensed type B family	402
day-care home and every thirteen months thereafter while	403
enrolled in the center or home and not later than thirty days	404
after beginning to receive child care from a certified in-home	405
aide and every thirteen months thereafter while continuing to	406
receive child care from the aide, each child's caretaker parent	407
shall provide to the center, home, or in-home aide a medical	408
statement of immunization, as described in division (D) of this	409
section 3701.1311 of the Revised Code, indicating that the child	410
has been immunized against or is in the process of being	411
immunized against all of the following diseases:	412
(1) Chicken pox;	413
(2) Diphtheria;	414
(3) Haemophilus influenzae type b;	415
(4) Hepatitis A;	416
(5) Hepatitis B;	417
(6) Influenza;	418
(7) Measles;	419
(8) Mumps;	420
(9) Pertussis;	421

(10) Pneumococcal disease;	422
(11) Poliomyelitis;	423
(12) Rotavirus;	424
(13) Rubella;	425
(14) Tetanus.	426
(C)(1) A child is not required to be immunized against a	427
disease specified in division (B) of this section if any of the	428
following is the case:	429
(a) Immunization against the disease is medically	430
contraindicated for the child;	431
(b) The child's parent or guardian has declined to have	432
the child immunized against the disease for reasons of	433
conscience, including religious convictions;	434
(c) Immunization against the disease is not medically	435
appropriate for the child's age.	436
(2) In the case of influenza, a child is not required to	437
be immunized against the disease if the seasonal vaccine is not	438
available.	439
(D) (1) The medical statement shall include all of the	440
following information:	441
(a) The dates that a child received immunizations against	442
each of the diseases specified in division (B) of this section;	443
(b) Whether a child is subject to any of the exceptions	444
specified in division (C) of this section.	445
(2) The medical statement shall include a component where	446
a parent or guardian may indicate that the parent or guardian	447

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has declined to have the child immunized.	448
Section 2. That existing sections 3301.53, 3313.67,	449
3313.671, and 5104.014 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	450
